

27	7 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 7	, Chapter 9, Subchapter 1, is amended
28	B to add an additional section to read as	follows:

30	) <u>(a) Upon conviction, a person co</u>	mmits a Class A misdemeanor if the
31	l <u>person knowingly:</u>	
32	2 <u>(1) Interferes with a name</u>	other than his or her own name on a
33	3 petition;	
34	4 <u>(2) Changes a name other t</u>	han his or her own name on a petition;
35	5 <u>(3) Erases or otherwise re</u>	moves a name other than his or her own
36	6 <u>name on a petition;</u>	



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1	(4) Destroys a signature other than his or her own signature on	
2	a petition;	
3	(5) Pays a person any form of compensation in exchange for not	
4	signing a petition as a petitioner;	
5	(6) Accepts or pays money or anything of value for not obtaining	
6	signatures on a petition when the person is included on the sponsor's list	
7	filed with the Secretary of State under § 7-9-601;	
8	(7) Misrepresents the purpose and effect of the petition or the	
9	measure affected for the purpose of causing a person to not sign a petition	
10	when acting as a canvasser; and	
11	(8) Pays a person any form of compensation in exchange for	
12	destroying a signature on a petition.	
13	(b) A person may be charged with a Class A misdemeanor for each	
14	violation under subsection (a) of this section.	
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16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 7, Chapter 9, Subchapter 6, is amended	
17	to add an additional section to read as follows:	
18	7-9-602. Hiring of paid petition blockers — Definitions.	
19	(a) As used in this section:	
20	(1) "Disqualifying offense" means:	
21	(A) A felony;	
22	(B) A violation of the election laws;	
23	<u>(C)</u> Fraud;	
24	(D) Forgery;	
25	(E) Counterfeiting;	
26	(F) Identity theft;	
27	(G) A crime of violence, including assault, battery, or	
28	intimidation;	
29	(H) Harassment;	
30	(1) Terroristic threatening;	
31	(J) A sex offense, including sexual harassment;	
32	(K) A violation of the drug and narcotics laws;	
33	(L) Breaking and entering;	
34	(M) Trespassing;	
35	(N) Destruction or damage of property;	
36	(O) Vandalism;	

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1	(P) Arson; or	
2	(Q) A crime of theft, including robbery, burglary, and	
3	simple theft or larceny;	
4	(2) "Paid petition blocker" means a person who is paid or with	
5	whom there is an agreement to pay money or anything of value in exchange for	
6	interfering with a paid canvasser's attempt to solicit or obtain a signature	
7	on a petition or a paid canvasser's solicitation of a signature on a	
8	petition; and	
9	(3) "Petition-blocking sponsor" means a person, entity, or	
10	person affiliated with an entity, who pays or who makes an agreement to pay	
11	money or anything of value in exchange for interfering with a paid	
12	canvasser's attempt to solicit or obtain a signature on a petition or a paid	
13	canvasser's solicitation of a signature on a petition.	
14	(b) A petition-blocking sponsor shall:	
15	(1) Provide a complete list of all paid petition blockers' names	
16	and current residential addresses to the Secretary of State;	
17	(2) Update the list provided under subdivision (b)(1) of this	
18	section if additional paid petition blockers are hired;	
19	(c)(l) Upon submission of the petition-blocking sponsor's list of paid	
20	petition blockers to the Secretary of State, the petition-blocking sponsor	
21	shall certify to the Secretary of State that each paid petition blocker in	
22	the petition-blocking sponsor's employ has no disqualifying offenses in	
23	accordance with this section.	
24	(2) To verify that there are no disqualifying offenses on record	
25	for a paid petition blocker, a petition-blocking sponsor shall obtain, at the	
26	petition-blocking sponsor's cost, from the Division of Arkansas State Police,	
27	a current state criminal history and criminal record search on every paid	
28	petition blocker to be registered with the Secretary of State.	
29	(3) The criminal history and criminal record search required by	
30	this section shall be obtained within thirty (30) days before the date that	
31	the paid petition blocker begins interfering with the collection of	
32	signatures.	
33	(d) Before acting as a paid petition blocker, the prospective paid	
34	petition blocker shall:	
35	(1)(A) Be a citizen of the United States; and	
36	(B) Be a resident of this state; and	

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1	(2) Submit in person or by mail to the petition-blocking	
2	sponsor:	
3	(A) The full name and any assumed name of the prospective	
4	paid petition blocker;	
5	(B) The current residence address of the prospective paid	
6	petition blocker and the prospective paid petition blocker's permanent	
7	domicile address if the prospective paid petition blocker's permanent	
8	domicile address is different from the prospective paid petition blocker's	
9	current residence address; and	
10	(C) A signed statement taken under oath or solemn	
11	affirmation stating that the prospective paid petition blocker has not	
12	pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to or been found guilty of a disqualifying	
13	offense in any state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto	
14	Rico, Guam, or any other United States protectorate.	
15	(e) A petition-blocking sponsor shall maintain the information	
16	required under this section for each paid petition blocker for three (3)	
17	years after the general election.	
18	(f) Upon conviction, a person commits a Class A misdemeanor if the	
19	petition-blocking sponsor or paid petition blocker knowingly violates this	
20	section.	
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
