6	(2) "Medically contraindicated" means the vaccine should not be
7	administered to an individual because of a condition that individual has that
8	will be detrimental to the individual's health if the individual receives the
9	vaccine; and
10	(3) "Person" means any natural person, corporation, firm,
11	partnership, limited partnership, trust, association, or any other legal or
12	commercial entity.
13	(b) A person shall not coerce another person to receive a vaccine or
14	immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) if:
15	(1) The vaccine or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)
16	is medically contraindicated for the other person, as attested by a written
17	statement from a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state; or
18	(2) The other person objects to the vaccine or immunization for
19	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) on the grounds that the vaccine or immunization
20	for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) conflicts with the person's religious or
21	philosophical beliefs.
22	(c)(1) If an employer does not give consideration for the conditions
23	described in subdivision (b)(1) and (b)(2) of this section and takes punitive
24	action against an employee who requested the consideration, the employee may
25	<u>seek lost wages.</u>
26	(2) An employee who seeks lost wages under this section shall be
27	reimbursed comparable to unemployment benefits in this state through the
28	American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, or any other federal
29	funds that may become available.
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31	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
32	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that employers and entities are
33	requiring or mandating vaccine or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-
34	19) for the citizens of Arkansas; that religious or philosophical beliefs
35	against the vaccine or immunization for coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) are being
36	ignored across the state; that employers and entities are discriminating and

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1	coercing the citizens of Arkansas to receive a vaccine or immunization for		
2	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); and that this act is immediately necessary to		
3	protect the citizens of Arkansas from discrimination and coercion for their		
4	religious or philosophical beliefs against the vaccine or immunization for		
5	coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19). Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist,		
6	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
7	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
8	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
10	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
11	bill; or		
12	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
13	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
