Dear Sir:

I read the Bercaw report of your investigation of the University of Arkansas' Division of Advancement with interest. I am appreciative of your careful investigation into the reported matters and your subsequent evaluation of the facts and evidence uncovered. I see no reason to disagree with your decision not to prosecute in the matters detailed in the report.

I am concerned that your report does not address a matter I have brought up in each of the Legislative Audit Committee meetings where the investigative report on the Division of Advancement has been discussed. My specific concerns are as detailed in the paragraphs that follow.

Appendix C-1 of the Legislative Audit Committee's Investigative Report contains a letter from Jean Schook, Associate Vice Chancellor for Financial Affairs, to Donald Pederson, Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration. That letter is dated October 19, 2012.

In her letter to Pederson, Schook conveys her concerns, referencing 'likelihood of conflict of interest violations, intentional effort to disguise, misdirection of funds, risk of fraudulent activity, deliberate efforts to disguise' and further notes that no review of records to identify misappropriated resources had been performed at the time of her letter. She makes at least 7 specific references to concerns about the veracity and accuracy of Division accounting records. Chancellor David Gearhart was copied on this letter.

Legislative Joint Auditing Committee

On October 25, 2012, legislative auditors conducted the exit conference for the regular audit of the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2012. At that conference, neither the Treasurer or the Vice Chancellor for Finance & Administration disclosed that they had knowledge of any of the information reported in the Schook letter. Vice Chancellor Pederson signed the Management Representation Letter that day. A portion of that letter reads as follows: "We have no knowledge of any allegation of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the entity involving:

- a. Management
- b. Employees who have significant roles in internal control, or
- c. Others where fraud could have a material effect on the financial statements.

The letter also states, "We have no knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the entity received in communications from employees, former employees, analysts, regulators or others."

The referenced content of the letter is contained in the Legislative Audit Investigative Report of page A-6.

As previously noted, Vice Chancellor Pederson made these representations to Legislative Audit employees on October 25, 2012, six days AFTER receiving the Schook letter, which contained at least 7 references to potentially fraudulent activity.

ACA 10-4-416 (b) (f) states the following: Any person knowingly providing false documents, records, or other data to the Legislative Auditor or his or her authorized assistants, upon the finding by a circuit court, shall be guilty of providing false information and shall be punished in the same manner as a person guilty of tampering with a public record, § 5-54-121.

The undersigned members of the Arkansas General Assembly and I respectfully request that you carefully review Vice Chancellor Pederson's written representation to our audit team for compliance with Arkansas Code, both specifically as noted above and for any other violation of law. Your evaluation of this matter will be greatly appreciated.
