



"This is a test where the customer can actually feel when a mattress and pillow are working. When you have the right combination, you can feel it."

Consistency is key for barbecue success

ith world-champion barbecue and a 15-store franchise, Whole Hog Café has come a long way since its beginnings in 2000. Now, it's the customers who are the judge, and Whole Hog Café is the winner of Best Barbecue and Best Ribs as voted by the readers of the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette*.

Co-owner Mike Davis, called "Sarge" by his employees, said he and a group of friends got together and organized a championship barbecue team that formed in 1999.

"We started out as a championship barbecue team in the beginning," he said. "Our championship team was called Southern Gentlemen's Culinary Society. Basically, that was just a weekend of fun, going out and drinking a few tasty beverages and going out and seeing if we could compete with the big boys out there in Memphis."

Davis said that since its foundation to today, the team has been across the big stage at Memphis in May for some type of top-10 finish and has had four top-five finishes in those 16 years.

He said he's been keeping with the same philosophy for years, and that's consistency.

"Keep It Simple Stupid. K-I-S-S," he said. The founders of the team were Davis, Ron Blasingame and Steve Lucchi. Blasingame died in 2009, and his wife, Kathy, and son-in-law, Chris Maynes, have taken over co-owning duties with Davis. Lucchi retired from the business this month.

Davis and Blasingame were both in the military. Davis served in the Army, and Blasingame was in the Marine Corps. Davis said his time in the mess hall has helped him be somewhat military-minded when it comes to recipes.

"When I was in the Army, I ended up in the mess hall for about six months. I actually ended up running the mess hall because the day I signed into the mess hall, all the help left," he said. "The training I received from that — learning how to run the mess hall from scratch and feeding 50 bodies — I had to learn how to requisition food, how to cook for large quantities of people and make it edible. Some of that stuff here, we incorporate into how we made the recipes, how to forecast how much food we're going to cook for each day and things of that nature."

Davis said he thanks the customers so much for voting Whole Hog Café the Best Barbecue and Best Ribs. He said that if it weren't for them, the restaurant wouldn't be where it is today. When customers walk into a Whole Hog Café, he invites them to talk to anyone from the management team and offer feedback.

Two-year college goes beyond standard education

com, based on the Clery Act, which requires all colleges and universities that receive federal funding to provide campus crime information to the public.

Meador said the school's mission is "transforming lives through quality learning experiences."

ASU-Beebe Chancellor Eugene McKay said 51.1 percent of the school's students who took remedial classes were successful in completing a certificate or degree or continuing to a four-year university, and that the number ranks second in the state. He said that ASU-Beebe leads the state with an education success rate of 83.3 percent of nonremedial students, according to statistics provided by the Arkansas Department of Higher Education.

Along with being a two-year college, ASU-Beebe also offers programs that allow students to earn a bachelor's or even a master's degree in Beebe by taking classes on campus through Arkansas State University's main campus in Jonesboro.

The school also offers transfer scholarships that supplement academic scholarships. Students have the opportunity to transfer from ASU-Beebe to any other school in the state and, in most cases, have their schooling paid for at the other university if they have a 3.25 grade-point average or higher at ASU-Beebe.

As the only two-year college in Arkansas with a residence hall, as well as a full 405-acre farm, ASU-Beebe has been recognized by central Arkansas for offering students much more than the average college experience.

"We just believe in the community, and the community supports us. We want the place we live to be a better place and hope we can contribute to it," she said.



"Good staff is invaluable," Branman said. "They truly do care about each patient we have. That's what makes a good business."



Funeral home carries on three generations of family values

or three generations, Roller Funeral Homes has provided respectful, compassionate service to help Arkansas families bid a final farewell to their loved ones.

This year, readers of the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette* selected Roller Funeral Homes as Best Funeral Home in the newspaper's annual readers' poll.

"It's an honor," said Renata Jenkins Byler, vice president of marketing and facilities for Roller Funeral Homes. "Truly, this award is for our staff and for our co-workers." This is the business's 16th consecutive year to win the award, she said.

Byler is the granddaughter of company founders Denver and Christine Roller. In 1938, they purchased a funeral home that began operations in 1881. Now the business owns 28 funeral homes in Arkansas and Memphis, as well as nine cemeteries and two crematories.

Staff members often include details that make services extra special, she said. They might distribute seed packets in memory of a gardener who died. They have also provided butterfly, dove and balloon releases.

"Really, it's whatever we can do to start the grieving process," she said. "We're here to make sure the living continue to live a healthy life."

The funeral home gives back to the community in a number of ways. The business donates time and funds to various causes, and also provide limos for Camp Aldersgate proms, Byler said. She added that the funeral home has programs that take care of funerals for firefighters and police officers who died in the line of duty, infants who died before their first birthdays, and head ministers of churches.

The Roller name has a good reputation within and outside the industry, she said, adding that staff members show the same level of respect for everyone they work with

"When you treat everybody with respect, that's what secured the award," she said. "The values have been passed down from generation to generation. That's one reason we continue to receive the award year after year."



olden Corral as a whole, and specifically the North Little Rock location, thinks of employee longevity as one of its secrets to being successful and to being voted a finalist in the All-You-Can-Eat Buffet category by the readers of the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette*. 

Oaklawn's new, expanded gaming center



ar Louie has served handcrafted cocktails and made-from-scratch meals in west Little Rock for five years. Now with a location in North Little Rock, the business has developed quite a following.

This year, readers of the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette* selected Bar Louie as Best Bar/Happy Hour, as well as a finalist for Best Sports Bar and a finalist for Best Cocktail in the newspaper's annual Best of the Best readers' poll.

"We're ecstatic," said Tarek Shehadeh, co-owner and director of operations. "We want to thank our voters, ... and we're excited about being the place for happy hour."

The first Bar Louie opened more than 20 years ago in Chicago. The Pleasant Ridge Town Center location opened in June 2010 and recently extended its patio. In May, a location opened in McCain Mall.

"Our mission statement is 'eat, drink and be happy,' and we live by that," Shehadeh said. "We have a dynamic beer selection, great drinks and a very comfortable atmosphere where, above all, people have a great time with old friends while making new ones."

He added that the family-oriented restaurant welcomes children. Its menu includes something for everyone, from health-conscious salads to indulgent nachos, and the menu changes every six to eight weeks. All the food is made fresh, he said.

Bar Louie also offers weekly specials. It sells \$5 burgers from 5 p.m. until close on Tuesdays. On Wednesdays, the establishment boasts live music and \$6 buckets of five Budweiser products. Thursdays are ladies nights, when wine bottles and signature martinis are half off. The kitchen stays open late into the night.

The Little Rock store opened about four years ago, and the North Little Rock location opened a year later, he said. Another store will open in November on Chenal Parkway.


"We're all pet lovers," Tait said. "Some people bring their pets to work, so it's a really nice atmosphere for all."

"We feel incredibly blessed to have won Best Greek in the state for half a decade," said Jake Keet, vice president of JTJ Restaurants LLC. "The last seven years have flown by, and we have made some great friendships while expanding our business."

In addition to Taziki's signature gyro sandwiches, customers may choose from selections such as hummus or Taziki dip with pita, dolmades (stuffed grape leaves), a variety of deli sandwiches and taste-tempting salads, and "feast" platters, including grilled chicken, beef, lamb, seafood and more.

While the food may be the thing that gets people in the door, Jake said, it's the staff at each location that makes his restaurants stand out from the competition.


"It is great to actively employ over 100 Arkansans," he said.

College, career readiness top priorities for central-Arkansas charter school

ISA Academy has been a leading central-Arkansas charter STEM-focus school with an emphasis on college and career readiness since 2004. This focus has brought the readers of the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette* to select LISA Academy as a finalist for Best Charter School in the Best of the Best Readers' Choice poll once again.

"LISA Academy's selection as a finalist for Best Charter School indicates the educational value parents feel that [their children] are receiving," said Atnan Ekin, superintendent of LISA Academy.

LISA Academy currently has two campuses serving 1,500 students in Sherwood and west Little Rock. Both operate with the goal of preparing their graduates to excel in the college setting and beyond.

Recently, the school introduced a new honors graduation plan that allows students who have completed high-school-level courses in middle school to begin taking Advanced Placement courses starting in the ninth grade, and up to 21 AP courses throughout high school, an opportunity for early graduation and to be recipients of an AP Capstone diploma.

There might also be some beneficial changes to the school system on the horizon. An amendment proposal submitted to the Arkansas Department of Education requests a combined high school and the addition of a new elementary school in Little Rock on Shackleford Road.


This new configuration will enable LISA North to focus entirely on elementary- and middle-level education, and LISA West will provide families with an elementary-school option located near the current west campus.

A combined high school aims to increase academic success for graduates. If the state Board of Education approves this amendment, it will be implemented in the 2016-2017 school year.

Ekin said LISA Academy is unique because of three distinct categories: parentalinvolvement promotion; intensive and flexible tutoring opportunities; and an online database tracking system that allows parents to track students' performance through a mobile application.

"All of these factors, combined with a hardworking staff and supportive parent network, set LISA Academy apart from all other charter schools in the area," Ekin said. "As an active part of the child's education, the teacher, parents and students work as a triad to achieve the success demanded by the Common Core and Ivy League colleges."

In April, LISA Academy initiated the first Arkansas STEM Festival on the campus of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. The festival paves the way for students in Arkansas to present their growing knowledge in the STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) field. The second annual Arkansas STEM Festival will be held on the UALR Campus on Feb. 26.
