MOTION TO REVOKE BOND

Comes now the State of Arkansas, by and through John F. Johnson, Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, and for its Motion to Revoke Bond, states:

1. The defendant, Jermain Taylor, is charged with Battery in the First Degree and Terroristic Threatening in the First Degree.
2. The defendant posted bond in the amount of \$25,000 on August 27, 2014
3. Thereafter, the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney received information that the defendant, on or about January 19, 2015, threaten two adults and three children with a firearm and fired three shots into the air.
4. When the defendant was arrested he was in possession of a loaded firearm.
5. According to Rule 9.5 of the Arkansas Rules of Criminal Procedure, "A judicial officer shall issue a warrant directing that the defendant be arrested and taken forthwith before any judicial officer having jurisdiction of the charge for a hearing when the prosecuting attorney submits a verified application alleging . . . the defendant has willfully violated the terms of his release . . . or pertinent information which would

merit revocation of the defendant's release has become known to the prosecuting attorney."

3. Attached is a verification of the State's motion to Revoke Bond.
4. This information would merit a revocation of the defendant's bond pursuant to Arkansas Rule of Criminal Procedure 9.5(a).

WHEREFORE, the State prays that this Court issue an arrest warrant for the defendant and that he be brought forthwith before this Court for a hearing and that the defendant's bond be revoked pursuant to Rule 9.5 of the Arkansas Rules of Criminal Procedure.


1. The defendant, Jermain Taylor, is charged with Battery in the First Degree and Terroristic Threatening in the First Degree.

- This information would merit a revocation of the defendant's bond pursuant to Arkansas Rule of Criminal Procedure 9.5(a).


