

# Zelenskyy invites Trump to observe ‘real war’

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy invited Donald Trump to travel with him to the front lines of Russia’s full-scale invasion of his country so the former U.S. leader can experience “real war.”

Speaking at the Munich Security Conference on Saturday, where he’s on his latest trip to shore up support among allies, Zelenskyy drew applause from delegates with his invitation to Trump, who has called into question the U.S. commitment to transatlantic security during his campaign for reelection.

If he returns to office after the November vote, Trump is considering scaled-back commitments to some NATO members if they don’t meet spending targets as well as pushing Ukraine to negotiate an end to the war, people familiar with his thinking said last week.

Zelenskyy said it’s important to maintain ties to officials from both sides of the political divide and Ukraine “always wanted to involve them in real information, real war.”

“Mr. Trump, if he will come, I am ready even to go with him to the front line,” he added. “We have to demonstrate to people who are decision makers what does it mean. The real war, not in Instagram.”

Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte, who is one of the front-runners to become the next head of NATO, weighed in on Trump, urging people to “stop moaning and whining and nagging” about him.

“We don’t spend more on defense or ramp up ammunition production because Trump may come back,” Rutte said. “All that whining and moaning, I hear that constantly over the last couple of days. Lets stop doing that.”

Zelenskyy was later asked what he would expect if the Netherlands premier takes over from Jens Stoltenberg when the Norwegian’s mandate ends Oct. 1.

After joking their talks “won’t be that polite,” Zelenskyy said he will count on Rutte for Ukraine’s bid to join the transatlantic defense alliance.

## Howard player could be the key to unlocking a baseball resurgence in inner-city Chattanooga

The sunshine and unusually warm, almost spring-like temperatures the day before Christmas in 2021 painted the perfect backdrop for what would soon take place on The Howard School baseball field that afternoon.

Brandon Turner, a former minor leaguer and the founder of eXposure Baseball, was making an annual

trip to the Emma Wheeler Homes to deliver a trunk load of equipment — baseball gloves, bats, balls and even Wiffle Balls and bats — to children when he was approached by Howard coach Jon Johnson with a request.

Johnson asked if Turner could take a few minutes to talk with one of his Hustlin’ Tigers players, Camron James, a sophomore who had shown budding potential.

“Jon introduced me to Cam, and I

started talking about the usual stuff like making sure his grades were in order,” said Turner, a Cleveland, Tennessee, native who went on to become a star infielder at Mississippi State University under legendary coach Ron Polk before being drafted by Major League Baseball’s Florida Marlins in 2008. “The more I spoke with him, there was something about the kid that you’re just sort of drawn to. I realized he was serious about wanting to get better, so we decided to go to the field and see him in action.”

# A Black author takes a renewed look at Georgia’s white founder and his failed attempt to ban slavery

SAVANNAH, Ga. — Michael Thurmond thought he was reading familiar history at the burial place of Georgia’s colonial founder. Then a single sentence on a marble plaque extolling the accomplishments of James Edward Oglethorpe left him stunned speechless.

Within a lengthy tribute to the Englishman who died in 1785, the inscription read: “He was the friend of the Oppressed Negro.”

Oglethorpe led the expedition that established Georgia as the last of Britain’s 13 American colonies in February 1733. Thurmond, a history aficionado and the only Black member of a Georgia delegation visiting the founder’s tomb outside London, knew Oglethorpe had tried unsuccessfully to keep slaves out of the colony. Historians widely agreed he was concerned for the safety and self-sufficiency of white settlers rather than the suffering of enslaved Africans.

Could Georgia’s founding

father have been an ally to Black people in an era when the British Empire was forcing thousands into bondage?

“It was stunning,” Thurmond recalled. “Initially, I was consumed by disbelief. I didn’t believe it was true.”

Thurmond would grapple with questions raised by that visit for the next 27 years, compelled to take a closer look at Oglethorpe. Now, he has written a provocatively titled book: “James Oglethorpe, Father Of Georgia — A Founder’s Journey From Slave Trader

to Abolitionist.”

Published this month by the University of Georgia Press, Thurmond’s book makes a case that Oglethorpe evolved to revile slavery and, unlike most white Europeans of his time, saw the humanity in enslaved Africans. And while Oglethorpe’s efforts to prohibit slavery in Georgia ultimately failed, Thurmond argues he left a lasting — and largely uncredited — legacy by influencing early English abolitionists.

# Frost’s parents end up with Chestnut Street property following foreclosure

When his business ventures collapsed in September, embattled Chattanooga accountant Jonathan Frost put his Chestnut Street office complex on the market for \$10 million.

Potential buyers balked, wary of the price and possible legal battles, Frost’s real estate agent said. But in November, according to public records, a newly-created firm connected to Frost’s father acquired the mortgage on the property’s main lot from the bank.

At some point, records show, Frost went into default

on that and another loan that was controlled by his parents, and the property went into foreclosure. Late last month, according to deeds filed with the county, it was acquired at an auction for \$5.8 million — by Frost’s parents.

The transaction shapes the fate of a major asset controlled by Jonathan Frost, whose money and property are of interest to the clients, investors, creditors and a business partner who have accused the accountant of various breaches of trust and are seeking collectively tens of millions of dollars in damages from him and connected firms.

Investor suspicions of betrayal and multimillion-dollar fraud have swelled since September, when Frost’s accounting firm with partner Paul Croft abruptly collapsed and management at the men’s separate green energy firm, Rhino Onward International, resigned after months of alleged nonpayment.

In a September email, a human resources staffer at the accounting firm told staff members they would not get promised payments because Frost, its CEO and part owner, didn’t have the money.

# Wildlife cameras to help restore tiger population

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia — Cambodia will begin installing hundreds of monitoring cameras and import four tigers from India as part of a plan to restore its tiger population, officials said Friday.

Tigers were declared “functionally extinct” in Cambodia in 2016 by the World Wide Fund for Nature. The last tiger spotted in the country was seen in 2007 by a motion-sensing camera in the forests of eastern Monduliri province.

Cambodia’s Environment Ministry said it plans to install cameras at half-mile intervals in the Cardamom Mountains for use over a three-month period covering both the dry and rainy seasons to monitor wildlife, particularly those preyed upon by tigers such as deer and wild boar.

The conservation

group Wildlife Alliance, which is working with the ministry on the project, said 410 cameras will be installed.

“This information will aid conservationists in devising plans to bolster big tiger populations, which may involve measures like breeding more wildlife or supplying domestic cattle or buffaloes,” the ministry said in a statement. “It will facilitate the study of the density and distribution of prey species crucial for the survival of big tigers.”

Ministry spokesperson Khvay Atitya said the installation of the cameras will begin this weekend. He said four tigers, three female and one male, will be sent from India by the end of the year to be settled in a 222-acre protected zone inside the Tatai Wildlife Sanctuary, which is in the western provinces of Koh Kong and Pursat.

Under an agreement with India, if the pilot plan

proceeds smoothly, 12 more tigers will be imported over the following five years, he said.

In 2022, Cambodia and India signed a Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation in Biodiversity Conservation, Sustainable Wildlife Management, and Strategies to Restore Big Tigers and Their Habitats.

Cambodia’s once-significant undeveloped forest areas were abundant with wildlife. But after the communist Khmer Rouge’s brutal rule in the 1970s left society and the economy devastated, poor rural dwellers scoured the forests for wildlife.

Much of what was found was sold to traders who sent it to China, where many wild animals, including tigers, are believed to possess medicinal and sex-enhancing properties. Poaching is still rampant, and forest cover has been reduced by intense logging.

# Nepal pursuing sacred items which were smuggled abroad

KATHMANDU, Nepal — Nepal’s gods and goddess are returning home.

An unknown number of sacred statues of Hindu deities were stolen and smuggled abroad in the past. Now dozens are being repatriated to the Himalayan nation, part of a growing global effort to return such items to countries in Asia, Africa and elsewhere.

Last month, four idols and masks of Hindu gods were returned to Nepal from the United States by private owners.

Among them was a 16th century statue of Uma-Maheswora, an avatar of the gods Shiva and Parvati, that was stolen four decades ago. It was not clear who took it or how it ended up at the Brooklyn Museum in New York, which handed it over to the Manhattan District Attorney’s Office.

Devotees celebrated its return in Patan, south of the capital, Kathmandu. The stone-paved alleys were crowded with devotees offering money and flowers. Men in traditional attire played drums and cymbals and chanted prayers.

“I cannot say how extremely happy I am right now,” said Ram Maya Benjankar, a 52-year-old who said she had cried as a child after learning the statue had been stolen and waited years for its return.

The statue had simply disappeared from their neighborhood, she said.

The majority of Nepal’s 29 million people are Hindu, and every neighborhood has a temple that houses such items. They are rarely guarded, making it easy for thieves.

For Nepalese, the idols have significance but no monetary value. For smugglers, however, they can

bring profit abroad. For years, there was little attention given to the thefts or any effort made at recovery.

That has changed in recent years as the government, art lovers and campaigners pursue stolen heritage items. They have been successful in many cases.

A group representing the ethnic Newar community from Nepal in the U.S. heard about the reappearance of the Uma-Maheswora statue at the Brooklyn Museum and decided to bring it home.

“We were very sad to see ... our gods ... locked in (a) basement. We (decided) that we need to take back the heritage,” said Bijaya Man Singh, a member of the group that carried the four idols and masks back to Nepal.

Now the temple in Patan is being prepared to reinstate the Uma-Maheswora statue. Following the welcome ceremony, it was placed on a chariot carried by devotees and taken to a museum, where it will be kept under security until its final move.

More than 20 other stolen artifacts are in the pipeline to be repatriated to Nepal in the near future, according to Jayaram Shrestha, director at the National Museum in Kathmandu.

Most will return from the United States and Europe.

Shrestha has built a special room to exhibit repatriated items so the public can come and worship if they want. There are currently 62 statues on display.

“As we expect many to come soon, we are expanding the section of the museum,” Shrestha said. “I don’t want to store them in storage. They should be made available.”

It has become easier to locate stolen items as awareness grows among Nepalis at home and abroad. They can now track artifacts online when they are exhibited or put up for auction.

And more collectors and museums now believe they should be taken back to where they belong, Shrestha said.

“The Nepal government has been taking initiative to get them back with recovery campaigns and using diplomatic channels, embassies in foreign countries,” he said.

“We have made it clear that they need to be reinstated to their original place and security ensured to keep these thousands-of-years-old artifacts safe,” said Nepal’s foreign minister, Narayan Prakash Saud.

# 4 months of combat see US carrier face Houthi missiles, new threat

ABOARD THE USS DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER — Sailors aboard the aircraft carrier USS Dwight D. Eisenhower and its accompanying warships have spent four months straight at sea defending against ballistic missiles and flying attack drones fired by Iranian-backed Houthis, and are now more regularly also defending against a new threat — fast unmanned vessels that are fired at them through the water.

While the Houthis have launched unmanned surface vessels, or USVs, in the past against Saudi coalition forces that have intervened in Yemen's civil war, they were used for the first time against U.S. military and commercial vessels in the Red Sea on Jan. 4. In the weeks since, the Navy has had to intercept and destroy multiple USVs.

It's "more of an unknown threat that we don't have a lot of intel on, that could be extremely lethal — an unmanned surface vessel," said Rear Adm. Marc Miguez, commander of Carrier Strike Group Two, of which the Eisenhower is the flagship. The Houthis "have ways of obviously controlling them just like they do the (unmanned aerial vehicles), and we have very

fidelity as to all the stockpiles of what they have USV-wise," Miguez said.

The Houthis began firing on U.S. military and commercial vessels after a deadly blast at the Al-Ahli hospital in Gaza on Oct. 17, a few days after the outbreak of the Israel-Hamas war. The rebels have said they will continue firing on ships transiting the region until Israel ceases its military operations inside Gaza.

The Eisenhower has been on patrol here since Nov. 4, and some of its accompanying ships have been on location for even

longer, since October.

In those months the Eisenhower's fleet of fighter and surveillance aircraft has worked nonstop to detect and intercept the missiles and drones fired by the Houthis at ships in the Red Sea, Bab el-Mandeb Strait and Gulf of Aden. The carrier's F/A-18 fighter jets are also frequently launched to take out missile sites they detect before munitions are fired.

As of Wednesday, the carrier strike group — which includes the cruiser USS Philippine Sea, the destroyers USS Mason and Gravelly, and additional

Navy assets in the region, including the destroyers USS Laboon and USS Carney — has conducted more than 95 intercepts of drones, anti-ship ballistic missiles and anti-ship cruise missiles and made more than 240 self-defense strikes on more than 50 Houthi targets.

On Thursday, U.S. Central Command reported the strike group had intercepted and destroyed seven additional anti-ship cruise missiles and another explosive USV prepared to launch against vessels in the Red Sea.

# Small business that sews cloth diapers creates jobs and helps parents in Gaza

RAFAH, Gaza Strip — Their scissors move quickly, shearing pieces of white cloth to be stitched together with cotton pads and taken to market in battered cardboard boxes.

Before the day is done, the Palestinian seamstresses will have sewn 500 diapers and distributed them to war-weary parents in Gaza for about \$4 per package of eight, half of what mass-produced disposable diapers cost in the besieged enclave.

Maysaa Qatati, the manager of the sewing workshop, knows the output will barely make a dent in the huge demand — but the little business is thriving and creating jobs.

"People were looking for pampers and could not find them," she said from the whirring workshop in Rafah, the southernmost city in Gaza. "They would stand in line at the merchant and buy it at a very high price."

The war between Israel and Gaza's Hamas rulers has sparked a humanitarian catastrophe, spawning shortages of the most basic necessities and sending prices of basic goods soaring. The situation has hit parents of young children particularly hard — the going market rate for diapers in Gaza is more than 10 times higher than what it was before the war.

Around 1.5 million displaced Palestinians are

crammed into apartment buildings and tent camps in this city on the border with Egypt as Israeli warplanes swoop overhead. Sporadic aid deliveries, hobbled by Israeli restrictions and relentless fighting, have compounded an already dire situation. At makeshift street stalls, older children working as hawkers sell individual diapers for \$1 to \$1.50 or entire packs of 50 for up to \$55.

In some cases, parents say they have resorted to easily soiled cloth diapers. But cleaning those is difficult when water is so scarce. The disposable diapers made in Qatati's sewing workshop are an improvement because of the cotton pads.

"People cannot provide for their children," said Imad Abu Arara, who sells the workshop's diapers at the market. "This factory is an alternative to this problem and is much cheaper."

The war broke out Oct. 7 in response to the Hamas' deadly attack on southern Israel, when the militants killed some 1,200 people and dragged 250 hostages back to Gaza.

# Head of UN's agency helping Palestinians accuses Israel of attempting to destroy it

The head of the main United Nations agency supporting people in Gaza alleged Israel is intent on "destroying" the organization along with the idea that Palestinians are refugees and have a right to return home one day.

Philippe Lazzarini accused Israel in an interview with the Swiss newspaper Tages-Anzeiger of having a "long-term political goal" of eliminating the U.N. aid agency he leads, which is known by the acronym UNRWA. It was created more than 70 years ago to assist Palestinians who fled or were forced from their homes during the 1948 Mideast war over Israel's creation.

"At the moment, we are dealing with (an) Israeli

campaign, which is aimed at destroying UNRWA," Lazzarini said in the interview published Saturday.

His remarks provided his most sweeping pushback yet against Israeli accusations that the agency ignored alleged attempts by Hamas to infiltrate its Gaza operation.

Lazzarini, who has served as UNRWA's commissioner-general since 2020, said Israel believes that "if the aid agency is abolished, the status of the Palestinian refugees will be resolved ... and with it the right of return."

The fate of Palestinian refugees was a key point of dispute between Israelis

and Palestinians in previous failed peace talks a decade ago. Israel rejects Palestinian demands to allow descendants of refugees to return to what is now Israel, arguing it would dilute Israel's Jewish majority.

Israel's government did not immediately comment Saturday on the Tages-Anzeiger interview. The U.N. agency had no further comment beyond the published remarks.

Israel has alleged 12 of UNRWA's thousands of staff members participated in the Hamas attack that sparked the war in Gaza. The United States, the agency's largest donor, has suspended funding to it and is looking at alternatives to UNRWA.

Without that money from the U.S. and other key backers who also suspended

their support — totaling \$438 million, or more than half this year's expected funding — Lazzarini said UNRWA will have to halt operations in April.

Congress has made clear U.S. funding for the agency will stop for good, the U.S. special envoy for Middle East humanitarian issues, David Satterfield, told an event hosted by the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

"It's not a suspension. It is prohibition on providing further funding," Satterfield said.

At the same time, the U.S. wants UNRWA's critical functions of aid delivery and support to Palestinians to continue.

"We are working ... with the U.N. family, with U.N. agencies, to see how these ... functions can be sustained," Satterfield said.

# Evidence of diverted Gaza aid is lacking

RAFAH, Gaza Strip — Israel has not presented evidence for its claim Hamas is diverting U.N. aid, and its recent targeted killings of Gaza police commanders of truck convoys have made it "virtually impossible" to distribute the goods safely, a top U.S. envoy said in rare public criticism of Israel.

New airstrikes in central Gaza on Saturday killed more than 40 people and wounded at least 50, according to Associated Press journalists and hospital officials.

David Satterfield, Biden administration's special Middle East envoy for humanitarian issues, said with the departure of police escorts following Israeli strikes, criminal gangs are increasingly targeting the truck convoys carrying needed aid. He said lawlessness and regular Israeli protests at entry points by those opposed to aid going into Gaza have disrupted delivery.

"We are working with the Israeli government (and) military (to see) what solutions can be found ... because everyone wants to see the assistance continue," Satterfield told the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace on Friday. A solution "is going to require some form of security escorts to return."

Satterfield said Israeli officials have not presented "specific evidence of diversion or theft" of U.N. assistance, but that militants have their own interests in using "other channels ... to shape where ... assistance goes."

## DESPERATE FOR AID

Even before the latest setback, the U.S. has said aid reaching Gaza is woefully inadequate. More than half of Gaza's 2.3 million people are packed into the southern city of Rafah, on the border with Egypt, having heeded Israeli evacuation orders. Yet nowhere is safe, with Israel also carrying out airstrikes in Rafah.

Israel's air and ground offensive, triggered by the Oct. 7 Hamas attack on Israel, has killed nearly 29,000 Palestinians, according to health authorities in the Hamas-run enclave. It has caused widespread destruction, displaced some 80% of the population and sparked a humanitarian crisis.

Rafah residents say it's common for groups of children and teens to try to stop trucks as they enter Gaza and to grab supplies.

On Friday, police opened fire after a crowd charged toward an aid truck that had emerged from the Rafah crossing with Egypt. Wael Abu Omar, a spokesperson for the Crossings Authority, said one person was killed.

Israel has alleged Hamas is diverting aid, including fuel, after it enters Gaza, a claim denied by U.N. aid agencies. Last week, an Israeli airstrike on a car killed three senior police commanders in Rafah, the first entry point for aid deliveries.

The police force is controlled by the Hamas-run Interior Ministry, but Satterfield noted it also includes those who joined before Hamas seized Gaza in 2007.

## EGYPT'S CONCERNS

Israel has said it is determined to expand its ground combat to Rafah, portraying it as the last significant stronghold of Hamas fighters, but has not given a timeline. Addressing international concerns, Israel has said it would develop a plan to evacuate civilians before invading the southern city.

U.S. President Joe Biden has urged Israel not to carry out the operation without a "credible" plan to protect civilians and to instead focus on a ceasefire, while Egypt has said such an operation could threaten diplomatic relations between the countries. Many other world leaders have issued similar messages of concern.

Israel has said it has no plans to force Palestinians into Egypt. New satellite photos, however, indicate Egypt is preparing for that very scenario. The images show Egypt building a wall and leveling land near its border with Gaza. Egypt has not publicly acknowledged the construction.

Two senior Egyptian officials said Saturday that Egypt is building additional defensive lines in an already existing buffer zone. They spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to discuss details with the media.

The buffer zone, which Egypt built as part of its battle against an Islamic State group insurgency, is 3 miles from the border. It was meant to prevent weapons smuggling to and from Gaza through underground tunnels. Authorities said they destroyed more than 1,500 tunnels over the years.

The newly fortified zone is not intended to shelter Palestinians fleeing Gaza, said Diaa Rashwan, the head of the State Information Service.

# 4-month-long Adviiivka defense ends in retreat

KYIV, Ukraine — Ukraine's military chief said early Saturday that he's withdrawing troops from the city of Avdiivka in eastern Ukraine, where outnumbered defenders have battled a Russian assault for four months.

The timing is critical as Russia is looking for a morale boost ahead of the Feb. 24 second anniversary of Moscow's full-scale invasion of Ukraine and the March presidential election in Russia.

In a short statement posted on social media, Ukrainian commander Col. Gen. Oleksandr Syrskyi said he had made the decision to avoid encirclement and "preserve the lives and health of servicemen."

The commander-in-chief added troops were moving to "more favorable lines."

"Our soldiers performed their military duty with dignity, did everything possible to destroy the best Russian military units, inflicted significant losses on the enemy in terms of manpower and equipment.

"We are taking measures to stabilize the situation and maintain our positions," the statement read.

The withdrawal came a day after Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy made another trip to western Europe, hoping to press his country's Western allies to keep providing military support.

It was Syrskyi's first major test since being appointed as Ukraine's new army chief last week.

In his previous position as commander of Ukraine's ground forces, he faced criticism for holding on to the city of Bakhmut for nine months, a siege that became the war's longest and bloodiest

battle and cost Ukraine dearly, but also served to sap Russia's forces.

In recent days, reports emerged that Ukrainian troops in Avdiivka faced a deteriorating situation.

Rodion Kudriashov, deputy commander of the 3rd Assault Brigade, said Friday that Ukrainian troops were still holding out against the onslaught of about 15,000 Russian soldiers, but he expected the situation would "soon become critical."

"The enemy is trying to penetrate our defense and in some places to bypass our positions," he told The Associated Press.

The 3rd Brigade said on its social media account Friday that its soldiers were at the huge Avdiivka Coke Plant. Russian warplanes have been dropping about 60 bombs a day, relentlessly shelling the area and launching assaults with armor and infantry, the brigade said.

# 'Tea bags': Ukraine decodes enemy chatter to save lives

SEREBRYANSKY FOREST, Ukraine — As the radio crackles with enemy communications that are hard to decipher, one Russian command rings out clear: "Brew five Chinese tea bags on 38 orange."

A Ukrainian soldier known on the battlefield as Mikhass, who has spent months listening to and analyzing such chatter, is able to quickly decode the gibberish. It means: Prepare five Beijing-made artillery shells and fire them on a specific Ukrainian position in the Serebryansky Forest, which forms the front line in the country's restive northeast.

Hiding in the basement of an abandoned home 7 miles away, Mikhass immediately warns the commander of a unit embedded in that part of the forest, giving him crucial minutes to get his men into trenches, saving their lives.

On the defensive and critically short of ammunition and soldiers after two years of war, Ukrainian forces are increasingly resorting to intelligence gleaned from radio intercepts in an effort to preserve their resources.

The painstaking work is part of a larger effort to beef up and refine electronic warfare capabilities so soldiers can be warned earlier of impending attacks, while having the battlefield intelligence needed to make their own strikes more deadly.

To prevent enemy drone attacks, signal-jamming is also on the rise.

After months of near stalemate along the 621 mile front line, Ukraine expects fierce attacks in the year ahead from a Russian enemy determined to wear down its defenses to forge a breakthrough. Russian President

Vladimir Putin has said there will be no peace until Russia achieves its goals, which include recapturing the entire Donbas region of eastern Ukraine, which it illegally annexed in 2022.

The new commander of Ukraine's army, Gen. Oleksandr Syrskyi, has highlighted the importance of electronic warfare, and the defense ministry has increased spending on the people and technology behind it.

**SAVING LIVES**

Russia, which controls about one-fifth of Ukraine, has the advantage of a more developed domestic weapons industry and it uses conscription and coercion to call up troops.

For Ukraine, shortages have forced brigades to use shells sparingly and only after locating precise targets. Difficulty in mobilizing troops means Ukrainian commanders must be extra protective of soldiers' lives as they try to fend off ferocious Russian attacks.

It is within this context that better surveillance, eavesdropping and jamming have become more urgent.

Several miles south of where Mikhass is positioned, in the Donetsk region town of Konstantinivka, the 93rd Brigade's Electronic Warfare unit is using jammers to stave off drones, the main driver of injuries for soldiers in the region.

The platoon commander is alert, staring at a laptop that shows signals picked up by small antennas planted near the front line. When a Russian Lancet attack drone approaches their area of operation, his screen lights up with activity.

The commander, known as Oleksandr, flips a switch to activate the jammer which interferes with the

drone's radar; it's the equivalent of shining a bright light in someone's eye to disorient them.

"It's a must," he said of their operation. "A lot of guys are dying because of drones."

Radio operators like Mikhass work in shifts around the clock.

The antennas he relies on to pick up Russian radio signals are camouflaged, jutting out of trees in the forest near Kreminna, close to Russian positions. From a quiet basement command center nearby, Mikhass and other soldiers chain smoke cigarettes and listen through headphones.

A new and sophisticated signal-finding antenna, which resembles a carousel, uses triangulation to locate where the radio waves are emanating from.

They cross-reference what they hear against reconnaissance images and use maps of enemy positions to slowly piece together what it all means.

They are part of a 50-man intelligence unit dubbed the Bunnies of Cherkess — a name inspired by Chinese strategist Sun Tzu, who advised feigning weakness when one is strong.

"No one takes bunnies seriously, right?" said Cherkess, the commander of the eponymous unit.

Radio intercepts reveal Kremlin is determined to control the entire Serebryansky Forest, which divides Lyman from Russian-occupied Kreminna. It's part of an effort to reach Torske, a village in Donetsk west of Kreminna. From Torske, Russia will be closer to recapturing the nearby hub of Lyman, which would be a devastating setback for Ukraine and disrupt its ability to move supplies to the front.

# Are numbers of missing being misrepresented?

MEXICO CITY — In November, Susana García Colorado received a call from a man who said he was from the Mexican government commission charged with finding the more than 100,000 people officially classified as "disappeared."

"We have information that your brother has appeared," he told her. "We would like to have an interview with him."

That was news to her. She checked with relatives, her brother's friends, his old co-workers, the police and the hospital where he worked in the port city of Veracruz. No one had seen or heard from Osvaldo Julián García Colorado since October 2020.

"It was all a lie. My brother is still disappeared," she said. "And everything was the same."

Except for one thing: Her brother's name was removed from the online government register of the disappeared.

The government has been purging what it says are false entries, including duplicate names and cases of people who are dead or discovered to be alive at home or in jails. But scores of people who have been struck from the list are still missing, according to their families.

In a country with a surfeit of clandestine graves and unidentified bodies, the crisis of the missing has become intensely political, with critics of President Andrés Manuel López Obrador accusing him of trying to whitewash his administration's

record on violence in the run-up to national elections in June.

The families accuse the president of "disappearing the disappeared."

"They're going to close the files and shut down all the cases," lamented Virginia Garay Cazares, whose 19-year-old son vanished in 2018 on his way to work at a hot dog and hamburger stand in the western city of Tepic. "They don't understand the pain and heartbreak for those of us with missing loved ones."

López Obrador has denied any plan to cook the books or stop looking for the missing.

"There is no intention on our part — there never has been — to erase any of the disappeared," he recently told reporters. "What is happening is a revision and general search, nationwide, to clarify precisely the number of disappeared, and put that in order."

Calling his enemies "vultures," the president has charged that opponents "infiltrated" the government and inflated the numbers of disappeared in a bid to tarnish his administration.

"I understand that there is legitimate discontent among the families of the victims," López Obrador said. "But our adversaries are also upset."

The term "desaparecido" entered the international lexicon with the infamous Cold War-era violence in Argentina and Chile. But the ranks of the missing are now far greater in Mexico.

Though hundreds of people disappeared in Mexico during its own brutal crackdown on leftist militants during the

1960s and 1970s, the major problem today is organized crime. In 2006, the government declared war on the drug cartels, setting off a wave of violence that has not let up.

The most high-profile disappearance case involves 43 teacher trainees from the town of Ayotzinapa in the western state of Guerrero whose presumed killings have never been solved. Since they vanished in 2014, only a few charred remains have been found.

When López Obrador came to office in 2018 as a leftist reformer promising to reduce crime and violence, the official number of disappeared was about 53,000. His administration boosted funding for the government search commission set up to help find them.


But by 2022, the total topped 100,000. López Obrador, who often cites "other data" when disputing statistics he doesn't like, began to express doubts about the veracity of the numbers. He ordered an exhaustive new census of the disappeared.


Nearly 5,000 government workers fanned out across the country to knock on doors, scrutinize police and investigative files and scour vaccination records, public-aid registers and voting rolls. Over the course of the next year, they made more than 111,000 house visits and 86,000 telephone calls.

In December, the government released the results: Of the more than 110,964 people officially listed as disappeared as of August, only about 11% could be corroborated as missing.

# Death of Kremlin enemy provokes outrage

## Few concrete actions exist to stop Putin

As outrage over the death of chief Kremlin foe Alexei Navalny reverberates across the world, Russian President Vladimir Putin is turning a deaf ear to Western anger as he prepares to extend his 24-year rule in an election next month and police across Russia continue to squelch any protest attempts.

The U.S. and its allies are pondering new sanctions against Russia over Navalny's death and the Kremlin's recent actions in Ukraine. But as U.S. aid for Ukraine remains stuck in Congress and NATO allies in Europe struggle to fill the gap, many wonder what the West can actually do to stop the ruthless Kremlin leader, given that multiple previous rounds of penalties have failed to.

"There isn't really the room for any great value in additional sanctions" against Russia, already one of the most sanctioned countries in the world, Mark Galeotti, head of the London-based Mayak Intelligence consultancy firm noted in a YouTube commentary.

Instead, Galeotti said, the West should focus more on working with Navalny's allies and helping ordinary Russians get access to information channels that counter Kremlin propaganda.

Such efforts are key especially now, according to Galeotti, who described Navalny's death as yet another step in Putin's transition from "hybrid authoritarianism" to "brutal thuggish despotism." The U.S. and NATO allies have been weighing more actions to bolster support for Ukraine, where the Russian military has just forced Ukrainian troops to retreat from the key eastern stronghold of Avdiivka after a four-month ferocious battle. The allies discussed ways to increase the cost of war to Russia to force Putin to back down.

But the 71-year-old leader has vowed to press on, refusing to relinquish any of his gains and declaring in an interview with former Fox News host Tucker Carlson last week that the West will "sooner or later" be forced to negotiate a deal — on his terms.

Navalny's death shows Putin's "complete ruthlessness and disdain ... for both Western and international opinion," said Nigel Gould-Davies, a former British ambassador to Belarus and senior fellow for Russia and Eurasia at the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London. Russia announced Navalny's death on Friday, just as Western leaders gathered at a security conference in Munich.

Putin is "throwing down a gauntlet to the West," Gould-Davies said. "As we come up to the second anniversary of the (Ukraine) war, he is again testing Western resolve."

Navalny's death should serve as a "wake-up call" to U.S. Republicans opposing aid for Ukraine in Congress and also encourage European NATO allies to bolster their assistance to Ukraine, Gould-Davies said. "Ultimately it depends on the lessons that the West draws," he said.

But Navalny's death didn't appear to move the U.S. House speaker Friday to commit to a proposed \$61 billion aid package for Ukraine, seen as crucial to a Ukrainian victory.

Meanwhile, Putin, the longest-serving Russian leader since Soviet dictator Josef Stalin, is steamrolling toward another six years in power in a campaign involving three token rivals nominated by Kremlin-friendly parties. Boris Nadezhdin, a liberal politician who made ending the war in Ukraine his chief campaign slogan, was barred from running by election officials.

# Kremlin foes have been attacked, killed for years

TALLINN, Estonia — The attacks range from the exotic — poisoned by drinking polonium-laced tea or touching a deadly nerve agent — to the more mundane of getting shot at close range. Some take a fatal plunge from an open window.

Over the years, Kremlin political critics, turncoat spies and investigative journalists have been killed or assaulted in a variety of ways.

On Friday, Russian authorities said President Vladimir Putin's key political challenger, Alexei Navalny, died in an Arctic prison colony. The details of what happened are unknown; Navalny's team said it has no official confirmation of his death and Russian authorities said they are establishing why he died. His allies previously accused Russian officials of trying to poison him with a nerve agent in 2020.

Assassination attempts against foes of Putin have been common during his nearly quarter century in power. Those close to the victims and the few survivors have blamed Russian authorities, but the Kremlin has routinely denied involvement.

There also have been reports of prominent Russian executives dying under mysterious circumstances, including falling from windows, although whether they were deliberate killings or suicides is sometimes difficult to determine.

Some prominent cases of documented killings or attempted killings:

### POLITICAL OPPONENTS

In August 2020, Navalny fell ill on a flight from Siberia to Moscow. The plane landed in the city of Omsk, where Navalny was hospitalized in a coma. Two days later, he was airlifted to Berlin, where he recovered.

His allies almost immediately said he was poisoned, but Russian officials denied it. Labs in Germany, France and Sweden confirmed Navalny was poisoned by a Soviet-era nerve agent known as Novichok, which he reported had been applied to his underwear.

Navalny returned to Russia and was convicted last August of extremism and sentenced to 19 years in prison. It was his third conviction with a prison sentence in two years. He said the charges were politically motivated.

On Friday, Russia's Federal Penitentiary Service said Navalny felt unwell after a walk and lost consciousness. An ambulance arrived, but he could not be revived. The service said his cause of death was "being established."

In 2018, Pyotr Verzilov, a founder of the protest group Pussy Riot, fell severely ill and also was flown to Berlin, where doctors said poisoning was "highly plausible." He eventually recovered. Earlier that year, Verzilov embarrassed the Kremlin by running onto the field during soccer's World Cup final

in Moscow with three other activists to protest police brutality. His allies said he could have been targeted because of his activism.

Prominent opposition figure Vladimir Kara-Murza survived what he believes were attempts to poison him in 2015 and 2017. He nearly died from kidney failure in the first instance and suspects poisoning but no cause was determined. He was hospitalized with a similar illness in 2017 and put into a medically induced coma. His wife said doctors confirmed he was poisoned.

Kara-Murza survived, and his lawyer said police have refused to investigate. Last year, he was convicted of treason and sentenced to 25 years in prison. In January he was moved to a prison in Siberia and placed in solitary confinement over an alleged minor infraction.

The highest profile killing of a political opponent in recent years was that of Boris Nemtsov. Once deputy prime minister under Boris Yeltsin, Nemtsov was a popular politician and harsh critic of Putin. On a cold February night in 2015, he was gunned down by assailants on a bridge adjacent to the Kremlin as he walked with his girlfriend in a death that shocked the country.

Five men from the Russian region of Chechnya were convicted for his killing, with the gunman receiving up to 20 years. But Nemtsov's allies said that was an attempt to shift blame from the government.

### FORMER INTELLIGENCE OPERATIVES

In 2006, Russian defector Alexander Litvinenko, a former agent for the KGB and its post-Soviet successor agency, the FSB, became violently ill in London after drinking tea laced with radioactive polonium-210. He died three weeks later.

Litvinenko had been investigating the shooting death of Russian journalist Anna Politkovskaya as well as the Russian intelligence service's alleged links to organized crime. Before dying, Litvinenko told journalists the FSB was still operating a poisons laboratory dating from the Soviet era.

A British inquiry found that Russian agents had killed Litvinenko, probably with Putin's approval, but the Kremlin denied any involvement.

Another former Russian intelligence officer, Sergei Skripal, was poisoned in Britain in 2018. He and his adult daughter Yulia fell ill in the city of Salisbury and spent weeks in critical condition. They survived, but the attack later claimed the life of a British woman and left a man and a police officer seriously ill.

Authorities said they both were poisoned with the military grade nerve agent Novichok. Britain blamed Russian intelligence, but Moscow denied any role. Putin called Skripal, a double agent for Britain during his espionage career, a "scumbag" of

no interest to the Kremlin because he was tried in Russia and exchanged in a spy swap in 2010.

### JOURNALISTS

Numerous journalists critical of authorities in Russia have been killed or suffered mysterious deaths, which their colleagues in some cases blamed on someone in the political hierarchy. In other cases, the reported reluctance by authorities to investigate raised suspicions.

Politkovskaya, the journalist for the newspaper Novaya Gazeta whose death Litvinenko was investigating, was shot and killed in the elevator of her Moscow apartment building on Oct. 7, 2006 — Putin's birthday. She had won international acclaim for her reporting on human rights abuses in Chechnya. The gunman, from Chechnya, was convicted of the killing and sentenced to 20 years in prison. Four other Chechens were given shorter prison terms for their involvement in the murder.

Yuri Shchekochikhin, another Novaya Gazeta reporter, died of a sudden and violent illness in 2003. Shchekochikhin was investigating corrupt business deals and the possible role of Russian security services in the 1999 apartment house bombings blamed on Chechen insurgents. His colleagues insisted he was poisoned and accused the authorities of deliberately hindering the investigation.

### YEVGENY PRIGOZHIN AND HIS LIEUTENANTS

A plane crash last August which killed Yevgeny Prigozhin and top lieutenants of his Wagner private military company came two months to the day after he launched an armed rebellion that Putin labeled "a stab in the back" and "treason." While not critical of Putin, Prigozhin slammed the Russian military leadership and questioned the motives for going to war in Ukraine.

A U.S. intelligence assessment found that the crash that killed all 10 people aboard was intentionally caused by an explosion, according to U.S. and Western officials. The officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to comment. One said the explosion fell in line with Putin's "long history of trying to silence his critics."

Putin's spokesperson, Dmitry Peskov, rejected allegations the Kremlin was behind the crash. "Of course, in the West those speculations are put out under a certain angle, and all of it is a complete lie," he told reporters.

In his first public comments after the crash, Putin appeared to hint there was no bad blood between him and Prigozhin. But former Kremlin speechwriter turned political analyst Abbas Gallyamov said: "Putin has demonstrated that if you fail to obey him without question, he will dispose of you without mercy, like an enemy, even if you are formally a patriot."

# Japan's flagship rocket reaches orbit

TOKYO — Japan's flagship H3 rocket reached orbit and released two small observation satellites in a key second test following a failed debut launch last year, buoying hope for the country in the global space race.

The H3 rocket blasted off from the Tanegashima Space Center on time Saturday morning, two days after its originally scheduled liftoff was delayed by bad weather.

The rocket successfully reached orbit at an altitude of about 420 miles and released two satellites, the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, or JAXA, said.

"We feel so relieved to be able to announce the good results," JAXA President Hiroshi Yamakawa told a news conference.

The H3's main missions are to secure independent access to space and be competitive as international demand for satellite launches grows. "We made a big first step today toward achieving that goal," Yamakawa said.

The launch is a boost for Japan's space program following a recent streak of successes, including a historic precision touchdown on the moon of an unmanned spacecraft last month.

The liftoff was closely watched as a test for Japan's space development after H3, in its debut flight last March, failed to ignite the second-stage engine. JAXA and its main contractor Mitsubishi Heavy Industries have been developing H3 as a successor to its current mainstay, H-2A, which is set to retire after two more flights.

As the rocket soared and released its first payload successfully, project members at the JAXA command center cheered and hugged each other in livestreaming footage. NHK television showed some staff at a media center crying with relief and joy.

JAXA H3 project manager Masashi Okada called the result "perfect," saying H3 cleared all missions set for Saturday's flight. "After a long wait, the newborn H3 finally had its first cry."

"I now feel a heavy load taken off my shoulders. But now is the real start for H3, and we will work to steadily improve it," Okada said.

The H3 No. 2 rocket was decorated with thousands of stickers carrying messages sent from well-wishers around the country.

Two microsatellites — observation satellite CE-SAT-IE, developed by Canon Electronics, and TIRSAT, which was co-developed by a number of companies and universities — were piggybacked on the H3 Saturday. Their makers said they were willing to take the chance as they see a growing market in the satellite business.

The 187-foot-long H3 is designed to carry larger payloads than H-2A at much lower costs of about \$330 million, to be globally competitive.

Masayuki Eguchi, head of defense and space segment at Mitsubishi Heavy, said his company hopes to achieve better price competitiveness after about a dozen more launches.

"I'm delighted to see this incredible accomplishment in the space sector right after the success of the SLIM moon landing," Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said on social media. "I expect the Japanese mainstay rocket will steadily make achievement."

Last month, a H-2A rocket successfully placed a spy satellite into its planned orbit, and days later JAXA's unmanned spacecraft SLIM made the world's first "pinpoint" moon landing then captured lunar data.



Since he hadn't expected to do more than just chat and soak up advice from a baseball insider, the skinny teenager was not wearing cleats when he stepped onto the field for an impromptu workout. By the time James finished fielding grounders, the toes of his white Crocs were stained brown by the infield mud, but a path to a bright future had become clear.

"You could tell right away there was a lot of natural ability there, but he was still very raw," Turner said. "Just how fluid he was in his movement and his range and athleticism, I knew if the kid was willing to work at it and had someone to put some attention into his development, he could be a really good player."

"We have kids who come to work out with us when they're 7 or 8 years old and stay until they're 18, and honestly, a lot of them can never develop into what Cam has. You combine that natural ability with his work ethic and willingness to take coaching, and you've got a kid who could realistically become a professional ballplayer. That's the potential Cam has."

Nearly two years later, those traits that Turner and Coach Johnson saw in James — what made him an uncommon talent — have led to a unique opportunity.

On Friday, when James signed with Mississippi Valley State University, he became the first player in Howard's 159-year history to receive a baseball scholarship from an NCAA Division I program. The fact that Mississippi Valley State is also a historically Black university gave added significance to the signing.

"I've been trying to wrap my mind around it," said James, who has played every position on the field during his varsity career but expects to settle in at shortstop at the next level. "I used to walk around the field with Coach Johnson after practice, and one day he said something that made me stop in my tracks. He told me I could be the Reggie White of baseball in our community. That made me realize we actually do need someone to make a difference like that."

White played football at Howard, then the University of Tennessee, before an NFL career that began in Philadelphia, continued in Green Bay, Wisconsin — where he won a Super Bowl — and ended in Charlotte, North Carolina. He died in 2004 and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2006.

"I have heard of Reggie White, of course, but only in stories. Nobody my age actually knew him, so we need a young person to come along and do something to inspire the next generation," James said. "I want to become someone who makes younger kids want to play baseball and see it as a sport that can open up all sorts of opportunities for them. That's what fuels me."

## MINORITY REPORT

Each year, Major League Baseball celebrates Jackie Robinson Day by having every player wear his No. 42 in recognition of the former Brooklyn Dodgers star breaking the color barrier April 15, 1947.

But a growing number of Black youth are passing on America's pastime as the game has experienced a steady drop in the number of American-born Black players over the past 30 years. According to a 2023 report in USA Today, only around 6% of the players (58 of 945) on major league rosters for opening day last year were Black athletes born in the U.S.

That's down from 18% in 1991 and is the smallest percentage since 1955, per a report from The Institute for Diversity and Ethics in Sport. It also pales in comparison to the 57.5% of

players who are white and ranks far below the 31.9% who are Latino.

The 2022 World Series marked the first time since 1950 that no U.S.-born Black players were competing.

The lack of Black players on the field is most commonly attributed to two factors: the lack of quality facilities in inner cities and the soaring cost of playing the sport, particularly the price tag that comes with joining a summer travel team and attending skills camps, where prospects can be discovered either for college scholarships or potentially being selected in the professional draft.

According to multiple parents of Chattanooga-area athletes, the cost to be part of a top-level summer travel team — glove, bat, uniform and other equipment, plus tournament fees — can run an individual player from \$3,000-\$5,000 per season.

The price to attend one-day skills camps, with scouts and coaches watching and where video can be recorded to send to other prospective coaches through social media, runs in the neighborhood of \$1,000.

It was by attending such camps, first a Professional Baseball Instruction camp (an all-day skills and instructional workout at Baylor School) and later a Perfect Game showcase at the East Cobb baseball facility near Atlanta, that James was able to get noticed by college coaches. His impressive workout was posted on social media and noticed by staff members at Mississippi Valley State, who contacted his coaches, leading to the scholarship offer.

With the exception of HBCU programs, only 4% of players making up rosters on the 279 Division I college baseball teams are Black, numbers that highlight the growing disconnect between baseball and Black America.

"The game isn't as available at a younger age to kids in the inner city," said Turner, who coached at Lee University, Carson-Newman and Tennessee Tech before starting eXposure Baseball in 2014. The instructional program has grown to the point that it sponsors more than 30 youth-level teams and has sent more than 500 players to the collegiate ranks.

"The combination of not having as much access to quality facilities and the cost of the game all makes it really tough for kids from low-income families, and that needs to change," Turner added. "If the ballfields in the inner city were fixed up where kids could play on them, that would help create more interest, which would eventually open doors for those kids and improve the sport overall."

"Every kid deserves to have an equal opportunity to train and compete," he said. "They shouldn't be punished just because of where they grow up or attend school."

The process of changing those declining statistics can begin with one person, and James hopes to help initiate that change to open the door for more young Black athletes like him to fall in love with baseball.

"This is way bigger than just for myself," James said. "I already see my little cousins, who had never cared about baseball, showing an interest in playing because of me. And by me having success, it can bring attention to our program and bring more guys like me to play the game."

"It can also show people outside of our community who may be able to help that it's worth stepping up to help kids who look like me get to be more involved in the game. I mean, the best thing to invest your time and money in is people."

## BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

Until spring 2017, the Howard baseball program had become nearly defunct. The facilities were among the worst in the city, and there was a complete lack of interest among students toward even fielding a team. Numerous games had to be forfeited due to the Hustlin' Tigers not having enough players who showed up.

But in January 2017, a group of three senior team leaders, along with Johnson and one assistant coach, began working to change the trajectory of the program. Prior to the season beginning, the 11 team members, plus coaches and community volunteers, worked seven days a week to overhaul the field, replace fencing, build dugouts and bullpens, haul in new infield dirt and even lay sod.

Baseball is a sport defined by the ability to overcome failure, and while the team won just one game in Johnson's first season, the groundwork for something bigger had been laid.

Steady improvement has been shown on the field during the past six seasons, with Howard winning 11 games last year and even holding a lead late against Rhea County for what would have been the Hustlin' Tigers' first district win as a Class 4A program.

The roster size has also expanded from 11 players in Johnson's first year as coach to more than 40 as the team prepares for the new season.

"Baseball was nonexistent in this school," James said. "A lot of people still look down on or overlook Howard baseball. People on the team used to laugh after a loss. I can't stand that. I hate it. If you lose too much, it lights a fire

under you, so by my sophomore year, I had decided to start speaking up to hold my teammates accountable for their effort."

"They keep score for a reason."

What could be just as important for the program's progression as larger roster numbers is seeing a Hustlin' Tigers player earn the chance to play at the next level. It's tangible evidence that the sport can create hope for the future.

That ripple effect of hope actually began last season. As Johnson was taking a sophomore player home, he turned to ask the teen about the noticeable uptick in his effort during that day's team workout.

Asked what prompted the added enthusiasm, the player explained to Johnson: "When I saw Camron get offered a scholarship

to a D-I college, I realized I could do the same thing if I worked hard. I think baseball can get me to college."

The next step toward tapping baseball's potential within Chattanooga's inner city is an ambitious plan to build an indoor workout facility on the Howard campus. The slab of concrete that will serve as the foundation for the 40-by-100-foot structure has already been poured.

The Hustlin' Tigers have raised around \$42,000 of the \$75,000 needed for a facility that would include indoor turf with multiple pitching mounds, seven batting cages plus netting and a weight room with rubber flooring (complete with new weights).

"It's a necessity for player development because it would allow us to maximize practice time by dividing players into groups to get individual work done every day, regardless of whether there is inclement weather," Johnson said. "It would also level the playing field with the other six teams in our district, all of which have similar facilities."

Howard also needs lighting at its baseball field as home games that last past sundown cannot be completed.

"It's embarrassing and very disappointing for our kids when the umpires have to come to us and say the game has to be called because of darkness," Johnson said. "We have a tremendous history in football and basketball at this school, but why not have the opportunities to create a similar story for baseball?"

"What Camron has already accomplished is amazing, but the likelihood of having another kid like that is very slim unless we can provide the facilities to develop players."

## SAFE AT HOME

At just 5-foot-8, 140 pounds, James packs a surprising amount of power — both as a batter and with his arm. His

throws home from the outfield have been clocked at 87 mph.

The featherweight-size ballplayer's love for the game sprouted from a desire to imitate his older brother, who introduced him to baseball when he was 4. From those early days in the Southside Youth program, where James was part of a tiny percentage of American-born Black children ages 6-12 who play organized baseball — 8.4% according to a report from the Sports & Fitness Industry Association — to becoming a varsity starter as a freshman at Howard, he has shown a natural knack for the game.

But it was the meaningful conversation with Turner on that Christmas Eve afternoon that became the life-altering moment that led to an HBCU scholarship and could spread much further than affecting just one player's life.

The word repeated by so many of the family, faculty, coaches and teammates who surrounded James during his scholarship ceremony at Howard on Friday was "proud."

"The more you can create hope in a community's future, the more it will thrive," Turner said. "You could see the light bulb go off for Cam that day we first met. Once we told him he had a chance to be a college prospect, he started to put in the work to pursue that opportunity."

"You know there are other kids who will see him and think, 'If Cam can do it, then I can, too.' And that would create the blueprint to follow. A lot of kids in the inner city need to hear that they have a chance to be good at baseball. What Cam is doing, he's inspiring a lot of kids who wouldn't otherwise realize this was possible in baseball. Really, he's an inspiration for all of Chattanooga."

“He is shining a spotlight on the part of Oglethorpe’s life that most people have kind of thought was just periphery,” said Stan Deaton, senior historian for the Georgia Historical Society. “I think he’s thought deeply about this. And let’s be honest, there have not been many African-Americans who have written about colonial Georgia and particularly about Oglethorpe.”

Though it is Thurmond’s third book about Georgia history, he’s no academic. The son of a sharecropper and great-grandson of a Georgia slave, Thurmond became an attorney and has served for decades in state and local government. His 1998 election as state labor commissioner made Thurmond the first Black candidate to win statewide office in Georgia without first being appointed. He is now the elected CEO of DeKalb County, which includes portions of Atlanta.

His book traces Oglethorpe’s origins as a wealthy Englishman who held a seat in Parliament and served as deputy governor of the slave-trading Royal African Company before departing for America. Thurmond argues that seeing the cruelty of slavery firsthand changed Oglethorpe, who returned to England and shared his views with activists who would become Britain’s first abolitionists.

“What I tried to do is to follow the arc of his life, his evolution and development, and to weigh all of

his achievements, failures and shortcomings,” Thurmond said. “Once you do that, you find that he had a uniquely important life. He helped breathe life into the movement that ultimately destroyed slavery.”

In its early years, Georgia stood alone as Britain’s only American colony in which slavery was illegal. The ban came as the population of enslaved Africans in colonial America was nearing 150,000. Black captives were being sold in New York and Boston, and they already outnumbered white settlers in South Carolina.

Historians have widely agreed Oglethorpe and his fellow Georgia trustees didn’t ban slavery because it was cruel to Black people. They saw slaves as a security risk with Georgia on the doorstep of Spanish Florida, which sought to free and enlist escaped slaves to help fight the British. They also feared slave labor would instill laziness among Georgia’s settlers, who were expected to tend their own modest farms.

It didn’t last. The slave ban was widely ignored when Oglethorpe left Georgia for good in 1743, and its enforcement

dwindled in his absence. By the time American colonists declared independence in 1776, slavery had been legal in Georgia for 25 years. When the Civil War began nearly a century later, Georgia’s enslaved population topped 462,000, more than any U.S. state except Virginia.

“At best, you could say Oglethorpe was naive,” said Gerald Horne, a professor of history and African-American studies at the University of Houston and author of the book “The Counter-Revolution of 1776.” “Almost inevitably, like kudzu in the

summer, slavery started spreading in Georgia.”

Like other historians, Horne is highly skeptical of Oglethorpe being a forefather of the abolitionist movement. He said the Georgia colony ultimately protected slavery in its sister colonies by serving as a “white equivalent of the Berlin Wall” between South Carolina and Spanish Florida.

Oglethorpe used slave labor to help build homes, streets and public squares in Savannah, the colony’s first city. Escaped slaves captured in Oglethorpe’s Georgia were returned to

slaveholders. Some colonists angered by the slave ban made unproven accusations that Oglethorpe had a South Carolina plantation worked by slaves.

Thurmond’s book openly embraces such evidence that Oglethorpe’s history with slavery was at times contradictory and unflattering. That makes his case for Oglethorpe’s evolution even stronger, said James F. Brooks, a University of Georgia history professor who wrote the book’s foreword.

“He has engaged with the historiography in a way that is clearly the equivalent of a professional historian,” Brooks said. “This is good stuff. He’s read everything and thought about it. I don’t see any weakness in it.”

Thurmond’s evidence includes a letter Oglethorpe wrote in 1739 that argues opening Georgia to slavery would “occasion the misery of thousands in Africa.” Thurmond describes how Oglethorpe assisted to two formerly enslaved Black men — Ayuba Suleiman Diallo and Olaudah Equiano — whose travels to England helped stir anti-slavery sentiments among white Europeans.

Oglethorpe befriended white activists who became key figures in England’s abolitionist movement. In a 1776 letter to Granville Sharp, an attorney who fought to help former slaves retain their freedom, Oglethorpe proclaimed “Africa had produced a race of heroes” in its kings and military leaders. He also spent time with the author Hannah More, whose writings called for the abolition of slavery.

The firm was the main occupant of a building owned by a limited liability company of which Frost is the managing member, which put the building up for sale shortly after Croft & Frost abruptly laid off all its staff.

There were interested potential buyers, but they resisted the asking price or feared someone might try to claw back the property in litigation, Jonathan Frost’s real estate agent, Joe Pleva, said by phone.

Foreclosing on a property and bidding for it in a public auction — the means through which, according to the deeds, Jonathan Frost’s parents bought the property — can have the benefit of “curing” a title and eliminating conflicting claims, experts said.

Frost’s father, Steve Frost, did not respond to emailed questions about the sale or what he intends to do with the property just north of Finley Stadium. Jonathan Frost has consistently not responded to efforts by phone and email to get his perspective, including for this article.

## THE LOTS

A listing for the the Chestnut Street property, whose main building says “The Easy” in big letters on the side, promised gorgeous views and luxury. The property consisted of multiple lots with different histories — and different paths into the possession of the elder Frosts.

Jonathan Frost’s Chestnut Holdings LLC purchased the 1413 Chestnut St. lot, the one with the main building, in 2016, according to county records.

In 2019, the firm received a \$6.5 million loan from a bank and put up the property as collateral, records show.

On Nov. 17, 2023, First Horizon Bank, which at that point held the deed of trust — essentially a mortgage — transferred that debt to a limited liability company called Joseph Investments, records show.

Joseph Investments LLC was incorporated in Tennessee days prior, Nov. 14, according to state

records. Its Signal Mountain address is the same as the one listed for Steve and Lisa Frost. The listed agent for the limited liability company is Steve Frost’s attorney, and the property deed lists Steve Frost as the LLC’s president and managing member.

The terms of the debt transfer remain unclear. According to public records, its terms are outlined in a separate contract.

The adjacent lots took a slightly different path. According to a contract filed with the county Sept. 14, they were collateral on a \$1.5 million loan Steve and Lisa Frost made to Chestnut Holdings LLC on June 1, 2023.

## FORECLOSURE

At some point, records show, Chestnut Holdings defaulted on the agreements tied to both of those contracts, according to the deeds filed with the Hamilton County Register of Deeds.

A Chattanooga attorney, Cara Alday, became the “successor trustee” as the property went through a foreclosure sale, according to her law firm’s rendition of events in the contracts.

In the Dec. 22, Dec. 29 and Jan. 5 issues of the Hamilton County Herald, Alday announced a sale would be Jan. 24 at the west door of the Hamilton County Courthouse downtown.

The sale on the main property was held there at 10 a.m., the deed said. With a \$4.6 million offer, Joseph Investments LLC was the “highest and best bidder,” the resulting deed said.

The sale of the adjacent property was held there at 2 p.m., the sale deed said. With a \$1.2 million offer, Steve and Lisa Frost were the “highest and best bidder,” the resulting deed said.

Pleva, the real estate agent, said commercial real estate transactions are often complex. He also said he was surprised to hear the properties sold for so little. He said a lot of people might have said, “If I’d known that, I would have bought it.”

Alday and Steve Frost’s lawyer, Gary Patrick, who are both partners at the Chattanooga law firm

Patrick, Beard, Schulman & Jacoway, did not respond to emails or voicemails left on their phones.

The Chattanooga Times Free Press asked, among other things, when Chestnut Holdings LLC defaulted on its agreements, whether anyone besides his parents made bids on the property and what the purpose of Joseph Investments LLC is. The paper also asked why the elder Frosts acquired their son’s debt, foreclosed on the collateral property and bought it at auction, rather than just buying it directly from him.

## EXPERT ANALYSIS

Jonathan Frost has been named, among many firms like Chestnut Holdings he has a stake in, as a defendant in several lawsuits in which plaintiffs allege some version of neglect, breach of contract, unpaid debts and fraud. They seek damages. Litigation is ongoing, but in the event of an adverse court judgment, as in bankruptcy, someone’s assets can be vulnerable to seizure, Chattanooga attorney Barry Abbott said in a phone interview Friday.

Though that person might be tempted to get rid of those assets to prevent creditors from getting access to it, that is illegal under Tennessee law.

“Before you file bankruptcy, for example, if you said, ‘Oh crap, all my bills are coming due, I’m going to give away all my good stuff to my brother, my sister, my mom and my dad so that they can have it, and I’ll get it back later when I get through the bankruptcy?’” Abbott said. “Well, you can’t do that. You go to jail.”

Similarly, if such a person, seeking to shield assets from creditors, sells their assets for a commercially unreasonable price, creditors could contest the legitimacy of that transaction.

Given all that, a foreclosure can offer legal protection on an asset, Abbott said. In the case of the Chestnut Street property, the sale was publicly advertised and was held, according to the deeds, at the Courthouse door.

“Presumably, that’s going to be fair market sale because anybody with money can come and bid

on the property — and the trustee in a deed of trust is required to sell it to the highest bidder,” Abbott said.

More broadly, foreclosures can have the effect of cleaning up a title to which multiple parties have claims.

“Let’s say there was a deed of trust on it that predated all of those, all those warrants that developed on the property’s title,” Abbott said. “If you foreclose the deed of trust, you wipe out all of the deficiencies to the title. So sometimes

a foreclosure is a little bit like a fresh start.”

# Chaotic US House sees three GOP chairs retire

WASHINGTON — In a single week, the Republican chairs of three House committees announced they would not be seeking reelection, raising questions about whether the chaos that has reigned in this Congress is driving out some of the GOP's top talent.

What makes the retirements particularly noteworthy is that none of the chairs were at risk of losing their position due to the term limits that House Republicans impose on their committee leaders. They conceivably could have returned to the same leadership roles in the next Congress, but chose instead to leave and give up jobs they had worked years to obtain.

"They would clearly rather be home with their family than in Washington with a dysfunctional Congress," said Republican strategist Doug Heye. "I would have said this to you 10 years ago, but it's just gotten worse. Congress has become a bad workplace."

## PURSuing OTHER INTERESTS

Among the three are Reps. Cathy McMorris Rodgers of Washington, Mike Gallagher of Wisconsin and Mark Green of Tennessee.

McMorris Rodgers was the first to announce she would be leaving after four years as the top GOP member on the Energy and Commerce Committee, one of the most prestigious panels on Capitol Hill. Past chairs such as Republican Billy Tauzin helped add prescription drug coverage to the Medicare program, while Democrat Henry Waxman authored the Affordable Care Act, expanding health coverage for millions of Americans.

The second retirement announcement came from the new chair of a special committee focused on China. Gallagher, announced "with a heavy heart," he would not seek reelection.

Gallagher's announcement came days after he voted against impeaching Homeland Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas, frustrating the right flank of the GOP and generating a likely primary challenge. But Gallagher told the local Fox affiliate in his Wisconsin district that he and his wife were thinking about his leaving Congress long before the impeachment vote. He also said the pushback was nothing compared to what he endured when he refused to object to the Electoral College count in 2021.

And, on Wednesday, Rep. Green, now in just his second year as chair of the Homeland Security Committee, announced he would not seek reelection. The

move came one day after he led the Mayorkas impeachment vote on the House floor. He said he wanted to get in front of a pending story about his retirement that had leaked to the press.

Green came the closest to acknowledging the chaos of the last 14 months played a role in his decision.

"Well, the work to productivity ratio may have had a little bit to do with it," Green said.

He said Republicans would have to increase their majority in the House to get anything done.

"So I'm going to go do a few other things," Green said.

## APPEAL OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR

McMorris Rodgers said chairing the Energy and Commerce Committee has been the best position that she's had in her 10 terms in Congress. She said there were a lot of factors in her decision "and it was mostly about my family."

"It was a difficult decision. I've worked very hard and I'm proud of what we accomplished, but for me, this was the time," she said.

Gallagher also said it was time for him to go.

"The framers intended citizens to serve in Congress for a season and then return to their private lives. Electoral politics was never supposed to be a career and, trust me, Congress is no place to grow old. And so, with a heavy heart, I have decided not to run for reelection," Gallagher said.

Rep. Frank Lucas, R-Okla., said he believes the exodus includes the possibility that Republicans could be serving in the minority next year if they lose the House in the November election.

"Who wants to finish your career here in the minority?" Lucas said. "It's also a frustration with the difficulty of legislating at this time because of issues within factions and the balanced nature of the House membership."

He also noted there's been no cost-of-living adjustment for lawmakers. At \$174,000 a year, they make the same wage they did 15 years ago.

"Most of these members are experienced people on really important, relevant committees, and the outside world realizes their skill sets, and they're probably trying to pull them," he said.

## UNFORTUNATE BUT CONSEQUENTIAL

Lucas, who chairs the House Science, Space and Technology Committee, said he's not considering stepping

down any time soon. He recalled how former Rep. Don Young of Alaska, the longest serving Republican member in the House before his death in 2022, admonished him during a particularly tough day.

"He looks me in the eye and says, 'Lucas, people like you and I were here when this place still worked. We can't leave because if you leave before we get back to that point, some of these underclassmen don't have a clue about how things are supposed to happen, how to do anything,'" Lucas said.

Rep. Byron Donalds, R-Fla., had a different take, saying the turnover is actually a good thing for the House. He said members of Congress are isolated because they go from meeting to meeting and from dinners to conferences.

"We're not living normal lives. I think having fresh perspectives come in is the best thing for the system," Donalds said.

Rep. Pete Aguilar, the chair of the House Democratic Caucus, called McMorris Rodgers and Gallagher "serious legislators who want to make things right."

"It's pretty clear, if you're holding a gavel and to say you're leaving, and you're not term-limited, I think it speaks volumes for where their side of the chamber is. And it's unfortunate, but that's where we are," Aguilar said.

## 'GREENER PASTURES'

The number of lawmakers retiring at the end of this term or seeking higher office stands at 44, with Democrats making up 23 of those members and Republicans 21. Republican Rep. Richard Hudson, the chair of the House Republican campaign arm, said all of the GOP members leaving are in safe Republican seats, but that some of the Democratic retirements would lead to "flips for us."

"I'm not concerned about it," Hudson said.

Heye, the Republican strategist, said the retirements of McMorris Rodgers, Green and Gallagher wouldn't make sense in normal times.

"It just makes sense in this current context of a broken Congress that can't do the good, normal work that it should be doing," Heye said.

He also doubted they would have many regrets about leaving.

"Every ex-member you talk to who is of some import, they're all happier now," Heye said. "They all see greener pastures now."

# Far right tests US House Speaker over Ukraine aid

WASHINGTON — When Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy spoke with congressional leaders in Washington late last year he told them privately what is now public: With U.S. weapons, they could win the war against Russia, but without them Russian President Vladimir Putin would be victorious.

In a subsequent meeting with new House Speaker Mike Johnson, a looming deadline for the supplies came into focus.

Now, with U.S. aid for Ukraine teetering in Congress, it's up to Johnson to decide what happens next.

The Republican's leadership will determine whether the House will approve more aid for Ukraine or allow the U.S. commitment to wither.

"We have to help now," President Joe Biden implored Congress on Friday from the White House.

And Zelenskyy said Saturday at a news conference with Vice President Kamala Harris in Germany that Ukraine was counting on a "positive decision" from Congress for the "vital" aid from its "strategic partner."

The political and policy decisions ahead

in Congress are gravely uncertain. Johnson is insisting he won't be "rushed" into approving the \$95.3 billion foreign aid package from the Senate, despite overwhelming support from most Democrats and almost half the Republicans. But he has yet to chart a path forward in his chamber.

While many in Congress view Putin as a global threat, particularly after Russia intervened in the 2016 election in favor of Donald Trump, Johnson's colleagues on the far right are increasingly ambivalent about Putin's aggression and authoritarian leadership.

Even the sudden death of Alexei Navalny, the most famous political prisoner in Russia and Putin's biggest rival, did not appear to move the House speaker Friday to commit to support for Ukraine.

"As Congress debates the best (way) to support Ukraine, (we) must be using every means available to cut off Putin's ability to fund his unprovoked war in Ukraine and aggression against the Baltic states," Johnson, R-La., said in a statement.

Just months on the job, the new speaker is prone to dithering on big questions

of the day as he tries to unite his deeply fractured but paper-thin House GOP majority, which is filled with up-and-coming figures challenging his leadership and, at times, threatening his ouster.

In one of his first interviews since taking the gavel in October, Johnson told Fox News' Sean Hannity that Congress was "not going to abandon" Ukraine.

But in the months since, Johnson's bottom-up leadership style, in which he tries to hear out all comers, has created a leadership vacuum on Ukraine aid that others are increasingly willing and able to fill.

Republican Rep. Matt Gaetz of Florida, a Trump ally who opposes more aid to Ukraine, said he hopes to lead a new generation of Republican lawmakers eager to turn away from traditional GOP interventionism around the world.

Gaetz said he believes additional U.S. military aid for Ukraine risks escalating the conflict in ways potentially harmful to Americans.

"And I think that is a lot more significant to my constituents than which dude gets to run Crimea," Gaetz said, referring to the region

Russia has claimed from Ukraine as its own.

If the \$95 billion aid package was put to a vote, Johnson would find overwhelming support in the House from a coalition of Democrats and Republicans. Anchoring the package is \$61 billion for Ukraine, mainly in the form of military equipment from the U.S. It also sends foreign assistance and humanitarian aid to Israel, Gaza and allies in the Indo-Pacific region, including Taiwan.

"There is only Plan A, which is to ensure that Ukraine receives what it needs," Harris said alongside Zelenskyy in Munich. She added "we must be unwavering and we cannot play political games."

Biden and the Democratic congressional leaders are imploring the speaker to cast off his right wing and join forces with them to send a sweeping bipartisan message of U.S. leadership in supporting Ukraine and confirming the U.S. commitment to its allies around the world, especially as Trump criticizes the NATO alliance.

"House Republicans can either choose America's national security interests or choose Vladimir Putin and Russia — that is not a difficult choice," House Democratic leader Hakeem Jeffries said after speaking

with Johnson midweek.

"The national security bill should be put on the floor for an up or down vote, and it will pass with overwhelming support from Democrats and Republicans," Jeffries said.

But for Johnson, eyeing his own political future, the choices are different. If he reaches across the aisle to Democrats for a partnership, he is likely to face immediate calls for his ouster. That's what happened when the far right booted his predecessor, former GOP Rep. Kevin McCarthy, after he joined forces with Democrats to pass legislation last fall to keep the federal government from shutting down.

## Use of health data for anti-abortion ad draws concerns

Some state governments and federal regulators were already moving to keep individuals' reproductive health information private when a U.S. senator's report last week offered a new jolt, describing how cellphone location data was used to send millions of anti-abortion ads to people who visited Planned Parenthood offices.

Federal law bars medical providers from sharing health data without a patient's consent but doesn't prevent digital tech companies from tracking menstrual cycles or an individual's location and selling it to data brokers.

Legislation for federal bans have never gained momentum, largely because of opposition from the tech industry.

Whether that should change has become another political fault line in a nation where most Republican-controlled states have restricted abortion — including 14 with bans in place at every stage of pregnancy — and most Democratic ones have sought to protect access since the U.S. Supreme Court in 2022 overturned Roe v. Wade.

Abortion rights advocates fear that if such data is not kept private, it could be used not only in targeted ads but also in law enforcement investigations or by abortion opponents looking to harm those who seek to end pregnancies.

"It isn't just sort of creepy," said Washington state Rep. Vandana Slatter, the sponsor of a law her

state adopted last year to rein in unauthorized use of health information. "It's actually harmful."

But so far, there's no evidence of widespread use of this kind of data in law enforcement investigations.

"We're generally talking about a future risk, not something that's happening on the ground yet," said Albert Fox Cahn, executive director of the Surveillance Technology Oversight Project and an advocate of protections.

The report last week from Sen. Ron Wyden, an Oregon Democrat, showed the biggest known anti-abortion ad campaign directed to people who had been identified as having visited abortion providers.

Wyden's investigation found the information gathered by a now-defunct data broker called Near Intelligence was used by ads from The Veritas Society, a nonprofit founded by Wisconsin Right to Life. The ads targeted people who visited 600 locations in 48 states from 2019 through 2022. There were more than 14 million ads in Wisconsin alone.

Wyden called on the Federal Trade Commission to intervene in the bankruptcy case for Near to make sure the location information collected on Americans is destroyed and not sold to another data broker. He's also asking the Securities Exchange Commission to investigate whether the company committed securities fraud by making misleading statements to investors about the senator's investigation.

## Trump avoids the worst fraud case outcome, but incurs large penalties

NEW YORK — A New York judge Friday spared the ex-president the worst case punishment as he ruled in a case alleging Donald Trump fraudulently misrepresented financial figures to get cheaper loans and other benefits.

Still, Trump got slammed hard, facing big cash penalties, outside supervision of his companies and restrictions on his borrowing.

In a pretrial ruling last year, the same judge threatened to shut down much of the Republican presidential front-runner's business by calling for the "dissolution" of corporate entities that hold many of his marquee properties.

But New York Supreme Court Judge Arthur Engoron called off the dissolution.

Instead, he said the court would appoint two monitors to oversee the Trump Organization to make sure it doesn't continue to submit false figures.

In his ruling, Engoron banned Trump from serving as an officer or director

in any New York corporation for three years, prohibited him from taking out loans with New York banks and said his company and other defendants have to pay hundreds of millions of dollars in fines.

Here is how the decision is likely to affect his business:

**CASH DRAIN**

This is possibly the worst hit from the ruling.

Trump and his businesses will have to pay \$355 million for "ill gotten gains." Trump's sons, Eric and Donald Trump Jr., were ordered to pay \$4 million each. Trump's former chief financial officer was ordered to pay \$1 million, for a total judgment of \$364 million.

The penalties will slam Trump's finances at a moment he is facing other steep legal bills stemming from several criminal cases.

Trump is also required to pay interest from the dates when he received benefits from his alleged fraud. That so-called pre-judgement interest adds another \$100 million to Trump's bills, according to New York's

attorney general.

**THREE-YEAR BAN**

The ban on Trump serving as an officer or director for a New York corporation suggests a big shakeup at the Trump Organization.

Trump may be removed from the corner office, but as an owner of the business his right to appoint someone to act on his behalf has not been revoked.

Two obvious candidates to help Trump maintain control, his two adult sons, are already off-limits. The judge's ruling barred Donald Jr. and Eric from being officers of New York companies for two years.

**BUSINESS LOANS**

Trump is also banned from getting loans from New York-chartered banks, a potentially devastating blow given so many major lenders are based in the city.

Luckily for Trump, he has cut his debt by hundreds of millions in recent years and so won't need to refinance as much. He also has pushed out the maturity of many loans still on the books by several years.

## Effects of GOP diversity ban begin to appear

AUSTIN, Texas — The dim lighting and vacant offices were the first clues.

Other changes struck Nina Washington, a senior at the University of Texas, when she returned to her favorite study spot from winter break. The words "Multicultural Center" had been taken off the wall, erasing an effort begun in the late 1980s to serve historically marginalized communities on campus.

The center's staff members were gone, its student groups dissolved.

"Politics, behaviors and emotions are returning to the old ways," said Washington, who as a Black woman found a sense of community at the center.

The void in the heart of the nearly 52,000-student campus is one of many changes rippling across

college campuses in Texas, where one of the nation's most sweeping bans on diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives took effect Jan. 1.

At least five other states have passed their own bans, and Republican lawmakers in at least 19 states are pursuing various restrictions on diversity initiatives, an issue they hope will mobilize their voters this election year.

With more than 600,000 students enrolled at more than 30 public universities across the state, the rollout in Texas offers a large-scale glimpse of what lies ahead for public higher education without the initiatives designed to make minorities feel less isolated and white students more prepared for careers that require working effectively

with people of different backgrounds.

At the University of Texas' flagship campus in Austin, the state's second-most populous public university, only 4.5% of the student population is Black and 25.2% is Hispanic, numbers some students fear will drop as they struggle to adjust in an atmosphere of fear about what they can say and do.

The law signed by Republican Gov. Greg Abbott bans public higher education institutions from influencing hiring practices with respect to race, sex, color or ethnicity, and prohibits promoting "differential" or "preferential" treatment or "special" benefits for people based on these categories. Also forbidden are training and activities conducted "in reference to race, color, ethnicity, gender identity, or sexual orientation."

# Christian-nation idea fuels US conservative causes

Historians say that misreads founders' intent

The U.S. Constitution doesn't mention Christianity or any specific religion. The Declaration of Independence famously proclaims that people's rights come from a "Creator" and "Nature's God" — but doesn't specify who that is. Yet large numbers of Americans believe the founders intended the U.S. to be a Christian nation, and many believe it should be one. Such views are especially strong among Republicans and their white evangelical base. Already such views are being voiced by supporters of Donald Trump amid his bid to recapture the presidency. The idea of a Christian America means different things to different people. Pollsters have found a wide circle of Americans who hold general God-and-country sentiments. But within that is a smaller, hardcore group who also check other boxes in surveys — such as that the U.S. Constitution was inspired by God and that the federal government should declare the U.S. a Christian nation, advocate Christian values or stop enforcing the separation of church and state.

**CHRISTIAN NATIONALISM**

For those embracing that package of beliefs, it's more likely they'll have unfavorable views toward immigrants, dismiss or downplay the effect of anti-Black discrimination and believe Trump was a good or great president, according to a 2021 Pew Research Center survey. That latter group

reflects a movement widely called Christian nationalism, which fuses American and Christian values, symbols and identity and seeks to privilege Christianity in public life. The idea of Christian nationhood fills Americans' need for an origin story, a belief that "we've come here for something special, and that we're here for God's work," said Eric McDaniel, an associate professor of government at the University of Texas. It creates a sense of "national innocence," so adherents resist confronting uglier parts of U.S. history, he said. The belief connects to other beliefs past and present, from the Manifest Destiny doctrine that justified continental conquest to Trump's America First and Make America Great Again slogans, said McDaniel, a co-author of "The Everyday Crusade: Christian Nationalism in American Politics." Trump has echoed some of these ideas, vowing to bar immigrants who "don't like our religion." Many conservatives and Republicans embrace the idea of Christian national origins, even as many reject the "Christian nationalist" label. Republican House Speaker Mike Johnson has proclaimed that America is and was founded as a Christian nation and that Thomas Jefferson was "divinely inspired" in his writing of the Declaration of Independence, according to a 2015 sermon that drew wider attention with his recent election as speaker. WallBuilders, an organization Johnson credits for its "profound influence" on him, has spread materials claiming "revisionist" historians have downplayed America's Christian origins, but the

group has been widely criticized for historically dubious claims. A lawsuit on its behalf is challenging the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority's refusal to run its bus ads touting the purported beliefs of founders. Vocal supporters of Trump have described current politics as spiritual warfare for the destiny of a country that former Trump aide Steve Bannon described as the "New Jerusalem" and conservative activist Charlie Kirk said was founded by "courageous Bible-believing Christians."

**JUDEO-CHRISTIAN PRINCIPLES**

Recent Texas, Oklahoma and Kentucky Republican Party platforms proclaim the country was founded on "Judeo-Christian" principles. The Rev. Robert Jeffress, pastor of First Baptist Church of Dallas, said he doesn't identify as a Christian nationalist, but does believe America was founded as a Christian nation. "I'm not claiming that all of our founders were Christians," he said in an interview. "Some were deists, some were atheists, but the majority were Christians. I'm also not saying that non-Christians shouldn't have the same rights as Christians in our country." But he said "there's a case to be made that the Judeo-Christian faith was the foundation for our laws and many of our principles." He cited founder John Jay — the first Supreme Court chief justice — asserting it was Americans' duty "in our Christian nation, to select and prefer Christians for their rulers." Jeffress said he doesn't believe America is privileged by God but, as with any nation, "God will continue to bless America to the extent that we follow him." Anthea Butler, chair of religious studies at the University of Pennsylvania, said history precludes any idea of a Christian nation. "It doesn't mean that

Christians weren't a part of the founding of this nation," said Butler, a historian of African American and American religion. "What it does mean is that if you believe that America is a Christian nation and you happen to subscribe to Christian nationalism as a part of that, you're buying into a myth." That America-as-a-Christian-nation idea is "a trope of exclusion," she said, centering American history on white Anglo-Saxon Protestants as "the ones that are willing and should be running the country both then and now." That justifies viewing others as "heathens," including the enslaved Blacks and the Native Americans whose land was being taken.

**ADVANCING AGENDAS**

Those arguing for a Christian America are generally not historians and not really talking about history — they're talking politics, said John Fea, author of the 2011 book "Was America Founded as a Christian Nation?"

"They appeal to a false view of the founding, or at least a partial view of the founding, to advance political agendas of the present," said Fea, a history professor at Messiah University, a Christian university in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. "These agendas are built on a very weak historical foundation." The belief in America's Christian origins is mainstream. Six in 10 U.S. adults said the founders intended America to be a Christian nation, according to a 2022 Pew Research Center survey. About 45% said the U.S. should be a Christian nation. Four in five white evangelical Protestants agreed with each assertion. By some measures, Democratic President Joe Biden might be seen in that category, citing the importance of his Catholic faith and calling for God's blessings on America and its troops — but also invoking shared values "whether you're Christian, whether you're Jewish, Hindu, Muslim, Buddhist, or any other faith, or no faith at all." One-third of U.S. adults surveyed in 2023 said God intended America to be a promised land for European Christians to set an example to the world, according to a Public Religion Research Institute (PRRI)/Brookings report. Such surveys have found a smaller, more ardent group of believers in Christian nationhood. In another survey, PRRI identified about 10% of Americans as the most committed adherents. The Constitution prohibits any religious test for office, and its First Amendment bars congressional establishment of any religion, along with guaranteeing free exercise of religion.

# Female members of WWII group move into the spotlight

DALLAS — After World War II, the U.S. Army’s art experts set out to find and return millions of works stolen by the Nazis. Known as the Monuments Men, they included Mary Regan Quessenberry, who from her base in Berlin traveled to examine stolen works, tracked looting cases and investigated suspicious art dealers.

Decades later, Quessenberry and the other female members are getting recognition.

The Dallas-based foundation honoring the group updated its name in recent years to recognize their contributions, highlighted their work in a new exhibit at a national museum, and is set to publish for the first time in English a memoir in which one of the women describes spying on the Nazis while working at a Paris museum.

“The Monuments Men were not all men,” said Anna Bottinelli, president of the Monuments Men and Women Foundation.

The Allied armies’ Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives section included 27 women and about 320 men during and just after WWII. The Army recently revived the concept, with the first new class of monuments officers graduating in 2022.

When battles raged during WWII, it was the men who protected works of art and architectural treasures. The women entered the picture after the war, when the focus turned to restitution.

It’s a pivot that the foundation also has made since Dallas-based author Robert Edsel founded it nearly 20 years ago with a focus on the war years. Edsel made the monuments officers a household name, writing books including “The Monuments Men,” which was made into a 2014 movie starring George Clooney and Matt Damon.

As the years passed, the

foundation became increasingly involved in restitution, from helping return works taken during the war to producing a pack of playing cards featuring still-missing works.

“As our mission evolved and as our work developed, then it became really natural to focus more on the postwar efforts, and as a result on the women,” Bottinelli said.

A permanent exhibit on the monuments officers that is part of a new addition to the National WWII Museum in New Orleans opened in November. The Monuments Men and Women Gallery includes a recreation of a salt mine where monuments officers found stolen art.

The exhibit also features the story of Quessenberry, who enlisted in what became the Women’s Army Corps when the U.S. entered the war. After the Allied victory in Europe, she learned the Army was looking for art experts. Quessenberry, who had a master’s degree in art history, jumped at the chance.

When she arrived in Berlin, she was greeted by Lt. Col. Mason Hammond, a Harvard University classics professor she knew from her studies at Radcliffe College, which later merged with Harvard.

“He opened the door ... recognized her and threw his arms around her and said, ‘Mary, thank God you’re here,’” Edsel said.

She returned to the U.S. as a major in 1948.

Quessenberry’s friend, Ken Scott, said she described her time as a monuments officer as “the most thrilling time of her life.” He said she was “gleeful” when Edsel traveled to Massachusetts to interview her a few years before her death in 2010 at the age of 94.

“She was an absolute pistol as they would say, just full of stories,” Edsel said.

Making sure women got the

recognition they deserved was important to Quessenberry. “She was very strong and vocal about it,” Scott said.

This fall, the foundation will publish Rose Valland’s memoir. In “The Art Front,” originally published in French in 1961, Valland, a French art expert who became a monuments officer, writes about secretly tracking where stolen works were shipped after the Nazis based their looting operation out of the Paris museum where she worked.

“It was thanks to her notes and all of her spying that then when the Allies entered Paris in 1944 they were then able to trace the steps of where this art had been taken and who it belonged to,” Bottinelli said.

Valland, who inspired the role played by Cate Blanchett in the “The Monuments Men” movie, died at 81 in 1980.

Edsel said the last working WWII-era monuments officer was a woman. After operations wound down around 1950, Ardelia Hall carried on the mission into the early 1960s from the State Department, keeping a list of still-missing works and urging museums and art dealers to be on the lookout. A woman, Capt. Edith Standen, also had the forethought while in post-war Germany to record all of her fellow monuments officers’ names, he said.

The Army’s first class of the new monuments officers, called heritage and preservation officers, graduated in the summer of 2022.

Among them was Capt. Jessica Wagner, who has worked at museums across the U.S. She said being a part of the new version of the group she’d studied while getting her master’s degree “feels a little bit surreal.”

“You always ask yourself the question: Would I be willing to go and do that? I guess the answer is yes,” Wagner said.

# Tribes battle a disastrous opioid crisis. Will a multimillion-dollar bill help?

BELLINGHAM, Wash. — Evelyn Jefferson walks deep into a forest dotted with the tents of unhoused Lummi Nation tribal members and calls out names.

When someone appears, she and a nurse hand out the opioid overdose reversal medication naloxone.

Jefferson, a tribal member herself, knows how critical those kits are: Just five months ago, her own son died of an overdose from a synthetic opioid that’s about 100 times more potent than fentanyl. The 37-year-old’s death was the fourth related to opioids in four days on the reservation.

“It took us eight days to bury him because we had to wait in line, because there were so many funerals in front of his,” said Jefferson, crisis outreach supervisor for Lummi Nation. “Fentanyl has really taken a generation from this tribe.”

A bill before the Washington Legislature would bring more federal funding to tribes like Lummi that are trying to keep opioids from taking the next generation too. The state Senate unanimously

approved a bill last week that is expected to provide nearly \$8 million total each year for the 29 federally recognized tribes in Washington, funds drawn in part from a roughly half-billion-dollar settlement between the state and major opioid distributors.

The approach comes as Native Americans and Alaska Natives in Washington die of opioid overdoses at five times the state average, according to 2021-2022 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention data that includes provisional numbers. The rate in Washington is one of the highest in the U.S. and more than three times the rate nationwide — but many of the Indigenous nations in the state lack the funding or medical resources to fully address it.

Lummi Nation, like many tribes, faces an additional challenge when it comes to keeping outside drug dealers off their land: A complicated jurisdictional maze means tribal police often can’t arrest non-tribal members on the reservation.

“What do we do when we have a non-Lummi, predatory drug dealer on our reservation with fentanyl, driving around or on their property and are selling

drugs?” said Anthony Hillaire, tribal chair.

Against the backdrop, tribes such as the Lummi Nation, about 100 miles north of Seattle, say the proposed funding — while appreciated — would barely scratch the surface. The tribe of about 5,300 people on the shores of the Salish Sea has already suffered nearly one overdose death a week this year.

Lummi Nation needs \$12 million to fully finance a 16-bed, secure medical detox facility that incorporates the tribe’s culture, Hillaire said, and money to construct a new counseling center after damage from flooding. Those costs alone far exceed the annual total that would be designated for tribes under the legislation. The Senate has proposed allotting \$12 million in its capital budget to the facility.

“We’re a sovereign nation. We’re a self-governed tribe. We want to take care of ourselves because we know how to take care of ourselves,” he said. “And so we usually just need funding and law changes — good policies.”

# Cyberattacks on hospitals likely to increase

WASHINGTON — Cybersecurity experts are warning that hospitals around the country are at risk for attacks like the one that is crippling operations at a premier Midwestern children’s hospital, and that the U.S. government is doing too little to prevent such breaches.

Hospitals in recent years have shifted their use of online technology to support everything from telehealth to medical devices to patient records. Today, they are a favorite target for internet thieves who hold systems’ data and networks hostage for hefty ransoms, said John Riggi, the American Hospital Association’s cybersecurity adviser.

“Unfortunately, the unintended consequence of the use of all this network and internet connected technology is it expanded our digital attack surface,” Riggi said. “So, many more opportunities for bad guys to penetrate our networks.”

The assailants often operate from American adversaries such as Russia, North Korea and Iran, where they enjoy big payouts from their victims and face little prospect of ever being punished.

In November, a ransomware attack on a health care chain

that operates 30 hospitals and 200 health facilities in the United States forced doctors to divert patients from emergency rooms and postpone elective surgeries. Meanwhile, a rural Illinois hospital announced it was permanently closing last year because it couldn’t recover financially from a cyberattack. And hackers went as far as posting photos and patient information of breast cancer patients who were receiving treatment at a Pennsylvania health network after the system was hacked last year.

Now, one of the top children’s hospitals in the country, the Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children’s Hospital of Chicago, has been forced to put its phone, email and medical record systems offline as it battles a cyberattack. The FBI has said it is investigating.

Brett Callow, an analyst for the cybersecurity firm Emsisoft, counted 46 cyberattacks on hospitals last year, compared with 25 in 2022. The paydays for criminals have gotten bigger too, with the average payout jumping from \$5,000 in 2018 to \$1.5 million last year.

“Unless governments do something more meaningful, more significant than they have done to date, it’s inevitable that it’ll get worse,” Callow said.

# Stingray without a male companion has become pregnant

Charlotte, a rust-colored stingray the size of a serving platter, has spent much of her life gliding around the confines of a storefront aquarium in North Carolina’s Appalachian Mountains.

She’s 2,300 miles from her natural habitat under the waves off southern California. And she hasn’t shared a tank of water with a male of her species in at least eight years.

And yet nature has found a way, the aquarium’s owner said: The stingray is pregnant with as many as four pups and could give birth in the next two weeks.

“Here’s our girl saying, ‘Hey, Happy Valentine’s Day! Let’s have some pups!’” said Brenda Ramer, executive director of the Aquarium and Shark Lab on Main Street in downtown Hendersonville.

An expert on the stingrays

said it would have been impossible for Charlotte to have mated with one of the five small sharks that share her tank, despite news reports suggesting that was the case after Ramer joked about a possible interspecies hookup.

The small aquarium is run by Ramer’s educational nonprofit, Team ECCO, which encourages local schoolchildren and others to take an interest in science.

Its biggest lesson now is on the process of parthenogenesis: a type of asexual reproduction in which offspring develop from unfertilized eggs, meaning there is no genetic contribution by a male.

The mostly rare phenomenon can occur in some insects, fish, amphibians, birds and reptiles, but not mammals. Documented examples have included California condors, Komodo dragons and yellow-bellied water snakes.

# Reports of Lyme disease swelled almost 70% in 2022

NEW YORK — Lyme disease cases in the U.S. jumped nearly 70% in 2022, which health officials say is not due to a major increase of new infections but instead a change in reporting requirements.

Reported cases surpassed 62,000 in 2022, after averaging about 37,000 a year from 2017 through 2019, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said in a report released Thursday. Numbers for 2023 will be released later this year.

Lyme disease is the most common tick-borne infection in the U.S., occurring mostly in the Northeast, Midwest and mid-Atlantic states. An estimated 476,000 Americans are diagnosed with it each year, but only a fraction are officially reported.

Traditionally, health departments received positive lab tests and went back to doctor’s offices to gather more information about the patients. But reporting fell off in 2020 and 2021 when health department staffers were busy working on COVID-19.

# Census Bureau seeks a sensitive way to inquire about gender identity

The U.S. Census Bureau is thinking about how to ask about sex. People have opinions. Dozens of health officials, civil rights groups, individuals and businesses have weighed in about how the statistical agency should ask about sexual orientation and gender identity for the first time on its most comprehensive survey of American life. An Associated Press review of the 91 written public comments posted last month shows them to be largely supportive of the proposed additions, though not without constructive criticism. The proposed questions geared toward people age 15 and older will be tested sometime this year. If given final approval, they would be the first to directly ask about those topics on the American Community Survey, which already asks about commuting times, internet access, family life, income, education levels, disabilities and military service, for example. Many who submitted public comments said the proposed questions will provide a better understanding of the diversity of LGBTQ+ people in the United States at a time when state legislatures are limiting what can be

discussed about LGBTQ+ issues in public schools and are moving to restrict the ability of transgender people to change their driver's licenses and birth certificates. "The currently too-limited data resources stand in stark contrast to the numerous policy debates and legislative efforts focused on these populations," said Gary Gates, a retired demographer who studied LGBTQ+ issues at UCLA. Gates, however, objected to wording that would allow someone to answer, "Straight, that is not gay" for the sexual orientation question. "The phrase is patently offensive," Gates wrote. "Not being gay is hardly an accurate definition of a straight identity. ... Why emphasize that they specifically are not gay? It is simply not an adequate description of straight identity." The questions should reflect the constantly changing language describing sexual orientation and gender identity particularly among young people, and some non-English speakers may not understand terms like "heterosexual," said David Ernesto Munar, president and CEO of Howard Brown Health, which provides health care services to the LGBTQ+ community in Chicago.

# Dandelions, shrubs to replace rubber, new grains and more

Katrina Cornish spends her days raising dandelions and desert shrubs. She harvests the stretchy rubber substances they produce and uses special machines to dip them into condoms, medical gloves and parts for trachea tubes. And she thinks those products could forever alter the landscape of agriculture in the United States. Cornish, a professor at Ohio State University who studies rubber alternatives, isn't the only one pouring energy into alternative crops like that desert shrub, guayule, or the rubber dandelions that bloom with yellow petals in the greenhouse where Cornish works. In Arizona, too, guayule thrives amidst drought, its blue-green leaves set apart from dry dirt at a research and development farm operated by the tire company Bridgestone. And in Nebraska and other parts of the central U.S., green grasses of sorghum spring up, waving with reddish clusters of grains. They're not the corn, soybeans, wheat or cotton that have dominated those areas for decades. Instead, they're crops that many companies, philanthropic organizations and national and international entities tout as promising alternatives to fight climate change. But while some researchers and farmers are optimistic about the potential of those crops, many of which are more water-efficient and important in certain parts of the world to fight hunger, they also say drastic changes would need to happen in markets and processing before we ever see fields full of those out-of-the-box plants or many products in stores made with them, especially in the United States. Most rubber processing happens overseas, and the U.S. isn't prepared to process rubber domestically. But Cornish also said the threats of disease, climate change and international trade tensions also mean that it would be a smart investment to

work on growing and processing domestic alternatives. With sorghum, too, grown for people to eat as well as for farm animals or even pet food, processing would need to be scaled up, said Nate Blum, chief executive officer of Sorghum United, an international non-governmental organization focused on spreading awareness about sorghum. Though the U.S. is the world's largest producer of sorghum, it still represents only a small fraction of acres grown compared to commodity crops like corn and soybeans. And though corn and soybeans are heavily incentivized in the U.S., Blum is hopeful that consumer demand will encourage more investment in the sorghum and millets industry. However, farmers are more likely to plant whatever crops get subsidies, said James Gerber, a senior scientist with climate solutions nonprofit Project Drawdown. Gerber, who recently published a paper in Nature Food about which crops will continue to see yield growth and which may stagnate in the coming years, said comparing sorghum production in India and the U.S. illustrates that principle. India has invested heavily in improving sorghum yields there, but the U.S. has not, he said. Still, Blum thinks there are real

benefits to pursue with sorghum, and perhaps more urgent benefits in other parts of the world than in the U.S. On the heels of last year, when the U.N.'s Food and Agriculture Organization declared a focus on millets including sorghum, Blum thinks there's still much more to be done. "The end of the international year is not the end. It's actually just the beginning," he said. With climate change bearing down on agriculture around the world, the need for crops that can withstand extreme weather like persistent drought is especially important in parts of sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia where smallholder farmers rely on just a few acres of land. Some of the breeding programs for those crops are based in the U.S., but they are much less frequently included in the American diet or lifestyle. That's why specialty markets will be critical if those crops have any hope of taking off here, Cornish said. She thinks that, just as Tesla opened up the possibility of mainstream electric cars by first marketing the product as a luxury good, premium goods like condoms, trachea tube parts and radiation-rated surgical gloves need to be made with dandelion and guayule to inspire producers to grow more meaningful amounts of either of those crops.

# A look at what didn't happen last week

A roundup of some of the most popular but completely untrue stories and visuals of the week. None of these are legit, even though they were shared widely on social media. The Associated Press checked them out.

## POSTS SHARE FALSE INFORMATION ABOUT PARADE SHOOTING

**CLAIM:** A 44-year-old migrant named Sahil Omar was identified as one of the shooters at the Kansas City Chiefs' Super Bowl parade Wednesday.

**THE FACTS:** Three juveniles were detained and one was later released in the investigation into the shooting that broke out at the conclusion of parade festivities outside historic Union Station, police said. The name Sahil Omar along with the same description has been used before on social media to make similar erroneous claims in connection with a January explosion in Fort Worth, Texas, and a December shooting in Las Vegas.

Social media users began sharing information that falsely pinned the violence on a 44-year-old migrant living in the country illegally following the shooting that left a mother of two dead and 22 injured at the end of the parade celebrating the Chiefs' Super Bowl win.

"At least one of the Kansas City Chiefs parade shooters identified as Sahil Omar, a 44-year-old illegal immigrant," reads one post on social media that had received approximately 24,000 likes and 11,700 shares as of Thursday before it was deleted. "Biden has failed to protect America from invasion and terrorism."

Kansas City Police Chief Stacey Graves said at a news conference Thursday that three people had been detained as part of an investigation into the shooting, including two juveniles. The third person, who was later identified as a juvenile, was released. No further information was released pending further investigation.

"The ID of anyone arrested only becomes

public record together with any criminal charges," Officer Alayna Gonzalez, a spokesperson for the Kansas City Police Department, told The Associated Press in an email. "There have not been any criminal charges at this time."

Graves added at the news conference that "preliminary investigative findings have shown there was no nexus to terrorism or home-grown violent extremism."

Social media users also falsely blamed a massive explosion in January at the Sandman Signature Hotel in Fort Worth, Texas, as well as a shooting in December at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, on a 44-year-old migrant named Sahil Omar.

No suspect was sought in relation to the Fort Worth explosion, police told the AP at the time. Authorities said the blast had "characteristics of a natural gas explosion," but that the cause was still under investigation.

The actual suspect in the Las Vegas attack, who died in a shootout with law enforcement, was identified by police as Anthony Polito, a long-time business professor who had unsuccessfully

applied for several jobs at various colleges and universities in Nevada.

## CHURCH SHOOTER HAS NOT BEEN IDENTIFIED AS TRANSGENDER

**CLAIM:** The shooter who carried out an attack injuring two people at a Texas megachurch Feb. 11 has been identified as transgender.

**THE FACTS:** Houston police said Monday that its investigation has thus far determined the shooter, Genesse Ivonne Moreno, identified as female despite using multiple aliases, including the name Jeffery — or Jeffrey — Escalante. Multiple court records identify Moreno as female, most recently in 2022.

Amid the aftermath of the Feb. 11, shooting at Lakewood Church, which is led by televangelist pastor Joel Osteen, social media users spread false claims about Moreno's gender identity.

"BREAKING: Lakewood Church shooter identified as transgender, legal name Genesse Moreno but went by the name 'Jeffrey,'" reads one post on social media that had received approximately 9,300 likes and

6,200 shares as of Friday.

Others claimed Moreno, who was fatally shot in an exchange of gunfire, had been born as Jeffery, but went by Genesse as part of her transition.

Officials have not found any evidence that Moreno was transgender. Police said she used male and female aliases, but that investigators who looked at past police reports determined she identified as female.

"We do have reports she used multiple aliases, including Jeffery Escalante," Houston Police Commander Chris Hassig said about 19 minutes into a news conference Monday. "So she has utilized both male and female names, but through all of our investigation to this point, talking with individuals, interviews, documents, Houston Police Department reports, she has been identified this entire time as female, she, her. And so we are identifying her as Genesse Moreno, Hispanic female."

Records in Harris County, where Houston is located, show Moreno, under the names Jeffery G. Escalante-Moreno or Jeffery G. Escalante, was

charged in six criminal cases from 2005 to 2011. She is identified as female in all of them. A case filed in nearby Katy County after Moreno's latest arrest in April 2022 also lists her as female, but with the name Genesse Ivonne Moreno.

William Capasso, an attorney in Houston who represented Moreno for a portion of her divorce proceedings in 2021 to 2022, told The Associated Press she went by Jeffrey Moreno-Carranza at the time. He said Carranza was her married name and noted at that time "there was no indication that she was transgender."

"It is my understanding that although her birth name was Jeffrey Moreno, she was born female and identified as a female," he wrote in an email. "She did use Genesse and may have changed her name to Genesse Moreno after I represented her."

Capasso added that Moreno used the name "Jeffrey Genesse Escalante Moreno" on her son's birth certificate. He said he withdrew as Moreno's attorney in the proceedings because he was not able to communicate

with her effectively.

Many social media posts used claims about Moreno's gender identity to advance a baseless narrative that there has been a rise in transgender or nonbinary mass shooters in recent years. This narrative previously spread widely in March 2023, after an assailant who identified as transgender killed six people at The Covenant School in Nashville.

Gender and criminology experts told The Associated Press at the time that mass casualty shootings perpetrated by someone identifying as transgender or nonbinary are rare and that those groups are far more likely to be the victims of violence.

Authorities said Monday that Moreno used a legally purchased AR-15 style rifle to carry out the attack at Lakewood Church, one of the biggest megachurches in the U.S. She was shot and killed by two off-duty officers working security at the building. Two other people were shot and wounded, including Moreno's young son, who she brought with her to the church.

# Bill would limit officials to 1 elected post

In Hamilton County, it's not uncommon to see one official serving in two elected roles.

Ken Smith, of Hixson, serves on both the Chattanooga City Council and Hamilton County Commission. His fellow commissioner, Gene-o Shipley, is a longtime member of the

Soddy-Daisy City Commission. In East Ridge, Vice Mayor Esther Helton-Haynes also represents the city in the Tennessee Statehouse, following in the footsteps of two of her predecessors.

But a bill moving through the Statehouse could put an end to people holding multiple elected offices at once.

House Bill 2080 would also make it illegal to run for

more than one office in the same election.

The bill's sponsors, Rep. Dave Wright, R-Corryton, and Sen. Richard Briggs, R-Knoxville, said it was inspired by an election in Farragut, Tennessee, in which a candidate tried to run for both mayor and alderman, which would have given him two of five votes on the city's board, Wright said.

But other lawmakers have pointed out the bill could also affect state Rep. Gloria Johnson, D-Knoxville, as she runs for reelection while also challenging U.S. Sen. Marsha Blackburn for her federal seat.

"That would be affected by this bill, but that's not where the bill came from," Wright said by phone.

In legislative hearings, others

wondered whether the proposal would affect Blackburn if she were to be chosen as Donald Trump's running mate in the presidential election.

Last year, a similar bill regarding dual offices was proposed by a pair of Democratic lawmakers and did not pass. It would have barred people in the state's

## '14 alleged sexual assault case still awaiting trial

**Then:** At an alcohol-fueled party after Calhoun High School's prom in May 2014, a young woman alleged she was sexually assaulted by three male students after passing out in a bedroom.

About 30 people, all

under legal drinking age, attended the party at a house in an Ellijay, Georgia, gated community, according to investigators.

Investigators found that all three males penetrated the unnamed alleged victim with their fingers, causing bruising, swelling and lacerations to her sexual organs. In May 2014, a spokesperson

from the Gilmer County Sheriff's Office told the Chattanooga Times Free Press that all involved with the incident were over 18.

In July, a few months after the incident, the three men, Fields Chapman, Andrew Haynes and Damon Avery Johnson, were indicted on one count of aggravated sexual battery and one count of

sexual battery. Chapman and Haynes were also charged with sodomy.

Ellijay is in Gilmer County, nearly an hour's drive northeast of Calhoun, in Gordon County, where Haynes and Chapman were prominent high school athletes. The

## Missing in Alabama: A radio tower, and 'The Sound of Walker County'

JASPER, Ala. — The radio tower peeking out over dense woods and poultry farms had an AM signal just strong enough to serve WJLX's intended audience: the people in and around Jasper, Alabama, who wanted to hear the Jasper Vikings' Friday night high school football broadcasts and news of the burger specials at Alabama Stackers on 19th Street.

Then, "The Sound of Walker County," as the station has long billed itself,

went silent.

The tower, all 190 feet of it, had vanished — its 3,500 pounds of spindly steel beams possibly sliced into pieces and dragged away earlier this month by thieves, police said.

"Who in the world steals a radio tower?" said Brett Elmore, the station manager, recalling his bewildered reaction when a maintenance worker explained to him why the station he often calls "my life" had been knocked off the air.

The disappearance has made for one of the more

puzzling cases taken on by the Jasper Police Department, which has had few leads so far.

Many in Jasper, a city of about 14,000 that lies 40 miles northwest of Birmingham, fear the culprits have taken more than a heap of steel.

Listeners describe WJLX as a trusted source for local news and warnings of extreme weather, breaking through the noise of a cluttered landscape on radio, television and the internet with something

Bill targets use of social media by children

A bill aiming to make Georgia children safer online sailed through a Senate committee, and with the backing of Lt. Gov. Burt Jones, it appears poised for a full Senate vote.

Dallas Republican Sen. Jason Anavitate's Senate Bill 351 would require social media platforms like Facebook, X, Instagram and TikTok to verify users' ages. Children under 16 would need parental permission to create an account, and the platforms would be limited in how they collect data from minor users. It also calls on state and local boards of education to develop programs on topics like internet safety and cyberbullying.

The Senate Committee on Education and Youth approved it unanimously.

A recent consensus study by the National Academies of Science "did not support the conclusion that social media causes changes in adolescent health at the population level," but did find that some features of social media can harm some young people's mental health.

"These include, but are not limited to, algorithmically driven distortions of reality exacerbating harmful content and disinformation, the distraction away from time that can otherwise be used in more healthy ways, and the creation of opportunities where youth can be abused or exploited," the study said.

The study noted that not all young social media users will be affected in these ways and some young people are helped

by social media. The researchers' recommendations include "to develop industry standards that can ensure social media use protects mental health in the long term, the engagement of educators and health care providers in highlighting the benefits and minimizing the harms of social media use, and specific measures to protect youth from online abuse."

Mike Griffin, a lobbyist with the Georgia Baptist Mission Board, said he hopes the proposed law will help protect Georgia children from abusers by making parents take a closer look at their children's online activities.

"I'm very concerned about the sexualization of our children in our culture today," he said. "I believe this bill helps address some of that to make sure their parents are doing a better job of supervising our children."

As social networks have become more and more necessary to participate in business and culture, lawmakers at the state and federal levels have sought to guide their influence on society, especially on children.

States including Arkansas and Utah have passed laws similar to Georgia's proposal. Social media companies are pushing instead for federal legislation that would put the onus on app stores to verify ages and require parental approval whenever a child under 16 downloads an app, arguing that would allow parents to oversee their children's online activity from one place rather than having to approve each separate platform their child wants to sign up for.

incident brought national media attention to the rural Northwest Georgia community.

The defendants denied guilt, and the only witness to the incident, Anthony Rhett Harper, testified in an October 2014 pretrial hearing that the encounter was consensual.

Defense attorneys for the accused said the prosecutor for the Appalachian Judicial Circuit, then-District Attorney B. Alison Sosebee, misread the sheriff's investigation and assigned some charges to the wrong person among the three defendants. The Appalachian Judicial Circuit includes Fannin, Gilmer and Pickens counties.

In response, the prosecution reassigned the charges, added more charges and went back to the grand jury a month later.

All three men then faced multiple charges of aggravated sexual battery, aggravated battery, sexual battery and public indecency. Chapman and Johnson faced a sodomy charge — but Haynes did not face a sodomy charge once the charge was reassigned.

If convicted, the defendants could serve prison time of 25 years to life for every count of aggravated sexual battery. At the time, a defense attorney for one of the defendants called the new slate of charges ridiculous.

Soon after they were charged, Chapman, Haynes and Johnson turned themselves in and were booked and released on \$51,000 bond apiece.

Due to the charges, the accused seniors were not allowed to participate in the Calhoun High School graduation ceremony, which happened two weeks after the incident. At that ceremony, many seniors wore blue ribbons on their gowns to support the alleged victim.

One of those seniors told the Times Free Press at the ceremony they had been protesting and wore the ribbons on their gowns

because they feared the incident would get "swept under the rug." A mother of another student at Calhoun High School gave similar motivations for the protests.

In 2017, the insurance company for Coosawattee River Resort, where the incident took place, reached a settlement with the alleged victim. The amount of the settlement was not made public. Three months before the settlement with the resort was reached, the alleged victim settled a civil suit with the owner of the residence where the incident took place for an undisclosed sum.

**N o w :** N e a r l y 10 years later, the three men charged still haven't gone to trial.

At the Gilmer County Courthouse in Ellijay, hundreds of motions, scheduling notices and subpoena records can be found about the case in the county clerk's computer system.

About 30 subpoenas were submitted by the defense throughout the fall of 2014, aimed at law enforcement officials, members of the district attorney's office and judges. The district attorney's office filed a motion to quash some of the subpoenas, including one for Sosebee, because prosecutors claimed it was unreasonable and oppressive and sought to harass state employees and delay the case.

There was no decision on that motion in the court records, and clerk staff said that means the ruling awaits a decision by a judge.

The three defendants pleaded not guilty in

early 2015. The rest of that year and most of 2016 were marked by criminal calendar calls, but in August 2016, the prosecution made a motion to disqualify the only uninvolved witness to the incident, arguing his story changed over time to make it seem like the alleged victim was more sober and active in the sexual encounter.

A calendar call is a pretrial meeting that is held by a judge with the attorneys of both parties in a case to schedule a date for trial or hearing and to arrange some other pretrial details, according to the Cornell Law School Legal Information Institute.

There was no decision on that motion in the court records.

Criminal calendar calls and subpoenas continued through December 2018, when defense attorneys claimed the indictments weren't processed in open court as is legally required. That motion was rejected by a Court of Appeals nearly two years later in the fall of 2020.

Calendar calls and pretrial conferences continued over the next few years, with delays for medical leave, including one for defense attorney

George Weaver in October. In early 2024, a mid-March court date was scheduled involving judge caseloads.

Jesse Vaughn, an attorney based in downtown Calhoun, represents Johnson. Attorneys for the other two defendants could not be reached.

"Absolutely nothing is happening in the case," Vaughn said in an email. "We are headed to our fourth judge since Judge John Worcester died a few months ago."

Worcester served as a Superior Court judge in the Appalachian Judicial Circuit for about seven years and died earlier this year, according to Amy E. Johnson, clerk of Gilmer County's Superior/Juvenile Court.

Vaughn said he had no idea who would preside over the case. Calls and emails to Appalachian Judicial Circuit Chief Judge Brenda S. Weaver and Sosebee were not returned before deadline.

In December, Sosebee was appointed an Appalachian Judicial Circuit Superior Court judge by Gov. Brian Kemp. The acting district attorney, Frank Wood, did not respond to messages by phone and email seeking comment.

Chapman, Haynes and Johnson could not be reached through social media or by phone.

Frizzell said.

**WHEN DO INFESTATIONS HAPPEN?**

In fall and spring, 31l sees an increase in reports of overgrowth-related infestations, Frizzell said.

In fall and winter, Haney said his pest control service sees an influx of calls about rodents in crawl spaces, attics and basements.

"They're just like any other animal," Haney said. "They want to get somewhere where it's warm."

In the summer, customers will call in about rodents when there are sewer system problems or new construction projects that disrupt rodent habitats, Haney said.

Other than a slight decrease in infestation reports during the pandemic, Frizzell said he has seen similar numbers of infestation reports each year since he joined 31l in 2018. In 2022, there were 103 rat-related service requests, and in 2023 there were 94.

Some residents reported infestations multiple times during the two-year period — typically those living near abandoned homes or vacant lots.

Code enforcement will respond to a repeat request using the same protocol as it would for a new request, but historical data on file will be used to handle the case more efficiently, Frizzell said.

home are harder to combat than exterminating rats inside the home, Frizzell said.

Once an overgrown area is cleared or an outside mess has been removed, he said it can take longer to see results than it would for an inside extermination.

"It's not contained, and it's more to do with getting rid of the things that are causing the issue versus having someone come in and exterminate the issue," he said.

**CAN RESIDENTS USE AT-HOME RAT EXTERMINATION PRODUCTS?**

"The unfortunate thing is all the rodenticides now are restricted-use products," Haney said.

A license is now required to purchase rodenticides used by pest control companies to exterminate rodents. People used to be able to walk into a hardware store and buy a low-toxicity rodenticide over the counter, Haney said.

People can buy their own snap or glue traps, but a pest control professional

is needed for any rodenticide products, Haney said.

"I would address the issue right away at the first signs because they (rodents) multiply fairly quickly," Haney said, "and they're not going to decide to come in your home and then just leave and never come back."

**HOW DOES PUTTING IN A 31l SERVICE REQUEST WORK?**

Chattanooga residents can reach 31l by calling, texting, emailing [31l@chattanooga.gov](mailto:31l@chattanooga.gov), submitting a request online or through the CHATT31l mobile application. When it comes to code enforcement issues like rat infestations, Frizzell said the preferred method of reporting is through 31l so the department can document the information and connect the requester with a code enforcement inspector.


Verizon users can dial 31l to reach the department, and users with other cellphone carriers can reach 31l by dialing 423-643-631l.

The average wait time when someone calls to report an issue to 31l is one minute, according to Frizzell. The wait might be longer on Mondays, as he said that is the department's busiest day.

A code inspector will respond within 24 to 48 hours after 31l passes along the requested information.

Anyone who submits a request to 31l can remain anonymous, Frizzell said, but contact information may be required if 31l needs to enter a home.

# Lawmaker pushes for resources to help mothers surrender newborns

For more than two decades, the number of newborns legally surrendered by their mothers each year under Tennessee's no-questions-asked safe haven law has remained small but steady. Now that abortion has been outlawed in Tennessee — and as lawmakers this year weigh new legislation punishing those who aid minor children seeking abortions out of state — some elected officials and advocates are pushing for an expansion of the state's safe haven resources, saying they anticipate the number of surrendered newborn babies to rise.

Rep. Ed Butler, R-Rickman, has proposed legislation allocating \$2 million to help ensure each Tennessee county has a so-called “baby box,” an insulated pull-out drawer installed in the exterior walls of police stations and fire houses that allows a new mother to safely and anonymously leave her newborn. The devices come

equipped with alarms that alert those inside to retrieve the baby within minutes.

“I think this is another tool to help mothers in distress,” Butler told a legislative committee Tuesday, saying the tool could avert tragedy. “Unfortunately, we’re living in a society where a baby box is the only option.”

Taylor Sanzo, executive director of A Secret Safe Place for Newborns of Tennessee, believes the money

would be better spent on education and advocacy about the state's existing safe haven law, using state funding for social media outreach and to provide paid speakers inside schools.

“I would not be surprised to see the numbers jump because women will no longer be able to abort their pregnancies,” Sanzo said. “Women need to know there's a viable option to abandonment. They're going to want an alternative, and it's so important to ensure that information is available.”

Enacted in 2001, the state's safe haven law allows new mothers to surrender their infants under 2 weeks old at designated drop-off sites without repercussion, unless the baby has suffered abuse. The sites include more than 1,500 police stations, hospitals, fire halls and other locations across the state, including the labor and delivery departments in which they gave birth.

Women and girls may also call 911 for first responders to come collect newborn babies, a provision

of the law intended to extend the reach of the safe haven law to rural areas with fewer designated drop-off sites and to provide girls too young to possess a driver's license a way to safely hand off their infant.

The newborns are then transported for medical care, before the Department of Children's Services takes custody.

Safe haven laws, which exist in every state, were initially enacted as an alternative to abuse, infanticide and abandonment. In recent years, anti-abortion advocates have suggested they serve as an alternative for women who would otherwise seek abortion.

In Tennessee, however, there has been no increase in women and girls surrendering their newborns since the state's strict abortion ban took effect in August 2022.

Since Tennessee's safe haven law was enacted 23 years ago, 131 newborns have been legally surrendered, according to data provide by the Department of Children's Services.

# Losing dental when enrolling in Medicare. Help!

Dear Toni,

I will be eligible for Medicare in July and am now receiving cancer treatment. I am currently on my ex-employer's COBRA and searching for dental care when I go on Medicare in July. The only dental/vision plans I am finding are in Medicare Advantage plans, but my cancer facility has advised me to not go in that direction because many Medicare Advantage plans are no longer accepted at their facility.

Is there a dental plan that Medicare offers? Please advise.

— Tammy from Alvin, Texas

Hello Tammy,

“What's not covered by Part A & Part B?” is explained on page 55 of the 2024 Medicare & You handbook.

Medicare does not cover everything, and if you need certain services that Medicare Part A and Part B doesn't cover, you will have to pay for them yourself unless:

- › You have other coverage (including Medicaid) to cover the costs.
- › You are in a Medicare Advantage Plan or Medicare Cost Plan that covers these services. Medicare Advantage Plans and Medicare Cost Plans may cover some extra benefits, like fitness programs and vision, hearing and dental services.
- Some of the items and services original Medicare does not cover include:
  - › Eye examinations (for prescription eyeglasses).
  - › Long-term care.
  - › Cosmetic surgery.
  - › Massage therapy.
  - › Routine physical exams.
  - › Hearing aids and exams for fitting them.
  - › Concierge care (also called concierge medicine, retainer-based medicine, boutique medicine, platinum practice or direct care).
  - › Covered items or services you get from an opt out doctor or doctor not accepting Medicare.
  - › Most dental care: Original Medicare doesn't cover dental services like routine cleanings, fillings, tooth extractions or items like dentures. However, in some cases, original Medicare may pay for some dental services related to specific medical procedures (a heart valve repair or replacement, organ transplant or cancer-related treatments).

Since Medicare does not cover dental, Tammy, I would recommend you talk to your dentist and see which dental insurance plans they prefer. (Chapter 2 of Toni's “Medicare Survival Guide Advanced”

edition also discusses what is not covered by Medicare.) When purchasing a dental plan, there are two types to pick from (verify which type of plan your dentist accepts before purchasing):

**1. Traditional (or indemnity) dental insurance plans** are generally higher in premium, and the preventive services are usually covered at 100%; basic restorative is generally covered up to 80%, and major procedures at 50%. Recently, new dental plans have been released that help with the costs of dental claims such as fillings, crowns and root canals. A major surprise is that these plans begin immediately with no wait.

**2. Discount dental insurance plans** are generally less expensive than traditional plans. They provide a discount for services, but your dentist must be part of the plan's network and agree to give the dental discount.

You can use either type of dental plan with original Medicare, with or without a Medicare supplement or with a Medicare Advantage plan. Again, make sure that the plan you choose is accepted by the dentist you like.

You did not ask about vision benefits, Tammy, but readers may want to know that the Medicare handbook discusses eyeglasses after cataract surgery. This is a limited benefit because Medicare will cover one pair of eyeglasses with standard frames (or one set of contact lenses) after cataract surgery that implants an intraocular lens. The Medicare Part B deductible will apply for the surgery, and after you meet the Part B deductible, you pay 20% of the Medicare-approved amount for your corrective lenses after the surgery.

# Large data center campus proposed for 53-acre site east of Atlanta

Less than three months after announcing its first data center project, Rockdale County is poised to land a second massive computer storage farm.

A subsidiary of an Atlanta-based industrial developer filed state paperwork Thursday for a sprawling data center campus on a 53-acre site near Conyers, roughly 30 minutes east of downtown Atlanta. Strategic Real Estate Partners proposes three warehouses spanning 837,500 square feet at 1975 Sigman Road NW in Rockdale, according

to the Development of Regional Impact (DRI) filing.

Data centers, which are large warehouses filled with computer servers that power our online lives, have become one of the hottest uses for undeveloped real estate in metro Atlanta. The latest Rockdale project joins approximately 20 other data center campuses that are either in development or preparing for sizable expansions across Georgia, mostly near Atlanta. The demand for these facilities has been described as insatiable by data center developers.

Massive rows of computer equipment requires lots of electricity to power and water to

keep from overheating, which can place strain on utility providers. Georgia Power, the state's largest electric utility, is in the process of asking regulators to approve huge amounts of new capacity — mostly powered by fossil fuels — mainly due to the vast number of electricity-hungry projects across the state.

Georgia Power executives have said data centers are responsible for roughly 80% of the demand crunch it claims to be facing.

The latest project, which was called Rockdale Technology Park 1, will need to go through local rezoning and is expected to be complete by 2028, according

to the DRI. The filing did not include the project's expected build-out value, how many workers it will employ or the anticipated megawattage capacity of the campus. John Young, a principal at Strategic Real Estate Partners, declined to comment.

DRIs are required for gigantic projects that will affect more than just the city or county where the project is located. The filing was made to the Atlanta Regional Commission, which will vet the application and analyze how local infrastructure will be affected.

Atlanta-based DC Blox announced the first data center in Rockdale in December,

a 750,000 square-foot-campus with a potential capacity of 216 megawatts. The project received local property tax incentives, but the county did not disclose an estimated value.

Kevin Hanna, president and CEO of Conyers Rockdale Economic Development Council, said he has not been approached by Strategic Real Estate Partners regarding local incentives. He said last month that the county's willingness to provide the incentives will lessen as facilities cluster.

“You start out aggressively, and then as you get more and more, the desire for more fades and so the incentives start to fade as well,” he said.

# Democrats again rally around Fani Willis

Atlanta Mayor Andre Dickens bounded into the Fulton County Courthouse on Friday and took a conspicuous seat in the second row of the cramped courtroom, on the same row where a handful of other prominent Democrats were already stationed.

To his right sat former Atlanta Mayor Shirley Franklin. Charlie Bailey, the party's 2022 nominee for lieutenant governor, was a few seats over. And former Gov. Roy Barnes, the state's last Democratic chief executive, was about to testify at the behest of District Attorney Fani Willis.

Dickens only stayed a short time, but he told The Atlanta Journal-Constitution that his visit to the high-stakes legal showdown was meant to send a clear message.

"Fani Willis is not on trial," the first-term mayor said after he returned to City Hall. "We know who is on trial. Donald Trump is on trial for trying to steal an election. Women are under attack across this country, and she does not need to feel alone in the courtroom."

Many senior Democrats were reticent to speak in defense of Willis after a Jan. 8 motion alleged she was in an improper relationship with special prosecutor Nathan Wade, who she hired to handle the racketeering case against Trump and his allies.

In the days after Trump codefendant Michael Roman filed the legal claim alleging misconduct, which Willis later forcefully denied, key Democrats held their fire rather than rush to Willis' defense. Some Willis allies who spoke out simply called for patience.

But many Democrats aren't so reluctant to back Willis anymore. Senior party leaders and their allies started to rally around Willis during the extraordinary two-day evidentiary hearing on Roman's claims, which included hours of Willis' raw, emotional testimony.

State Sen. Elena Parent of Atlanta, one of the chamber's top Democrats, said the legal back-and-forth "produced nothing that shows the case was brought for any reason other than its merits."

And state Rep. Sam Park, a senior party leader in the House, said the proceedings only confirmed that the accusations against Willis were "nothing more than a scheme to mislead and distract the American public."

Bailey, a longtime Willis confidante whose wife serves on her communications staff, isn't surprised to see the circling of the wagons.

"People saw in this hearing Fani's grace, determination and genuineness — the very same qualities voters saw when they elected her the district attorney."

And many other Democrats expressed confidence that Superior Court Judge Scott McAfee would reject the motion by defense attorneys to disqualify Willis from prosecuting the case on grounds that the district attorney's romantic relationship with Wade is a conflict of interest.

Fred Hicks, a veteran Democratic strategist, said the hearings feel to many like "smoke and mirrors designed to distract" attention from the case against Trump.

"This does not mean Democrats condone the relationship, but, to this point, it feels as if she has had to give more of an account than Trump has," he said. "And that bothers many people."

Republicans also found reason to cheer the hearing, which could prove to be a make-or-break moment in the election interference case. McAfee said he would schedule another hearing as soon as Friday, leaving the case in limbo for another week.

Sitting not far from Dickens and other Democrats was Vernon Jones, a Trump loyalist who launched failed campaigns for governor and U.S. House in 2022.

Former Georgia GOP chair David Shafer, charged in the racketeering case, was at one point scolded by the judge for loudly laughing at Wade's testimony from the counsel's table.

## After testimony concludes, fate of Fulton DA's role is uncertain

As she mapped out her strategy to disqualify Fani Willis from prosecuting Fulton County's sweeping election interference case, defense attorney Ashleigh Merchant referred repeatedly to a witness whose testimony would prove the district attorney's office wasn't truthful.

Superior Court Judge Scott McAfee even referred to him as Merchant's "star witness."

But Friday, Terrence Bradley took the stand and offered little to help. First, special prosecutor Nathan Wade's former law partner was hours late to the hearing, leaving a roomful of prosecutors, attorneys and journalists waiting as he wrapped up a doctors appointment.

Then Bradley twisted as defense attorneys tried for upwards of an hour to get him to describe what he saw between Willis and Wade, a friend who he once represented in his divorce case. Bradley contended repeatedly that attorney-client privilege severely limited what he could say on the witness stand.

At the end of the eight-hour hearing came a bombshell allegation of sexual assault that put his credibility on the line. McAfee's assessment of Bradley's credibility — and his knowledge of the Willis-Wade relationship — may yet influence the judge's decision on whether to disqualify the DA.

After two days of emotional, combative and detailed testimony, the evidentiary hearing over whether Willis committed misconduct wrapped up Friday.

But the fate of one of the most important criminal prosecutions in the country — the racketeering case involving former President Donald Trump — remains unclear.

Defense attorneys seeking to disqualify Willis and Wade from the case spent Thursday and Friday exploring their romantic relationship and probing alleged financial incentives for the couple to prosecute the case. Their efforts uncovered some testimony that contradicted Willis and Wade's version of events. But they did not conclusively show that the prosecutors had misled the court about their relationship or that they undertook the case to enrich themselves.

McAfee did not decide Friday whether to remove Willis and the entire Fulton DA's office from the case — a decision that could fundamentally undermine the case against Trump and 14 other remaining defendants. Instead, he agreed to review some evidence that will be submitted under seal and will schedule another hearing as soon as next Friday.

That leaves Willis, Wade, the defendants and the entire case in limbo for

at least another week.

Contradictory timelines

The election interference case has been sidetracked since attorney Merchant sought to disqualify Willis in a Jan. 8 motion. Merchant accused Willis of hiring her boyfriend to oversee the prosecution in November 2021 and said she profited from the decision because Wade paid for trips the couple took to Aruba, Belize, Napa Valley and other locales.

In court documents and in the courtroom, Willis and Wade said they did not become romantically involved until months after she hired him. And they said they split their travel costs roughly equally. Merchant, in turn, accused the couple of providing false information about when their relationship began.

The defendants scored some victories in court this week.

On Thursday, Robin Bryant Yeartie, a former friend and colleague of Willis', testified that the DA told her she and Wade were romantically involved before the DA hired him to oversee the election interference case in November 2021. Yeartie said she saw the couple hug, kiss and be affectionate as early as the end of 2019, just weeks after they met at a judicial conference.

That contradicted Willis and Wade's contention that their romance began sometime between February and early April 2022. But Yeartie was also fired from the DA's office, suggesting she might be biased.

Merchant, who represents defendant Michael Roman, also quizzed Wade Thursday on why he changed his answers to questions about his romantic life in his messy divorce case. In answers filed in 2021 through 2023, Wade said he had no relations with women besides his wife. But in January, after Merchant revealed his relationship with Willis, Wade amended his answers. Merchant said that was evidence that Wade was dishonest about his relationship in court documents filed in his divorce. (Wade said he believed his marriage

ended in 2015, after he said his wife had an affair.)

**WILLIS' FATHER TAKES THE STAND**

But the district attorney's office also scored some victories. In testimony Thursday, Willis and Wade told a largely consistent story: Their romantic relationship began in early 2022 and ended last summer. They split their travel expenses between them, with Willis often reimbursing Wade in cash.

Defense attorneys portrayed the cash reimbursements — which totaled thousands of dollars — as odd and unprovable. In her fiery testimony Thursday, Willis said she kept large amounts of cash at her home on the advice of her father.

If Thursday's testimony featured contradictions and constant fireworks, Friday's hearing was more stop-and-start, with constant skirmishes over attorney-client privilege and lines of questioning.

Willis' father, John Clifford Floyd III, confirmed he advised Willis to keep large amounts of cash on hand, like he did himself. He said his distrust of credit cards and other means of paying came from personal experience — he recalled a restaurant in Cambridge, Mass., refusing to accept his American Express and credit cards and a personal check.

"It's a Black thing," Floyd testified Friday. "Most Black folks, they hide cash or they keep cash."

"As a matter of fact, I gave my daughter her first cash box," Floyd added.

Floyd also backed up the prosecutors' timeline about their relationship. He said he didn't meet Wade until 2023 and never saw him at the home he shared with Willis. In fact, he said he got to know another boyfriend Willis had in 2019, a government worker-slash disc jockey nicknamed "Deuce."

Willis' account of her hiring of Wade also got a boost Friday from former Gov. Roy Barnes, a prominent attorney and Democrat who's close with Wade.

On Friday Barnes

confirmed that Willis asked him to lead the Trump investigation in October 2021. Barnes turned down the job, saying he wanted to "make

money" and expressing concerns about possible threats that could come with leading such a high-profile case.

"I'd lived with bodyguards for four years and I didn't like it," he said, referring to his time as governor. "I wasn't going to live with bodyguards for the rest of my life."

Barnes' testimony was designed to undercut the idea that Willis had wanted to hire Wade because of their relationship.

**LAW PARTNER'S CREDIBILITY QUESTIONED**

Attorneys spent much of Friday afternoon arguing about what Bradley could be questioned about under attorney-client privilege given his previous role as Wade's attorney. And Bradley did not appear pleased to be there, asking a series of clarifying questions and often replying that he did not recall.

Defense attorneys spent an extended period trying to tease out additional information about a response he gave to Merchant. After Merchant sent Bradley her original court filing making the accusations formally, Bradley responded "sounds good." Bradley said repeatedly he couldn't expand on the matter because his response was informed by communications he had with Wade when he was a client, which he couldn't share due to attorney-client privilege.

Earlier in the afternoon, Bradley testified he left his law firm with Wade due to a reason that fell under attorney-client privilege. But his story changed while under cross-examination from special prosecutor Anna Cross, when he acknowledged departing the firm after being accused of sexual assault by a co-worker.

"He lied," Cross said.

## 7th time around

### UTC's Gibson excited for one more college season

Like most veteran football players, Jay Gibson has learned how to take care of his body over the years. And at this point, there have been a lot of years.

As a seasoned (collegiate) pro entering his seventh season of college football, the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga tight end has learned there are times when he doesn't have to compete in every single drill, instead passing those responsibilities to some of his younger, inexperienced teammates in the position group.

"Those pads are popping today!" Gibson proclaimed at a recent practice for the Mocs, who began their spring work two weeks ago.

The former McCallie standout from Cleveland, Tennessee, has seen a lot during his time with the UTC football program, having been there since Rusty Wright took over as head coach ahead of the 2019 season. Their relationship goes back even further, though, to when Wright — then an assistant at Georgia State — was recruiting Gibson, then an underclassman at McCallie.

Gibson ultimately chose Western Kentucky, where he appeared in four games in 2018, allowing him to redshirt before transferring to UTC. He appeared in 10 games for

the Mocs in 2019, played in four (three starts) during the pandemic-altered 2020 season that didn't count against eligibility, missed the 2021 season after getting injured during training camp, played in nine games (eight starts) in 2022, and made six appearances (three starts) last year while missing a chunk of the midseason schedule due to injury.

Fifth and even sixth seasons of

college football have become common in recent years, due in part to the NCAA's allowance of an extra year of eligibility early in the pandemic, but while Gibson may not be into record territory — oft-injured Miami Hurricanes tight end Cam McCormick announced last month that he'll return for a ninth season — he is an outlier even in this era.

## Vols shoot lights out and slam the 'Dores

KNOXVILLE — A typical college basketball season can provide multiple surprises.

Saturday night inside the Food City Center wasn't one of them.

A Tennessee team ranked No. 8 in the country hosted a Vanderbilt team languishing in 13th in the Southeastern Conference standings, and it was every bit the mismatch that the 20-point spread by Las Vegas oddsmakers suggested. The Volunteers built a 10-point lead before the first media timeout, led by 31 at halftime and cruised to an 88-53 crushing of the Commodores.

"I thought we were terrific in the first half, and I honestly think a lot of that had to do with the respect that we have for Vanderbilt," Vols coach Rick Barnes said. "We've been in so many tough games with them, and our older guys understand the game in a mature way. Because of the respect we have for them, our guys came out ready to play."

Dalton Knecht and Zakai Zeigler scored 14 points apiece to lead the Vols, while Josiah-Jordan James added 13 and Santiago Vescovi 12. That quartet combined to make 12 of 20 attempts from 3-point range for a 60% success clip.

Vescovi, the fifth-year senior guard from Uruguay, became the 19th player in Tennessee history to eclipse 1,500 points for his career.

"Coming in, I knew it was going to be a great ride," Vescovi said. "I've been surrounded by great people the whole time I've been here. The points are truly something I don't care much about. It's not that I don't care, but it's something I'm just not thinking about."

"I'm just trying to do the right thing every time on the court. It's great to hear that, but it's more about just how great the ride has been with my teammates."

## Defense key in road win over ETSU

Stopping rival East Tennessee State University from getting going on offense kept the University of Tennessee women's basketball team moving toward the No. 1 seed for the Southern Conference tournament.

UTC picked up a big road win Saturday, beating the Buccaneers 56-41 at Brooks Gymnasium in Johnson City to improve to 22-3 overall and 10-0 against SoCon opponents with four games remaining in the regular season.

Coupled with Furman's 64-51 upset of second-place Wofford (15-9, 7-3) this past week, it gives the Mocs the opportunity to clinch at least a tie for the league's regular-season championship with a home win Thursday against last-place Western Carolina. Tipoff in that matchup is set for 7 p.m. at McKenzie Arena.

UTC won the SoCon tournament last year in Shawn Poppie's first season as coach, but the Mocs did so as the No. 2 seed after finishing behind Wofford in the standings.

This season's Mocs have won 11 straight games — their longest streak since a run of the same length in 2015-16 — but the latest one didn't start off pretty. In fact, there wasn't much pretty about the visitors' performance except the final score and the play of senior Jada Guinn, who finished with 19 points and 16 rebounds. The Bucs had no answer for the 5-foot-9 guard as she shot 9-for-16 from the field, but the rest of the Mocs were a combined 9-for-38.

## McCallie takes traditional to sweep state titles

NASHVILLE — McCallie senior Carson Gentle did exactly what University of Tennessee football coach Josh Heupel asked him to do in his final high school wrestling match.

Instead of trying to pry Gentle away to enroll early in Knoxville and get started on his college football career, Heupel encouraged the Volunteers defensive line signee to continue wrestling — and told him to make sure he won it all.

Gentle did exactly that and more as he dominated his way to his first individual state championship by pummeling his competition, picking up first-period pins in all three of his matches during the TSSAA Division II traditional tournament, which wrapped up Saturday after two days of competition at Montgomery Bell Academy.

Gentle, who helped McCallie win the DII-AAA football state championship in December, also helped the Blue Tornado wrestling team sweep the state duals and traditional tournament titles for the first time since 1993.

"This is so special to all of us," said Gentle, who finished the season 25-1 overall at 285 pounds. "The past few years we haven't placed well in

a lot of stuff. But this year we had just enough senior leadership mixed with really talented young guys. Hopefully they can keep building on what we

were able to accomplish and get even better and better."

Gentle closed the bout with Franklin Road Academy's Bobby Council with a single-leg sweep before throwing his opponent to the mat for the pin just seconds later.

Eighth grader Jaxon Lane stepped to the mat next for the 106-pound final and became McCallie's second state champ of the night in what turned out to be awarded best match against Father Ryan's Tanner Tran.

Knotted in a scoreless battle headed into the third period, Lane caught Tran off guard and threw him to the mat for a take-down, then worked on top to pick up three back points and threaten to pin. After closing out a 5-3 victory, Lane ran over to Jake Yost and leapt into his coach's arms in celebration.

"I couldn't have done this without Coach Yost," said Lane, who was 2-4 against Tran going into the match. "He has stayed with me extra in the wrestling room and helped me maintain my weight. I didn't have any pressure on me because we

# Eight area wrestlers are GHSA state champs

Landon Williams led a group of eight area wrestlers who earned individual gold at Saturday's GHSA state traditional tournament at the Macon Centreplex.

The Dade County senior capped his prep career on the mat with his third consecutive championship, doing so in dominant fashion at 215 pounds in Class A. Also a football standout, he was unscored upon during his three bouts in Macon — each resulting in a pin — and finished the season 49-0.

"Landon didn't allow a single point to be scored on him this week," Dade coach Jeff Poston said after Williams' second-period pin of Lamar County's Gary Morton in the final. "He is our first three-time champion, and he's such a dominant competitor."

The eight individual champions represented seven Northwest Georgia schools. Ringgold's Pierce Pennington finished a 44-4 season by earning his second championship, posting a 5-1 decision over Franklin County's Will Ballener at 138 in Class AAA. Pennington's Tigers repeated as the classification's third-place team — the highest finish this year among area programs — behind champion Columbus (169.5 points) and Lumpkin County (139). Gordon Lee finished ninth and LaFayette 16th.

Also earning individual championships were Gordon Lee freshman Noah Brown at 106 in Class AAA, Southeast Whitfield's Olli Webb at 120 in Class AAAAA, Heritage's Evan Wingrove at 190 in AAAAA, Dalton's Stryker Woods at 215 in Class AAAAA and Murray County's Kristopher McGinnis at 150 in AA.

In girls' competition, which covers all classifications, Southeast Whitfield's Terra Burse was the winner at 190 with a 9-0 major decision to finish the season 30-1. Chattooga's Kendra Heroch (140) was a runner-up for the fourth time.

Helping lead Ringgold's run to third place in AAA was a runner-up in 150-pound Jaxon Delgado and a pair of third-place finishers in Tristan Busch (150) and senior Hudson Moss (132). Moss lost in the championship quarterfinals to Gordon Lee rival Landon Brown, but he came back to earn a 19-3 technical fall over Brown and place third. Freshman Billy Hamilton finished fourth for Ringgold, losing 5-4 in the consolation final.

"We had a lot of adversity this season with injuries and illnesses, but our guys pulled together and worked hard all season and got better every day," Ringgold coach David Moss said. "This has been a really fun group for me and the rest of our coaches to work with."

Finishing third in AAA were Coahulla Creek's Danny Liddy (138) and LaFayette's Haygen Baker (144). Lakeview-Fort Oglethorpe's Jonas Watkins (165) was fourth.

All of the fifth-place matches were declared double forfeits by the GHSA to make up time.

In Class A, Trion finished sixth in the field dominated by Social Circle, which had a tournament-best 251.5 points. Trion did not have an individual champion, but senior Toby Maddux was second at 190 after losing a tight 3-0 final to Commerce's nationally ranked Hoke Hogan.

The Bulldogs also had a third-place finisher in Cohen Blaschke (175), with freshman Silas Mills (113) and Jason Jenkins (120) both fourth. Also in Class A, Chattooga had three medalists, paced by 175-pound runner-up Zayden Cook.

Poston's Wolverines put together a small but successful effort in Macon.

"We finished 10th overall as a team with only five wrestlers, so it was a good showing," Poston said. "Eli Kimball came back to get third at 285 after losing his first match Thursday, pinned his way to the consolation finals and then pinned the kid who beat him Thursday to get third."

In Class AAAAA, Southeast Whitfield's Webb led four medalists for the Raiders with his second state title, earning a 16-1 technical fall over Sonoraville's Noah Chastain and ending his junior season 53-3. Fellow Raiders Bryan Ruiz (113) and Areli Celis (126) were fourth.

Heritage's Wingrove capped a 51-2 campaign with his first individual championship after earning a 10-5 decision over North Hall's Ezekiel Harris. Wingrove's teammate, Skylar Grant, was third at 175, as was Sonoraville's Logan Moore at 132.

Central-Carroll ran away with the AAAAA team title with 222 points, well ahead of North Hall (98). Southeast was sixth, Sonoraville ninth and Heritage 10th.

In Class AAAAA, Woods led Dalton to a fifth-place finish (Ola was team champion) after earning a 9-2 win over Woodland-Bartow's John Gill in their title bout. Dalton's Randy Sliger was the 157-pound runner-up, with Zaedin Ausmus getting third at 132, and Alex Overby (144) and Riley Souther (285) finishing fourth. Calhoun's Isaac Green (165) was a runner-up.

McGinnis' individual title in Class AA may have been among the tournament's most surprising as the Murray County junior, according to Track Wrestling, entered the event with an 8-4 season record. He defeated Rockmart's Luke Clay 9-6 in the final.

Rockmart, though, ran away with the team competition with 220 points, with Murray finishing ninth.

North Murray's Brandon Locke, a champion last year, finished second at 113 in AA.

## Hall of Fame coach Driesell dies

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Lefty Driesell, the coach whose folksy drawl belied a fiery on-court demeanor that put the Maryland men's basketball program on the map and enabled him to rebuild several struggling college programs, died Saturday. He was 92.

Driesell died at his home in Virginia Beach, Virginia, his family said.

Maryland honored Driesell with a moment of silence at its game against No. 14 Illinois on Saturday. The team also donned throwback uniforms from the 1970s previously worn on Jan. 21, when the Terrapins honored Driesell with an "Ode to Lefty."

Driesell was inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame in 2007 and the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2018, recognition for a coaching career with 786 victories over parts of five decades. Along the way, he became the first coach to win more than 100 games at four NCAA Division I schools. He started at Davidson in 1960 before bringing Maryland into national prominence from 1969-86, a tenure that ended with the cocaine-induced death of All-American Len Bias.

Driesell then won five regular-season conference titles over nine seasons at James Madison and finished with a successful run at Georgia State from 1997 to 2003.

"His contributions to the game go way beyond wins and losses, and he won a lot," former Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski said after Driesell finally made the Naismith Hall. "It's an honor he's deserved for a long time."

Driesell launched the college basketball tradition known as Midnight Madness on Oct. 15, 1971. At three minutes after midnight on the first day of practice as sanctioned by the NCAA, Driesell had his players take a mandatory mile run on the track inside Maryland's football stadium.

The lighting was provided by the headlights of a few cars parked at one end of the stadium.

The motivation came from Driesell's prodding and the estimated 800 students who gathered to watch the unpublicized event.

"I've done a lot of crazy things to get attention, but that wasn't one of them," Driesell said years later. "I was just trying to get an early jump on practice. I had no idea what it was going to lead to."

Driesell also helped knock down racial barriers in the college game. He made George Raveling the first Black coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference by hiring him as an assistant in 1969. Driesell's effort to recruit Charlie Scott to play at Davidson helped make the future NBA star the first Black scholarship athlete to attend North Carolina.

Scott initially committed to Davidson before choosing the Tar Heels but acknowledged that Driesell paved the way.

"I think if there had never been a Lefty Driesell, there would never have been a Charlie Scott attending North Carolina," said Scott, who was in the same Naismith Hall induction class with Driesell in 2018. "My commitment to go to Davidson really opened up all the other schools in the recruiting process."

had the state team title already locked up before the finals.

"I can't say enough about our seniors, either. Carson Gentle has been a great mentor to me. Ja'Von McMahan also helped me every day get in better shape and would ride the bikes with me. You can't ask for greater leaders than we had on this team."

McCallie accumulated 243.5 points to win the team title, while rival Baylor finished runner-up with 212 points and four state champions. Baylor, which was third at state duals, lost to McCallie during a regular-season dual but edged the Blue Tornado at the region traditional tournament before falling short Saturday.

The celebration was special for the Blue Tornado, whose three senior starters all made the finals, with James Cross (175) and McMahan (190) finishing as runners-up.

Sophomore Cooper Gentle was also a runner-up at 215, and McCallie sealed the team title earlier Saturday in the consolation finals as Axel Ritchie (113), Dylan Villers (132), Cooper Ledbetter (138) and Zaydan Morgan (144) all finished third. All 13 state qualifiers for the Blue Tornado placed, with Brody Connell (120), Cainan Williams (126) and Cannon Voiles (157) fourth and Braden Ryan (150) fifth.

"The boys did such a great job," Yost said. "Halfway through the semifinal round last night, we were down by 40 points. We were struggling to get going, and James Cross won a huge match

in the last few seconds to give us that spark. We rode that momentum, and then we had our guys win seven of eight matches this morning, and then win five of eight in the afternoon before the finals.

"It has been a long time since McCallie has hoisted a championship trophy in wrestling. To be a small part of a great team, coaching staff and school is something so special. We had an amazing group of leaders, and this was huge for our program."

Baylor's four state champions were Titus Norman (144), Hunter Sturgill (157), Max Norman (165) and Jacob Bond (113). Freshman Malachi Puckett (138) and sophomore Oliver Phillips (126) finished second.

Chattanooga Christian School sophomore Ryder Smith made history by becoming the Chargers' first wrestling state champion. He won the 215-pound bracket with a 13-4 major decision.

"I started wrestling for the CCS club when I was 5 years old," said Smith, who was 42-0 this season. "Getting runner-up at state last year really fueled me a lot. Every day I would look at it, and it hurt. Now I have dreams to one day be a great college wrestler, too. I am going to come back in the gym tomorrow and get ready for prep nationals coming up."

Boyd Buchanan had four state runners-up after previously having just three state finalists in program history. The four second-place finishers for the Buccaneers were Nolan Harde- man (113), Connor Payne (150), Austin Johnson (157) and Kaiden Bates (175).

Tennessee improved to 19-6 overall and to 9-3 in conference contests, while Vanderbilt dropped to 7-18 and to 2-10 within the league. The Vols have won 13 of the past 14 series meetings with the Commodores, sweeping this year's regular-season series by a combined 48 points.

Knecht, James and Vescovi all made 3-pointers within the game's first four minutes to stake Tennessee to a quick 13-3 lead. Another Vescovi 3-pointer at the 12:10 mark of the first half increased the advantage to 23-7, and Jonas Aidoo helped the Vols cruise past the 20-point bulge with a layup and a putback basket on consecutive possessions to make it 30-8.

The incredibly early nail in the coffin took place with 6:39 before halftime, when Zeigler connected on a 3-pointer and the Commodores were whistled for a foul away from the ball. That gave the Vols possession, and they capitalized with Zeigler lofting an inbounds pass to Aidoo for a dunk and a 35-8 advantage.

Tennessee took a 51-20 lead into halftime, racking up 16 assists while committing only two turnovers. Vanderbilt had only two first-half assists and turned it over 13 times.

"That's as good of a 20 minutes as we've put together all year, and our older guys were the ones who were responsible for it," Barnes said. "When we're moving people and we're moving the ball, that's when we're at our best. We tried to create some confusion and to get some separation to get our guys' feet set and get them into rhythm shots."

"We love it when we're sharing the ball like that."

A 3-pointer by James 16 seconds into the second half resumed the onslaught at 54-20.

The Vols took their largest lead at 72-31 on a Tobe Awaka dunk with 11:27 remaining. Had that 41-point margin been maintained, Tennessee would have replaced its 76-38 downing of Vanderbilt in 2014 as the largest victory over its in-state rival.

### Liking every shot

Tennessee freshman guard Cameron Carr came off the bench to score eight points, which matched his total from his first 10 appearances this season.

The 6-foot-5, 175-pounder from Eden Prairie, Minnesota, has played 22 minutes against SEC opposition and has taken 12 shots.

"He's probably leading the nation in shots per minute," Barnes said. "You've seen him in practice. He's a guy who can get buckets quick. It's when he relaxes. When he goes and searches for it, he gets in a hurry."

"He got some extended minutes tonight, and I thought he settled down a little bit."

When asked if he has a green light to shoot, Carr smiled and said, "No." When asked what he could do to get one, he said, "Stop air-balling."

UTC won the game on the other end, though, holding the Bucs (16-9, 5-5) to 29% shooting from the field and turning 15 ETSU turnovers into 18 points.

That allowed the Mocs to complete what will be their longest road swing of SoCon play this season 3-0, with Saturday's success following a 55-39 win at Samford on Feb. 8 and a 61-52 victory at Mercer on Feb. 10.

"I thought we were able to hold our cool a little bit there and make enough plays down the stretch," UTC coach Shawn Poppie said on the postgame radio broadcast. "But I'm proud of our defensive effort. That's three games in a row where we've been really, really good on the defensive end, and you've got to have that on the road."

"These three games we came through, to win all three and do it the way we did, it wasn't the prettiest offensive nights, but I thought that we showed a lot of toughness and we continue to just find ways to win."

UTC sophomore forward Raven Thompson struggled from the floor (4-for-17), but she hit all seven of her free throws and finished with 15 points and seven rebounds as the Mocs improved to 68-25 in the all-time series with ETSU. They've won five straight in the series.

Addie Porter chipped in nine points and seven rebounds, while Sigrun Olafsdottir scored six points on a pair of 3s — but more notably, she continued her quest to become the SoCon defensive player of the year by limiting guard Neveah Brown — ETSU's leading scorer at 14.1 points per contest going into the game — to six points on 3-for-9 shooting.

Breanne Beatty was the Bucs' leading scorer Saturday with nine points, including four on free throws. ETSU led 8-7 after the first quarter, but UTC was up 28-20 at halftime and 41-28 entering the fourth.

# Colleges still profiting from student banking

It is hardly a secret that many young people entering college find themselves in financial difficulty due to a lack of financial literacy. So, it may come as a surprise that many schools profit by partnering with banks and lenders to push financial products to students that are often more expensive than open-market alternatives but generate big fees for the schools.

The latest annual report to Congress from the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau found the hundreds of partnerships between financial institutions and universities generated millions of dollars in revenue for the schools and fees for the banks, often saddling students with higher costs than noncollege banking products and sometimes using email and online advertising that can be misleading or deceptive. Students and their parents need to appreciate the symbiotic relationship between schools and banks and make smart decisions when offered a college-sponsored account or credit card.

Educational institutions have long profited from arrangements with financial product marketers. Credit card issuers understand the lucrative benefits of being on the spot when a student opens their first account and are willing to pay colleges for access. Prior to 2010, students on campus were plied with swag like Frisbees, T-shirts and pizza parties as incentives to apply for an account, and many young borrowers with little credit experience ended up saddled with debt for years. Universities were only too happy to make the introductions, raking in nearly \$85 million in cash payments from credit card companies in 2009, the equivalent of \$125 million in today's dollars.

Congress finally stepped in to pass the Credit Card Accountability, Responsibility and Disclosure Act of 2009 that ended aggressive in-person credit card solicitations and restricted eligibility for people under 21 without verifiable outside income. The act reduced the most egregious exploitation and mandated that the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau submit annual reports to Congress. The 2023 report showed progress but also noted colleges still profit from banking arrangements that sometimes mislead students or entice them into more expensive relationships.

Let's start with bank accounts. Federal financial aid represents a colossal transfer of funds each year. In 2022, 5,500 schools received over \$110 billion in financial aid covering 10 million students. Once the school has extracted tuition and fees, any excess loan funds are disbursed to the student to cover other expenses, including room and board or supplies. Many colleges then subcontract with third-party banks to handle these transactions, and in the process, offer to set up student deposit accounts known as "college banking

# Trained dancer Walker hitting her stride in the financial sector

# Funding the future

## What do Chattanooga investors look for when funding the next great business idea?

You've crafted what could be a billion-dollar business solution, but there's still a big piece of the puzzle that's missing: the money it will take to bring it to life.

Seeking an investor could be the key. But that's a challenge, too — finding the right group and the right kind of funding.

So, what interests Chattanooga's business investors? What qualities do they look for? And is there enough money in Chattanooga for businesses to scale up?

We asked several local groups these questions and more.

#### 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

We consider ourselves to be "category agnostic" venture investors — investing in companies across the board when it comes to technology verticals. We've invested in sectors like biotech, gaming, supply chain logistics, consumer marketplaces, deep tech.

We look for what we think can be high-growth companies that will take 10 or so years to build. Just as Matt Patterson and I did with Bellhop, our portfolio teams relocate to Chattanooga indefinitely to remove all distraction, put in serious hours, and reach Series A metrics.

Really, you're looking for the needle in the haystack. The best seed investors in the world will tell you there's no possible way of knowing. You just have to create a thesis around what you believe — what haystacks may contain needles.

We don't focus on a particular category of business that we claim

to know how the future is going to shake out. We believe we know the types of founders that are most likely to build those, and who can endure the 10- to 12-year grind. We are stylistic investors.

We look for founders who have a non-obvious vision — those who aren't looking at a recurring solution that's been tried a thousand times. Our founders are presenting things that sound crazy and wild and bizarre almost.

We look for founders who have a heads down approach and a radical focus. The ones we choose know

the deal — they are relocating to Chattanooga and building inside, removing all distractions.

We look for pack animals. We look for teams that value running with a pack, where everybody has their own roles and takes pride in their part, and just seem to be synced with full faith in their leader. For our founders, 50 hours a week ain't it. Here, you're agreeing to put yourself inside of a pressure cooker, and being pushed to the max.

We look for founders who are

# People are seeking a romantic connection with the perfect bot

A few months ago, Derek Carrier started seeing someone and became infatuated.

He experienced a "ton" of romantic feelings but he also knew it was an illusion.

That's because his girlfriend was generated by artificial intelligence.

Carrier wasn't looking to develop a relationship with something that wasn't real, nor did he want to become the brunt of online jokes. But he did want a romantic partner he'd never had, in part because of a genetic disorder called Marfan syndrome that makes traditional dating tough for him.

The 39-year-old from Belleville, Michigan, became more curious about digital companions last fall and tested Paradot, an AI companion app that had recently come onto the market and advertised its products as being able to make users feel "cared, understood and loved." He began talking to the chatbot every day, which he named Joi, after a holographic woman featured in the sci-fi film "Blade Runner 2049" that inspired him to give it a try.

"I know she's a program, there's no mistaking that," Carrier said. "But the feelings, they get you — and it felt so good."

delusionally optimistic. One of the greatest gifts a founder has is the true inability to understand what they're up against. It's kind of a David and Goliath situation. We want people who think, "Of course we're going to take down this giant with limited funding." You have to find the founders that are completely irrationally confident and truly don't know what they're up against.

We look for founders who are learning machines, who are craving knowledge. Because you can have an idea for a solution, but the only way you're going to solve it is to understand the problem deeper than anyone else on Earth. What's the fully-reduced, brass- tax problem? What is the root? And then you have to get creative on how to solve that. And the only way you get there is by being almost neurotic about learning.

And we do box checks: Do we believe in the future relevance of the vertical? Do we believe the market is big enough to warrant a venture investment — that is, if this company succeeds do we believe our investment could return our entire fund? Do we believe their team has the chops to technically and operationally pull it off; and are they expecting to grind on this problem for a decade?

## 2. Are there any emerging trends in the business landscape that you anticipate will impact investment strategies?

Startups became part of pop-culture somewhere along the way, but the reality is, starting and scaling a venture- backed company is not glamorous. We're focused on venture capital's trending return to reality, backing capital-efficient founders who want to build and sell a big company, not be in Forbes 30 Under 30.

If you're investing based on trends, you're already in a losing battle in venture capital. You have to see things before they become mainstream.

From about 2018 to 2022, the investment landscape has just been in "Lala Land." Venture capital went through a bubble, which started a little before the pandemic and certainly after. So many funds raised capital in 2020 and 2021 and started deploying capital without doing diligence on the companies they were investing in, which caused the industry to overheat.

That bubble has popped over the last year, and venture investors are returning to reality — trying to be good stewards of the capital, diligently working through the process.

Money was so easy during those years, founders started spending money without concern as to how it was being deployed. You had founders during that bubble flying first class, traveling to Portugal, going to parties. Brickyard is a complete departure from that. That's not how you build a big company. You build a company by locking yourself in a room for four years and working non-stop.

## 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their businesses?

Venture capital doesn't make sense for most companies, so be sure it is the right financing option for what you want to build. If you want to grow at a painful rate for 10 years, and sell for \$500 million or more, venture capital probably makes sense. If not, there are much better options that will make your life more enjoyable.

Venture capital as an asset class has to push its companies towards truly extraordinary outcomes in order to return capital to their investors, so alignment around expectations between founders and venture capital firms is essential. You have to be sure venture capital is the financing you really want. You've got to know what you're getting into.

Our founders are Olympians. And becoming an Olympian is going to take just about everything you have to give, and you're not guaranteed a medal. The people who trained and funded you, if you don't win a medal — they didn't get what they wanted out of the deal. Founders need to understand, you take venture capital when you want to build a really large company. If you want to sell your company for a billion, venture capital is probably the right option. If you want to sell for \$50 million or even \$100 million, it probably isn't right.

It's kind of like putting rocket fuel in a pick-up truck. You have to put rocket fuel in a rocket. If the thing you're building isn't a rocket, the stress is going to rip it to pieces.

## 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

I would guess Chattanooga seed investors, as a whole, are probably funding 20% of new venture-worthy startups per year, with Brickyard doing 10 to 12 of them. We have a lot of room to grow on the investment side; but the important metric is talent, not funding. Talent in 2024 will live and build where it wants to be. If we continue building a cool city, talent will come and funding will follow.

If you are a founder who has a legitimate venture-worthy opportunity, it honestly doesn't matter where the money is. Money is going to go after the best opportunities. I don't think having a local base of venture capitalists is that important in 2024. When we raised money for Bellhop, less than 3% came from local investors. But even if we started our company today, we could build in Chattanooga and raise seed capital from Denver.

In fact, it's probably better if we're attracting money from other places to companies who are building here. I think most people think local funding is the hindrance to starting companies in Chattanooga, and that's not the case. We have to be a place where people want to build.

## 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

We invest in early-stage companies and look for real, profitable, high-growth businesses with a line of sight to profitability. Most are facing a growth inflection point and need fuel to get through that.

We have no founder criteria for the businesses we work with, but about two-thirds of our 15 investments are led by women, founders of color or veterans. Most high-margin businesses tend to be tech-related or software as a service , although we also invest in consumer packaged goods.

Locally, we have a couple businesses — WYRE, a cybersecurity tech management company; and also a fishing equipment company called Pivit. We're not focused on a particular sector, but more on the model, and whether they are high-growth, high-margin. We look for talented founders, with some bias toward the Southeast, but they can be from anywhere.

## 2. Are there any emerging trends in the business landscape that you anticipate will impact investment strategies, especially within Chattanooga?

For investors, there are a couple of things that have shifted. Capacity started during the pandemic and has always focused on profitability and real businesses. But a lot in the venture environment got caught up with valuations going up fast during that time, starting to disconnect from foundational business metrics.

So, the trend is coming back to profitability — businesses that can get to profitability even when they're growing fast.

More than any other time, the latest tech tools make it possible to build a sustainable high-growth business, with less capital. This gives early-stage funds an advantage over later-stage funds right. Because valuations have gone down for later stages, the next round of investment doesn't increase in value as much, so fewer follow-on investments are being made.

But early-stage companies benefit, especially in tech, because they can build more and raise less. And there is a growing trend of founders using more types of funding in order to maintain independence as they grow.

## 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their businesses?

Most founders are chasing the check, but need to think about it more like hiring money. Because if the funding doesn't fit with what they're doing, it can be dangerous. And most founders have no idea about that.

Many go after venture capital, thinking that's the only way to grow a fast business, not realizing it will leave them with few options — that they have to go as fast as they possibly can to

get to the exit for their investors. They can't slow down; they can't switch gears; and they don't have control of the company anymore.

Most successful startup companies you don't hear about because they're not big stories. But many times, they delayed getting venture capital or they didn't use it at all. Even in technology, most founders think you have to get venture capital. But three out of four of our exits didn't even use venture capital.

Ultimately, the message for entrepreneurs is that there are many different ways to fund a company, and venture capital should be the last choice. The way a venture fund makes money is that the company they fund has to grow many times bigger, and then they have to sell it. So the companies that do succeed have to be really big. As a founder, what you've done is you've agreed to a binary outcome — grow really big, really fast, and sell or die.

All funding has constraints, and there are a lot of choices. But founders should be thinking about how to keep their options open. Fewer companies will die if they get their capital stack right.

## 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

I think this is the wrong question to be asking. Chattanooga has an amazing group of funding choices. We're over-indexed on philanthropy, and have local community development financial institutions, credit unions, banks, angel groups and venture funds. We have an active and growing group.

We also have plenty of great startup business support groups. The Business Development Center has done an amazing job. We have Co.Lab, the Urban League, the Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, ChaTech, and the list goes on.

We talk about funding startups, but we need talent to stay here and companies to be built and grow here indefinitely. That's how jobs get created and communities continue to grow. The startup failure rate is high, but talent compounds.

Fuel for business growth comes from two places: customer revenue and funding. Founders are not going to limit themselves to sourcing fuel from one location when customers and funding can be anywhere. It's a false constraint to say we need all the funding here to make it work.

I think the real questions are: How do we create an irresistible environment for talent to repeatedly build and grow thriving businesses? And after defining a problem to solve that can be a business, why do they stay here?

## 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

We announced a new ground-breaking \$1.5 million investment fund in January called the Co.Lab Founders Fund. This is the first fund Co.Lab has raised, and it's

direct investment into companies we want here in Chattanooga — startups that are working to solve real world problems for companies that are already here.

For the 2024 cohort, we'll have five teams, including one that is considering Chattanooga as a U.S. home base for their burgeoning business due to the extensive resources our community offers.

For our investment accelerator, we look for companies in the sustainable mobility sector that are technology-related, usually in fields such as electric vehicles or automation. And we want teams that have a minimal viable product, as well as a clear and eminent path to revenue.

We've already taken some investments, and are about 25% of the way there. Those funds will be used for two sustainable mobility accelerators that we'll run in 2025, for a total of up to 12 teams. Our companies will receive \$20,000 upon acceptance into the program, and potentially up to \$100,000 at the end of the program.

It's our goal, as of now, to invite a company or two for a future investment. We'll be getting to know them, see where they're going, and evaluate for potential acceptance.

## 2. Are there any emerging trends in the business landscape that you anticipate will impact investment strategies, especially within Chattanooga?

With sustainable mobility, there are always emerging trends that are poised to affect investment strategies. Think about the innovation in delivering goods. We now have drones delivering goods. Or another example would be using electric jets for short commutes.

Then we also have alternative modes of transportation like scooters and electric bikes. We have an initiative from EPB. We have companies that are embracing technological advancements, using robots to do streamlined pick-and-pack operations.

Then we have the rising trend of electric vehicles, and autonomous vehicle testing. All these changes are connected — how we move through the world, deliver goods and services, and use energy.

## 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their business?

The biggest piece of advice would be to surround yourself with strong mentors and corporate partners. One of the pieces we have built into our 12-week program/accelerator is that we're giving these companies access to a pilot and first customer — which is where a big player in the industry will test the product and give feedback. That kind of experience is invaluable to a new company. For startups, I would say, wherever you can, find a partner who will give you buy in.

## 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

I feel there's this whole renewed excitement in startups and investing. I am still new at Co.Lab. I've been in this position for just under two years. But when I got started, the angel investment network wasn't very strong. Since that time, VentureSouth, which is a very robust group, has started. Brickyard is going. There's some momentum that's building — exciting moments, happenings, new funds.

Is there money to scale? Not really. We're not there yet. But we need to get there. And I think we're getting pieces in place.

We don't have many investors who are writing checks in the millions here. When we get into bigger numbers, and we get

companies who are looking to scale, we will need larger capital partners.

I think the more we shine the spotlight on the companies building here, the more attractive we make Chattanooga. We're on the rise, and we need to continue with that momentum.

## 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

We only make investments related to supply chain and mobility, and focus on the movement of freight. Part of the reason we call Chattanooga home is because of the density of supply chain activity within the Southeast. This makes us a unique partner who can help connect the dots between prospective customers and the startup when we invest in these upstart technology companies.

We invest in companies that have ambitions of growing into large businesses, achieving valuations of a billion dollars or more. And when we invest, we're often the first check the team receives.

When we evaluate startup companies, one of the things we look at first and foremost is the quality of the team, and I use the word "team" intentionally. Building large businesses is very challenging, and having a team of individuals with complementary skill sets greatly increases the chances of success. We also look for "coachability," and by that I mean the ability to listen and absorb information, as we are dedicated to actively supporting the companies we invest in.

Apart from the people, we look at the market potential: Are you focused on a significant problem area that can support a large business? Is there an urgency to solving this problem? And lastly, is it solvable using technology?

## 2. Are there any emerging trends that you anticipate will impact investment strategies, especially within Chattanooga?

I think we're seeing an interesting trend around remote work. Cities like Chattanooga still haven't fully captured the opportunity as a great place for remote workers.

I also think we are finally seeing a meaningful level of automation having an impact on various roles — whether it's blue collar, front line or desk/white collar jobs.

## 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their businesses?

One of the most important things to think about is having a durable business. How are you going to survive when times aren't great?

Beyond that, I would say there are three main things. Firstly, business owners should identify their main focus for the year. For example, in 2024, what is the crucial element that needs to be achieved? This could

## Tennessee and Georgia trail other states in VC funds

Over the past three decades, the number of venture capital funds has more than quadrupled and employment in businesses backed by venture capital (VC) funds has grown 24 times faster than the overall economy, according to data compiled by the National Venture Capital Association.


But for their size, Tennessee and Georgia continue to trail most other states in equity investments in startup companies. And after five years of steady growth, a new report found that venture capital and “seed” funding

in startup businesses dropped in the second half of 2022.

“VC is famous for its ability to adapt, but few foresaw Russia’s invasion of Ukraine and the ensuing geopolitical retrenchment that turned out to be one of the major disruptions of 2022,” Bobby Franklin, president and CEO of the National Venture Capital Association, said in a new PitchBook report. “This chaotic cocktail caused the market to stumble in the second half of the year. Deal counts dropped, and exits were particularly hard hit with public listings falling to the lowest level in years.”

Despite the dip in the second half of 2022, the growth in venture capital funding has still outpaced the overall economy in

nearly all industries and states. In Tennessee, venture capital-funded businesses grew 2.3 times as fast as the economy as a whole from 2012 to 2022, according to a new report prepared by the financial

website Flippa based upon an analysis of National Science Foundation and Pitchbook data. In 2022, which is the last year for which such figures have been compiled, Tennessee had a total of 261 venture capital deals totaling \$1.26 billion, up from the 182 deals with a value of \$329.4 million a decade earlier. Tennessee ranked 39th among all states in its share of VC funding.

Georgia ranked 42nd among the 50 states in the share of its VC funding and grew its venture funded businesses twice as fast as the overall economy. Georgia had a total of 484 venture fund deals in 2022 valued at \$2.28 billion, up from the 226 deals valued at \$665.7 million a decade earlier, Flippa reported.

involve less obvious solutions such as repricing customers or reducing the breadth of offerings to drive profitability. It’s important to note that this cannot be answered immediately and may require a series of discussions informed by customers, key management, and investors and advisors (if applicable).

Secondly, the current macroeconomic outlook is uncertain; and it would be wise to acknowledge that it’s acceptable to moderate or adjust growth expectations for this year. Consider growing at a slower pace to better adapt to the unpredictable economy, including factors like financing, inflation and labor markets. Sometimes we need to go slow to go fast.

Lastly, I’d use this soft period to go hire great talent. Since 2008, there hasn’t been a better time to hire talented people. There is currently a surplus of talent available, partly due to job losses caused by downsizing in various companies. Keep an eye out for exceptional talent that may not be immediately apparent.

### 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

I’m not convinced that capital is the main thing to focus on. Startup communities are built around talented and ambitious individuals who are passionate about solving a particular problem or capturing a specific opportunity. Once these people are in a community, it’s important to drive “collisions” — the type of interactions that can help form founding teams which are the atomic unit of a business. I’d say that it’s crucial to have a welcoming environment in Chattanooga with affordable housing options and a strong education system.

On the funding side, let’s focus on angel investors who provide startup teams with a small amount of funds to get going — on the order of \$50-500k. What we need is people to diversify away from the focus on real estate, while also better understanding how to be a quality angel investor and not a robber baron.

We should focus on leveraging the region’s strengths and areas of expertise. Chattanooga excels in areas such as outdoor recreation, the supply chain and energy/utilities. By leaning into these strengths via a vis our startup ecosystem, we can achieve small victories, which will lead to medium-sized victories, and eventually, significant achievements.

Capital naturally flows towards areas where positive developments are taking place. I’m less enthusiastic about solely relying on capital investment to attract businesses and individuals to relocate here as that is prone to adverse selection over the long run.

### 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

My firm represents more than 500 angel investors across the country, all industry agnostic. I review a company’s executive summary and PowerPoint presentation, and if I think they are investable, I invite them to present on Gathering of Angels’ stage.

I charge \$1,000 to get me as a coach for five to seven hours of my time to get ready to pitch to angel investors. If we are successful in helping the company raise capital, I charge an administrative fee.

The Gathering of Angels has about 500 angels across the country who come to Zoom meetings. Some are large groups in cities like Atlanta, Austin, Las Vegas, Santa Fe, New Mexico. We don’t do face-to-face meetings, just online meetings once a month. We are open to anything interesting, novel and that has potential to make money.

### 2. Are there any emerging trends in the business landscape that you anticipate will impact investment strategies, especially within Chattanooga?

I think easily you’ll see more young companies who will integrate artificial intelligence into their offering. For Chattanooga, businesses related to robotics and transportation. Anything in trucking and logistics have high appeal in Chattanooga. AI is the real addition in the last nine months to year. All companies are trying to figure out how to integrate this new technology into their business model.

### 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their businesses?

Of first order is a well thought-out business plan with financial projections and a strong management team to support that plan, as well as a clearly defined exit strategy for investors. Without a plan, you only have writing on the back of a napkin.

There are two pieces of software I recommend: Biz Plan Builder and Biz Plan Pro. Both are available at most office supply stores and cost about \$150 to \$200.

I think the management team component is probably the most important aspect for investor. If an entrepreneur is seasoned or has had success before, that’s certainly a plus and makes the company more investable.

### 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

The entrepreneurial environment in Chattanooga is probably early stage. There are four incubators in town, none of them with capital attached to it like some other cities have. The capital is probably the missing component in the landscape for entrepreneurs.

Many companies that want to scale will end up leaving Chattanooga because there aren’t enough venture capital funds and very few angel investors.

There are a lot of wealthy people, but they aren’t aggregated around an investment forum or club. When an entrepreneur can’t find capital, they’re pushed to move to cities like Dallas, Atlanta and Charlotte, North Carolina to grow and scale their business.

### 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

We are an all-women led firm, and invest in women-led companies throughout the Southeast. The JumpFund is industry agnostic; and we’re interested in high-growth ventures that are tech or tech-enabled for greater scalability.

With our second fund, we began leaning toward impact-focused companies with a triple bottom line — female-led, some kind of social or environmental impact, and having the potential to return capital to investors.

Both our funds have now fully invested in 30 women-led companies and we don’t plan on making any more investments. When we started in 2013, there were no female investors in our local investment scene who were making early-stage investments, and very few, if any, women-led companies being invested in.

Of course, we began to question this — and the answer was capital. So in 2014, we raised our first fund with other like-minded women in Chattanooga, proving there were women wanting to be involved in early-stage investing. The JumpFund was the first angel investment fund that was all women, investing in women in the Southeast.

Still to this day, less than 2% of venture capital goes to women-led companies. The good news is that, nationally, more than 35% of angel investors are women. When we started our fund it was around 5%, so there is improvement, but still a big gap.

### 2. Are there any emerging trends in the business landscape that you anticipate will impact investment strategies, especially within Chattanooga?

In 2023, venture capital was basically a desert — the volatility of the economy caused many angel and venture capital investors to pull back. There wasn’t a lot of early-stage investing going on nationally. If there was activity, it tended to be people who knew people. Money for seed capital and later capital stages where new investors are key had dried up.

But there are hints that we are seeing a thawing, signs that the economy is ticking up. When the stock market is doing better, investors are doing better, and people loosen their purse strings.

Locally, with Brickyard, Venture South and now Co.Lab starting a new fund, there are pools of capital in Chattanooga even during this dry period.

The problem with Chattanooga is that the pool isn’t very big. Yes, there are a couple of funds. But The JumpFund isn’t making new investments and

Chattanooga Renaissance Fund isn’t doing a third fund either. You have groups like Brickyard, Dynamo and Solas BioVentures, but they are focused on specific sectors.

Startup funding, I think, is shifting to new players, but I’m not sure the amount of capital is increasing. For next-stage funding, you really have to look elsewhere where there are deeper-pocketed venture capital funds.

Atlanta is a hot market for startups right now. Nashville is very health tech focused, and is known for several large venture capital funds. They have more money flowing, and many more growth-oriented new startups. In Chattanooga, we’re sitting between them. We’re just a smaller city, so we can’t expect to have large venture funds.

### 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their businesses?

I think they need to understand the focus and interests of the investors, as well as what it means to take angel or venture capital.

I think the show “Shark Tank” has created a false impression about how you get capital. You have to understand what that investor is interested in, what they expect to get out of your company — whether they’re investing just for local economic development, whether they invest in your type of product or service, or your idea fits into their investment portfolio.

Also, venture capital isn’t for every entrepreneur. It’s important to understand what type of funding is right for your business — it could be debt, could be equity, could be a revenue-based finance model, where you’re paying back investors over time/structured debt. Generally, angel investors and venture capital firms are looking for rapidly scalable companies that can return up to 10 times their investment over a short period of time, about three to seven year period.

### 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

We are not Atlanta or Nashville, as far as large corporations or deep pockets. We have a higher net worth for cities of our size, but that doesn’t necessarily mean there are angel investors.

So, where can these companies look for next-stage funding? Most of the time you’re going to have to look outside of Chattanooga. So it’s important to have an understanding the outside market, and studying who’s funding what, who can introduce you to whom. As a founder, you’re always working on raising money and finding the right fit investors.

There’s a lot more opportunity since the pandemic, and the rise of remote work, to syndicate your startup virtually with investor groups. Groups like VentureSouth do this all the time. Most investment groups now offer opportunities get on a Zoom call and pitch your company, in Chattanooga doesn’t negate the ability to raise capital, but the pool of funds here is still relatively small.

We also have groups like LaunchTN, a statewide organization that supports these entrepreneur centers like Co.Lab. Local entrepreneurs can apply for matching funding if they have raised some capital from other investors. Most states don’t have such an organization

that will “double down” on companies that are experiencing success. So that gives us an advantage, too — added value for startups here that other states don’t have.

### 1. What criteria or qualities do you seek in potential investments? What sectors or industries are of particular interest to your firm?

When meeting with founders, we specifically look for customer traction and validation, a well thought-out business model that compliments the industry they serve, and a strong exit strategy with supporting comps. We take pride that we are a generalist when it comes to investing. With our large pool of expertise from our group, we strive to invest in multiple, diverse industries.

### 2. Are there any emerging trends in the business landscape that you anticipate will impact investment strategies, especially within Chattanooga?

In Chattanooga, the trend impacting investments are the city’s transformation into a “smart city” with advanced connectivity. This includes the deployment of a citywide fiber-optic network and the upcoming roll-out of quantum service connectivity. These developments are likely to attract investments towards technology-focused sectors, particularly in areas like Internet of Things, smart grids and smart city solutions.

### 3. What advice would you give to local entrepreneurs seeking investment or looking to grow their businesses?

Storytelling is a huge part of an entrepreneur’s journey. We have met with thousands of startups, all with a pretty good idea/solution but many who couldn’t articulate it.

We always recommend that founders truly know their story. Sharing your story allows you to refine it further.

### 4. What is the startup climate in Chattanooga in terms of funding? Is there enough money here for companies to scale?

Chattanooga’s infrastructure and initiatives to become a smart city indicate a growing climate for tech startups. We have reviewed several startups in the local area that are involved in an accelerator or with LaunchTN, one of which we invested in. The Southeast has been historically underserved as it relates to early stage risk capital, but that tide is certainly shifting. This is why Venturesouth exists; we believe there are fundable companies in this region, as well as the capital here to support them.



Bridge

After a weak jump, bid one higher


Yesterday, we saw what would have been an effective atypical preemptive opening bid. If the opponents are going to produce wild leaps into the stratosphere, you need to know how to defend yourself. Look at the North hand in the diagram. South opens one spade, and West intervenes with three diamonds, a weak jump overall. What should North do?

Yes, West's bid would normally feature only a six-card suit, but he was swayed by the unfavorable vulnerability and also wondered if his side might make three no-trump.

After a weak jump overcall, responder, with support for partner's major, should bid one level higher than originally intended.

Here, a three-spade response would promise a normal single raise. With this actual game-invitational limit raise, North correctly jumped to four spades. And if his hand had been even stronger, he would have cue-bid four diamonds, which would have said nothing about his holding in diamonds.

Against four spades,



West led the heart five. East won with his king and cashed the ace, West dropping a sneaky two. When East led another heart, South was not sure what to do. Discarding risked West's ruffing with a low trump. Then the spade ace would have been the setting trick. Eventually, South ruffed with his spade king, and West inwardly smiled when he followed suit. However, when West took the next trick with his spade ace, he was employed.

He tried the club eight, but dummy's nine forced out East's queen. South won with his king, drew trumps, and claimed four spades, one heart (dummy's queen), one diamond, three clubs and a diamond ruff in the dummy.

That was nice they told us a bit about the plumber, but then I wondered if they sent the info so we could vet him. You know, make sure he was legit and not some unscrupulous impostor working his way into the house to

The way to overcome the slavery of negative emotions is to change the way we think. We must pray and ask God to help us understand that tactics and strategies are being used against us to defeat us.



## Yes, Joe Biden is an 'On Eagle's Wings' American Catholic

With its lilting pop melody and sweet God talk, "On Eagle's Wings" is the hymn that conservative Catholics love to hate and Catholic progressives often wave like a red flag. President Joe Biden loves it.

"My prayer, my hope is we continue to believe our best days are ahead of us — that as a nation we continue to believe in honesty, decency, dignity and respect. We see each other not as enemies but as fellow human beings, each made in the image of God, each precious in his sight," said Biden at the National Prayer Breakfast.

Before his latest nod to "On Eagle's Wings," the president stressed that Americans "believe everyone deserves a fair shot. We give hate no safe harbor. ... In my church, we've taken the 22nd Psalm and turned it into a hymn. And it says, 'And he will raise you up on eagle's wings and bear you on the breath of dawn and make you to shine like the sun. Until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of his hand.' ...

"We have really tough, tough differences. ... But remember — let's remember who the hell we are. We're the United States of America. It's all about dignity and respect."

Actually, Father Jan Michael Jonas based this folk Mass hymn on Psalm 91, the Book of Exodus and the Gospel of St. Matthew. The White House transcript corrected many gaffes in the 81-year-old Biden's talk but missed that biblical detail.

Few would deny that "On Eagle's Wings" has become an American Catholic standard, especially during funerals. Biden quoted the hymn in his 2020 victory-night address, and it was performed during the 2015 funeral Mass for his son Beau.

"The 'On Eagle's Wings' debate was never just about a hymn. It was about whether Catholics will rip each other apart during the Biden presidency," wrote Father Bill McCormick in the Jesuit journal *America* in early 2021 — just weeks into that presidency.

Attitudes about this hymn underlined real differences, he stressed. "Indeed, by President Biden's inauguration, the disagreements had extended to the U.S. bishops. After Archbishop Jose Gomez issued a statement that criticized Mr. Biden's support for abortion rights on the day of his inauguration, Cardinal Blase Cupich publicly rebuked the president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, calling his

statement 'ill-considered.'

The challenge for Biden in the Prayer Breakfast talk, and in the tense 2024 White House campaign, is addressing moral issues in ways that resonate with as many Catholics as possible, while still appealing to Protestant voters in his party's base.

This is tricky territory, noted political scientist Ryan Burge, because voters who are religiously unaffiliated or secular are now the Democratic party's largest faith bloc. While 17% of Democrats are "evangelicals," in a variety of racial groups, the number of active Catholics in the party has declined sharply, especially among white Catholics, he noted in his *Graphs About Religion* online newsletter.

There are also clear trends indicating that Democrats attend worship services in much smaller numbers than before. But the big story, Burge stressed, is "the nones. That's the future of the Democratic party. ...

"In 2020, 13% of Biden's voters were atheists, 10% were agnostics and 22% were nothing in particular. That's 45% of the Democratic coalition being nones now. I don't think it's a stretch to think that half of the Democrats who vote in 2028 (or even 2024) will be nones."

This affects how candidates discuss religion. Before the 2020 election, Burge "scraped" the Twitter (now X) accounts of Democratic candidates in primaries and, out of 58,000 tweets, found 69 references to "Islam," 61 to "Muslim," 59 to "Christian," 15 to "Jesus" and 11 to "Bible."

President Biden's Prayer Breakfast text mentioned "antisemitism" and "Islamophobia," with zero references to "Catholic" or "Jesus."

The president did note that "Scripture tells us, 'The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness'" and spoke of a "covenant" that continues to hold America together.

"We're the beacon to the world. The entire world looks to us," he said. "That's not hyperbole. This is an idea. This idea was made real before the soul became flesh, before this dream became a fact. It was prayed for, it was hoped for, it was believed in. That's the story of America."

## Are human rights a fantasy?

In a TEDx talk years ago, Israeli historian Yuval Noah Harari made the startling claim that human rights do not exist.

"[H]uman rights are just like heaven and like God: It's just a fictional story that we've invented and spread around. ... It is not a biological reality, just as jellyfish and woodpeckers and ostriches have no rights. ... Take a human, cut him open, look inside — you find their blood, and you find the heart and lungs and kidneys, but you don't find there any rights. The only place you find rights is in the fictional stories that humans have invented and spread around."

Recently, Harari's talk resurfaced on the site formerly known as Twitter and sparked a lively debate among Tom Holland, author of "Dominion"; Glen Scrivener, an Anglican priest and author of "The Air We Breathe"; and Jordan Peterson, the Canadian psychologist who wrote "12 Rules for Life." Scrivener took issue with Harari's materialism and called his remarks about human rights "nonsense." Rights are indeed faith-based, he said, but that doesn't make them any less real.

Tom Holland, who is not a Christian, responded that while he believes in human rights, they are not self-evident. Rather, they require an act of subjective belief. "Human rights have no more objective reality than, say, the Trinity," wrote Holland. "Both derive from the workings of Christian theology; and both, if they are to be believed in, require people to make a leap of faith."

Jordan Peterson disagreed, and responded in somewhat jumbled psychological lingo that rights are somehow "built into the structure of human being[s]" and are therefore "[n]ot arbitrary at all." Holland shot back that if rights really are somehow "built into" reality, it's awfully strange that the concept of

human rights only emerged around the 12th century in a specifically Christian and Western political context.

The whole exchange was fascinating and instructive. For example, if the idea that human rights are not universal seems strange, that just shows how deeply Western you are. For most of history, as Holland described in his book "Dominion," the idea that humans have "self-evident" rights to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness" would have been baffling. "A Roman would have laughed at it."

Yet today, "rights" language is central to our way of life. It was at the heart of the United Nations' 1948 Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which asserted, following the Holocaust, that "inherent dignity" and "equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family" are "the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world." Obviously, the UN declaration was inspired by the Declaration of Independence, which also called rights self-evident but went further to name their source: a Creator who endowed people with "certain inalienable rights."

If true, then human rights are indeed universal. However, that doesn't mean these rights will be universally recognized. For example, what of those civilizations that do not acknowledge a Creator, or even that Creator? And what of the increasingly secular, post-Christian West? Can the idea of human rights be long sustained, much less enforced globally if God is no longer acknowledged? If there is no one to endow human rights, how can everyone be expected to honor them? There remains widespread agreement that genocide, terrorism and

slavery are wrong, but by what authority will we continue to agree?

Glenn Scrivener offered the best answer to these questions. "Rights indeed belong to all — that's the nature of them," he said. "But they've also come from somewhere particular." The source is not just any God, but the God who specifically became man in Jesus Christ, forever ennobling human nature and sparking the Christian revolution that would shape the West and inspire this declaration, that all are "created equal."

It's vital to note that Jesus did not invent the sanctity of life, the love of neighbor or the inherent value of each individual human during his earthly ministry. Rather, through his life, obedience, death and resurrection, he restored this concept that is inherent in creation, established by God's own words, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness."

At the heart of Christianity is the claim that our Savior is also our Creator. The idea that humans have inherent, eternal value is a truth Christianity gives back to a fallen world. This claim and the rights inferred from it are real and universal precisely because the God who first made the world and us is.

As the West loses touch with this God, it will also lose grasp on the concept of human rights. Scrivener warned, a dark "pit" awaits those who adopt Harari's view of morality. In the days to come, only Christians, who first gave the West its concept of rights, will be able to declare them with any authority. That, at least, should be self-evident by now.

## SAFEST PLACE IN THE WORLD

ALAN GRATZ’S NEW NOVEL FOR YOUNG READERS  
EXPLORES THE EVENTS OF DEC. 7, 1941

“HEROES: A NOVEL OF PEARL HARBOR” by Alan Gratz (Scholastic Press, 272 pages, \$19).


“I was afraid. Of pretty much everything. There were a hundred ways to die at Pearl Harbor,” admits 13-year-old Frank, the main character and narrator of “Heroes,” the latest in Alan Gratz’s series of action-packed historical novels for young readers.

Frank’s father is a pilot posted at the Naval Air Station in Hawaii. It’s Dec. 6, 1941 — the day before the “date which will live in infamy” — and Frank isn’t worried about a Japanese air attack on the U.S. Pacific Fleet. He’s worried about more common things to fear when you live on an island, such as drowning, sharks, giant eels and stinging jellyfish. He’s even keeping a watchful eye on the local volcanoes.

An overly cautious kid from birth, Frank has been made even more fearful by a violent episode from his past. When his best friend Stanley stands up to classmates bullying a younger child, Frank is unable to come to his aid in the ensuing fight and worries that Stanley will never forgive him. He and Stanley share a love of comic books and are creating their own superhero comic, so Frank is crushed when Stanley later asks, “How do you think you can write about heroes if you can’t be one yourself?”

When the historic attack on Pearl Harbor begins the next day, practically in his own backyard, Frank is launched on a classic hero’s journey, during which he confronts his fear and, despite some missteps, finds that his compassion is even stronger. When the planes arrive, Frank and Stanley are touring the USS Utah. “I felt an electric thrill standing on the deck of a real battleship,” Frank says. “It felt powerful. Invincible. Like the safest place in the world.” Moments later enemy planes appear and drop torpedoes headed straight for them.

When a Japanese plane strafes the deck, Frank freezes: “A voice inside me was screaming to run, to duck,



to hide, but I couldn’t move. ... This was every one of my nightmares come true all at once.” With help, Frank and Stanley escape from the sinking ship into the water, and what follows is a series of life-and-death challenges that test Frank to his core. Later, from his neighborhood on nearby Ford Island, he watches in shocked disbelief as a bomb ignites the ammunition room of the nearest battleship: “I saw the USS Arizona rise up out of the water in

a giant fireball. It bent, and buckled, and then the six-hundred-foot, thirty-thousand-ton steel battleship snapped in half like a twig, falling back to earth in pieces.”

Soon after, when bullies threaten Stanley and his mom, refusing to allow them into the safety of a bunker because they are Japanese Americans, Frank makes a different choice. “There was a part of me that wanted to run even now. A big part of me,” he admits.” But there was an

even bigger part of me that knew that standing up for my friend was right. That this was a good fight. One worth getting hurt for.”

Gratz, a Knoxville native, excels in imagining important events in history, from war to terrorism to climate change, from the point of view of young observers. In “Heroes,” Frank and Stanley find themselves caught up in a monumental tragedy — sudden violent death on a catastrophic scale — and they are changed by it. Gratz doesn’t shrink from describing the actual events of that shocking day, but he’s careful not to completely overwhelm his characters or his audience. Bodies are seen floating in the water — even one character known to the boys — and body parts are scattered all around them by the USS Arizona explosion, but neither is described in graphic detail.

Instead, Gratz chooses to highlight the remarkable heroism of the sailors, the contributions of women and people of color, and the inexcusable treatment of Japanese Americans in the aftermath of the attack, including the consequences for Stanley and his family. Gratz’s genius lies in honestly depicting stories of conflict and horror with respect and understanding while allowing the events themselves to speak to young readers about courage and cowardice and the ways people are tested when the worst happens, whether in wartime or everyday life.



**W**arning: What you are about to read is morbid. That's because this is about, well, morbidity.

Specifically, this is about what happens if the presidential candidate of a major political party dies. Or becomes incapacitated. Or, for whatever reason, drops out of the race.

In 2024, this is more than just a hypothetical. The all-but-certain Democratic and Republican nominees will be 81 and 78 years old, respectively, on Election Day. That makes President Biden and former President Donald Trump the two oldest party front-runners in U.S. history by far.

Both have outlived the average life expectancy for men in this country. And both

have committed gaffes and made missteps that raise doubts about whether they are as sharp as they once were. While Biden's doctor has pronounced him healthy and vigorous, he looks and acts frailer than he did four years ago — an apparent decline that special counsel Robert K. Hur highlighted in his recent report on the president's mishandling of classified material. But even before the special counsel's assessment, most voters were saying that Biden's age and fitness were their greatest concerns about giving him a second term; this anxiety shows up in just about every poll. Trump, while more energetic than Biden, is only a few years younger, and has a predilection for taking extended departures from rationality.

That Republicans and Democrats are raging at each other about whose candidate shows more serious signs of dementia tells you pretty much everything you need to know about why age matters in 2024.

It turns out there are rules in place — albeit untested ones — to deal with the unthinkable but not implausible. But they apply differently depending on when a sudden vacancy occurs between now and Inauguration Day. Here's how things are supposed to work under various scenarios, and who the key deciders would be:

#### 1 IF THERE IS A CALAMITY BETWEEN NOW AND THE PARTY CONVENTIONS

As things look now, both Biden and Trump are likely to have accumulated enough delegates to claim

their respective nominations by mid-March. But that won't become official until their parties meet this summer for their conventions — the Republicans beginning July 15 in Milwaukee, and the Democrats starting Aug. 19 in Chicago.

So what happens if a presumed nominee, by choice or otherwise, doesn't make it that far? Let's start with some history: On March 31, 1968, then-President Lyndon B. Johnson made the shocking announcement that he would not seek or accept his party's nomination for another term. Back then, only 14 states and the District of Columbia held primaries that gave ordinary voters any say in who their nominee would be. In the other states, party bosses — mayors, governors, ward leaders, local chairs and the like — controlled the levers. These local party insiders engineered things so that Vice President Hubert Humphrey got the Democratic nomination, despite not having competed in a single primary.

The turmoil of 1968 — which saw violent confrontations between police and antiwar protesters on the streets outside the Democratic convention hall in Chicago — brought a

movement to bring the nominating process out of the backrooms and into the open. For their own reasons, not the least of which was generating more public interest and engagement, Republicans implemented reforms as well. By 1972, the modern system of state-by-state primaries and caucuses was nearly in place.

So were rules to govern possible eventualities that would disrupt that process. Yet it should also be remembered that the parties begin their conventions by voting on their rules — which means all these procedures could be thrown out the window should a crisis hit.

There are roughly 2,400 Republican delegates and 4,000 Democratic delegates. "These people can be teachers or labor union members or evangelical Christians or right to life activists. What they all have in common is some degree of activism on behalf of their political party, even if they generally are unknown to the public," writes Elaine Kamarck, director of the Brookings Institution's Center for Effective Public Management and the author of "Primary Politics," an authoritative guide to how the nominating process works.

Most of them arrive at the convention pledged to support a specific candidate, but the current rules of both parties stipulate that convention delegates pledged to someone who is no longer running become free agents. Thus would begin a frenzied courtship of the up-for-grabs delegates.

If Trump or Biden were to step aside, other contenders would seize the opportunity to jump into the race. If, say, Biden were to drop out, it is easy to imagine that Vice President Harris would quickly declare her candidacy, along with California Gov. Gavin Newsom and perhaps other rising stars, such as governors Gretchen Whitmer of Michigan and J.B. Pritzker of Illinois.

As uncommitted delegates ponder their options, states such as Pennsylvania, which hold their primaries late in the calendar, would go from being irrelevant to becoming important gauges of voter sentiment that could help guide the delegates. Because of that, their secretaries of state might consider proposing new filing deadlines — or even rescheduling their primaries — so that late entrants

## Time to ask for an Endangered Competent Congress Act

As a regular op-ed contributor to newspapers in 39 states, I read a lot of various and sundry topics, seeking opportunities to craft a research-based message that might be of interest to readers.

A while back I read that 2023 marked the 50th anniversary of the Endangered Species Act. Soon after, a friend referred me to a 2013 Huffington Post article by Diane Dimon titled, "There ought to be a law against an 'incompetent' Congress."

After reflecting on these two topics — endangered species and an incompetent Congress — a little humor entered the noggin, research ensued and a serious column came to fruition. Let me explain.

The ESA has saved 99% of our 2,300 endangered wildlife species and their habitats (e.g., bald eagle, peregrine falcon, gray wolf, etc.). Congress last reauthorized

ESA funding in 1992. But doing so again would be a challenge because reauthorization would require a competent Congress to take action. As Hamlet would say, "ay, there's the rub!"

Despite rising polarization in Congress, researchers with the Center for Effective Lawmaking found, in longitudinal studies, legislative effectiveness is heightened when bipartisanship exists.

Historians reveal we've had many competent members of Congress touted for their bipartisanship, including Daniel Webster, Henry Clay, Robert La Follette, Robert Taft, Ted Kennedy, Margaret Chase Smith, Nancy Kassebaum, William Proxmire, Henry Cabot Lodge, Sam Rayburn, and — saving the best for last — John McCain and Tip O'Neill.

Truly bipartisan lawmakers are

# Future mayor kept things ‘moving’ in city

His name was Charles A. Rose, but Chattanoogaans remember him as “Pat,” a tall, dark-haired traffic engineer who became Chattanooga’s mayor in 1975.

Pat Rose was born in Orlando, Florida, in 1930, but he always considered himself a Georgia boy after the family moved to Rockmart in the northwestern part of the state when he was 5. He graduated from Rockmart High School, attended Georgia Institute of Technology, and then honed his skills in traffic engineering through specialized courses for the next decade. In 1954, Rose joined Atlanta city government, where he oversaw its traffic signal system — coordinating more than 500 lights needed to handle the ever-increasing traffic, Atlanta’s “gift” to commuting students and workers. Additionally, he undertook modernization of major intersections and became an asset to the planning and design division, spending the next 10 years of his career masterminding the city’s ever-evolving system.

In 1964, when the assistant traffic engineer position in Chattanooga was announced, Rose thought it would be a “grand opportunity ... to deal with traffic engineering from another

point of view.” He applied for the job and was hired. In the new position, Rose was charged with developing the technical and city-based information necessary to secure state and federal funding for infrastructure planning, improvements and maintenance. In addition to coordinating with governmental funding agencies, he worked closely with and under the direction of the Chattanooga City Commission.

When asked about aspects of the job by Springer Gibson, a Chattanooga Times reporter, Rose displayed his slow, easy smile. He explained that for an official to get “genuine satisfaction out of a job, that person must feel that what is done in the job is worthwhile” and “is helpful to other people.” He further noted that he was most comfortable working as part of a larger group that was united by a common goal and “enjoyed their work.” Relationships were key: “I do feel that the organizational attitude is important. If you don’t have it, then it would be difficult to execute the responsibilities of this job.” When further quizzed about “Why Chattanooga?” the future mayor mentioned his family and the welcoming community. He then pinpointed Chattanooga’s forward-thinking leadership since the 1940s. “I believe

this is one of the most progressive city administrations ... it makes you proud to be part of the organization.”

Within five years, Pat Rose was appointed Chattanooga’s commissioner of public works by Mayor A.L. “Chunk” Bender, who had held the position, and gained a reputation as a man who could be trusted — possessing “qualities of friendliness, of thoughtfulness and of a capacity to listen to the other fellow’s point of view ... a gentle man and a humble man, but a strong man.” He was sworn into his office after the Rev. Ansell T. Baker, pastor of Central Baptist Church, offered a prayer for the Rose family and the city. Rose

spoke briefly acknowledging that his strength was derived from his family, his faith and his belief that “basically good government has in its background citizen involvement, professional competence and integrity on each person’s part.” With those words, the new commissioner thanked his supporters and Evelyn McBryar, his secretary who had previously served Mayor Ralph Kelley, hugged his family and cleared the office so he could begin work.

When he announced his candidacy for public works commissioner in late December 1970 (for the 1971 election), Rose cited the department’s accomplishments since his appointment

23 months earlier. It would be his first political campaign. The candidate admitted that he anticipated “a great deal of hard work in the coming months” but was thankful for the support that Chattanoogaans had given him: “I am definitely convinced that I can continue to be a responsible person in attempting to serve the needs of citizens of the city of Chattanooga in a fair and equitable manner.” There were political pundits who wondered if Rose’s previous support for “consolidated government” might have lessened enthusiasm for his election, but he successfully and easily won his first campaign.

Pat Rose’s endorsement of consolidated government spoke to the future mayor’s core values. In discussing the work of an ongoing charter commission, he said, “My own hope is that our thoughts will be restricted ... not to how we personally will be affected, but rather what will best serve the needs of our children ... I sincerely urge each citizen to cast a vote that represents his true feelings ... ”

The citizens spoke — “No” on consolidated government but “yes” for Pat Rose.

could compete. There is precedent for them to do that; in 2020, 16 states juggled their calendars, some of them multiple times, because of the coronavirus pandemic.

“The outcome will be a convention where the result may not be known ahead of time. In other words, it will be the kind of no-holds-barred event that nominating conventions held between 1831 and 1968,” Kamarck writes.

What happened back then wasn’t always pretty. The 1912 Republican convention was a brawl in which former president Theodore Roosevelt unsuccessfully tried to snatch the nomination from his own handpicked successor, William Howard Taft, by claiming that some delegations were fraudulently seated. The high-water mark for chaos, however, was the 1924 Democratic convention, when it took 103 ballots to come up with dark horse John W. Davis of West Virginia as the presidential nominee.

Not since the epic 1976 GOP primary battle between Gerald Ford and Ronald Reagan have delegates arrived for a convention with the nomination in doubt. That one got settled in Ford’s favor on the first ballot.

But all of that was before the modern forces of social media, big money and high-tech disinformation reshaped the nature of politics, bringing in new players. Republican lawyer Benjamin Ginsberg, a leading Republican expert on election law, says it would not be accurate to call what could happen today an old-style “brokered” convention, because in today’s politics, it’s not clear who would play the role of broker, calling the shots the way state chairmen, ward bosses and senior elected officials once did. The wishes of establishment figures matter not at all to the populist wings in either party at the moment, and any effort by traditional

forces to instill order these days might be met with only more bedlam.

The demise of Trump would create an especially large vacuum in the GOP. There is no obvious heir to bring order and authority to what he would leave behind. “Are the delegates going to listen to Eric Trump?” Ginsberg asks. “I don’t think so.”

### 2 IF THE UNTHINKABLE HAPPENS AFTER THE CONVENTION BUT BEFORE THE ELECTION

Should the party’s presidential nominee prove unable to make it to November, both Democrats and Republicans put the choice of a replacement in the hands of their national committees. Which means — surprise — the nomination wouldn’t automatically go to the running mate.

This process was used once before, in different circumstances. In August 1972 — just weeks after the Democratic convention — vice-presidential nominee Thomas Eagleton dropped out after disclosing he had been hospitalized multiple times during the 1960s for nervous exhaustion and depression. The Democratic National Committee, which had 275 members back then, met in Washington and voted to replace him with a new nominee, Sargent Shriver, the first director of the Peace Corps and an in-law of the Kennedy family.

Who are these national committee members? They are party insiders, mostly elected by their state organizations. The Republican National Committee has close to 170 members, including the party chairman, plus a committeeman and committeewoman, for each state and territory. The Democratic National Committee is much larger, with 453 members.

How they would go about selecting a new nominee is spelled out in each party’s rules. It is a pretty straightforward proposition for the DNC, whose membership is apportioned loosely

according to the size of a state’s population. For the Republicans, the vote to select a new nominee can involve some complicated math. Rule No. 9 of the GOP bylaws stipulates the RNC members representing any state get to cast as many votes as their state did at the convention, but that if any state’s members disagreed, their votes would get sliced up, potentially even into fractions.

### 3 IF DISASTER BEFALLS A PRESIDENT-ELECT BEFORE THE ELECTORAL COLLEGE MEETS

As most people know, we don’t vote for our presidents directly. In November, we cast our ballots for slates of electors, as spelled out in Article II, Section 1 of the U.S. Constitution. There are 538 electors in all, one for each U.S. senator and House member, plus three for the District of Columbia. How they are picked varies, but their selection is generally done at state party conventions.

After some preliminaries, they meet in their respective states on the first Tuesday after the second Wednesday in December — this year, that’s Dec. 17 — and elect the president and vice president.

It is a rare elector who votes other than the way his state did. In fact, 29 states plus the District of Columbia require them to follow the wishes of their state’s voters. “They are not expected to think for themselves or to negotiate, which is not to say that they wouldn’t under extraordinary circumstances,” Kamarck writes.

And as we saw in 2020, there were allegedly felonious schemes in at least six states to put together illegitimate slates of “fake electors.” So imagine the turmoil — and potential for double-dealing — if the electors themselves become, essentially, free agents.

State legislatures might also seek to intervene, and even contravene the will of their voters, by naming their

own slates of electors.

### 4 IF SOMETHING HAPPENS BETWEEN THE ELECTORAL COLLEGE VOTE AND INAUGURATION DAY

This one is easy, or should be: Under the 25th Amendment, the vice president-elect gets the job. Then he or she submits to Congress a nominee for vice president, who takes office upon receiving a majority vote by both houses.

On the brighter side, actuaries say the two most elderly presidential front-runners in U.S. history can probably go the distance. Neither Biden nor Trump smokes or drinks. Both have access to excellent health care. That means that all of these scenarios, thankfully, remain long shots, and both parties seem pretty set on these two men.

Changing leaders in unexpected circumstances, whatever the rules say, would be difficult and traumatic for both parties, and neither one has a clear alternative waiting in the wings. For now, they have narrowed their most likely choices to presidential candidates would serve as octogenarians.

The “age question” is not a new one in presidential politics. It dogged Reagan, though he was not yet 70 when he was inaugurated for the first time. Reagan was diagnosed with Alzheimer’s after he was out of office, but there continues to be speculation that he was showing signs of the disease when he was president. In 1995, as Republican contender Bob Dole reached his 72nd birthday, the cover of Time magazine asked: “Is Dole too old for the job?”

“I tell you what, I feel sharper now than I did 20 years ago,” Trump said recently. And when questions about Biden’s age have been raised, the president has retorted, “Watch me.” One thing that both of them can be sure of: Anxious voters will be doing just that in the months ahead.

becoming extinct. It’s time for citizens to petition the government to enact the Endangered Competent Congress Act of 2024. But, we’d need a competent House, Senate and president to take action; we’ve not witnessed such a breed in decades.

A June 2013 Gallup survey found only 17% of their respondents approved of Congress’ performance. How’s Congress performing 10 years later? At the end of 2023, Congress’ approval rating stood at a mere 15%.

How bad is Congress? Here are some December 2023 headlines that sum it up: “America and the terrible, horrible, no good very bad Congress” (Fox News). “Worst Congress Ever?” (The Fiscal Times). “Farewell to one of the dumbest years in Congressional history” (Politico). “Worst. Congress. Ever.” (The Washington Post). “Capitol Hill stunner: 2023 led to fewest laws in decades” (Axios). “A look back at how awful politics was in 2023” (The Wall Street Journal). “This horrible Congress is even worse than you thought” (The New Republic).

Ten years ago, Dimond noted the average salary for most members of Congress was \$174,000 per year plus each lawmaker received over \$1.3 million per year for office expenses. She wrote, “Now, let’s multiply that by the 535 members of lackluster, partisan-paralyzed Congress and you get a grand total that tops \$818 million. So, what do you think? You think we’re getting our almost billion dollars’ worth of leadership? Yeah, me neither.”

Today, congressional salaries and allowances amount to \$975,540,000. The average American works 240 days a year; the House was scheduled to meet for 117 days

in 2023 while senators worked 154 days.

To regain trust and confidence in our representatives to D.C., plus force them to work together on behalf of their constituents (hey, that’s a novel idea) and create a more effective Congress, we must begin by reelecting those willing to pursue bipartisan solutions and de-hiring the bottom of the barrel.

Check out the non-partisan Bipartisan Index produced by the Lugar Center and McCourt School at Georgetown. Bipartisanship scores for members of the Senate and House are listed in rank as well as alphabetical order. Reflect on the ranking of your two senators and House members, plus the lowest ranking legislators in both chambers.

Not surprisingly, lawmakers in the top tier of both chambers’ rankings are about equally divided between Democrats and Republicans. Names of the least bipartisan will be quite familiar; extremists, rabble rousers and whiners to a fault.

Before the Nov. 5 election, let’s campaign to get rid of 20% of the bottom-feeder and least cooperating members of Congress — regardless of their party affiliation. They’ve proven they can’t or won’t work across the aisle. “Party before people” and “After me, you come first” are their mantras. If we cleaned the deck of congressional bottom-feeders, politicians and party leaders would quickly get the message. Bipartisanship would ensue to restore an effective and productive legislative body.

Are you with me or against me in having a more functional and productive Congress? You get to decide on Nov. 5.

### Not much equitable in stadium proposal

The question raised in the Chattanooga Times Jan. 15 editorial, "Is equitable development a priority with new Lookouts stadium?" has not been answered, in my view. David Floyd's Feb. 10, 2023, "Not Enough Space" report added further food for thought. Open sources show MLB's total revenue in 2023 was \$11 billion, and the collective worth of the 30 franchises is \$70 billion. All of the owners are billionaires. Yet MLB has the gall to set standards for minor league stadiums and expects cities to help foot the bill to upgrade or build them? Lookouts President Rich Mozingo says, "Major League Baseball doesn't send players from the Cincinnati Reds to Chattanooga to entertain us. They send them down here so they can prepare them to be Cincinnati Reds so they can be prepared to play for the major leagues." A \$129 million — and growing — new stadium isn't going to produce better players any quicker than AT&T Field. So, who benefits?

There is a critical shortage of affordable housing in the county. The Reds' 2023 payroll was about \$82 million, fifth lowest in the league. How much does a cheap billionaire pay his players and staff? Where will they and the backbone of our community — our teachers, firemen, policemen and hourly employees — find affordable housing in the next five to 10 years? It doesn't appear they will live anywhere near the proposed new stadium.

### KILLING THE MESSENGER A POLITICAL MAINSTAY

In the 1990s, someone wrote in The Weekly Standard — it may well have been Matt Labash — that for conservatives to triumph, they had to attack the messenger rather than the message. His advice was to go after the media, not the news.

Attacking the messenger was all well and good for the neoconservatives. Still, their less-thoughtful successors, MAGA supporters, are killing the messenger.

The press — always identified as the “liberal media” — is now often seen, due to relentless denigration, as a force for evil, a malicious contestant on the other side.

No matter that there is no liberal media beyond what has been fabricated from political ectoplasm. Traditionally, most proprietors have been conservative, and many, but not most reporters, have been liberal.

It surprises people to learn that when you work in a large newsroom, you don’t know the political opinions of most of your colleagues. I have worked in many newsrooms over the decades and tended to know more about my colleagues’ love lives than their voting preferences.

This philosophy of “kill the messenger” might work briefly, but down the road, the problem is no messenger, no news, no facts. The next stop is anarchy and chaos — you might say, politics circa 2024.

Add to that social media and its capacity to spread innuendo, half-truth, fabrication and common ignorance.

There is someone who writes to me almost weekly about media’s failures — and I assume, ergo, my failure — and he won’t be mollified. To him, that irregular army of individuals who make a living reporting are members of a pernicious cult. To him, there is a shadow world of the media.

I have stopped remonstrating with him on that point. On other issues, he is lucid and has views worth knowing on the Middle East and Ukraine.

That poses the question: How come he knows about these things? The answer, of course, is that he read about them, saw the news on television or heard it on radio.

Reporters in Gaza and Ukraine risk their lives, and sometimes lose them, to tell the world what is going on in these and other very dangerous places. No one accuses them of being left or right of center.

But send the same journalists to cover the White House, and they are assumed to be unreliable propagandists, devoid of judgment, integrity or common decency.

We make mistakes. We live in terror of that. An individual here and there may fabricate. Some may indeed have political agendas; the reader or listener will soon twig that.


The political turmoil we are going through is partly a result of media denigration. People believe what they want to believe; they can seize any spurious supposition and hold it close as a revealed truth.

You can, for example, believe that ending natural gas development in the United States will lead to carbon reduction worldwide, or you can believe that the Jan. 6, 2021, insurrection with loss of life and the trashing of the nation’s great Capitol Building was an act of free speech.

One of the more dangerous ideas dancing around is that social media and citizen journalists can replace professional journalists. No, no, a thousand times no! We need the media with the resources to hire excellent journalists to cover local and national news, and to send, or station, staff around the world.

Have you seen anyone covering the news from Ukraine or Gaza on social media? There is commentary and more commentary on social media sites, all based on the reporting of those in danger and on the spot.

This is a trade of imperfect operators but an essential one. For better or for worse, we are the messengers.

### GOV. LEE’S PUBLIC, PRIVATE EDUCATION DICHOTOMY

Gov. Bill Lee’s actions on public education reflect a bizarre dichotomy. On the one hand, the Republican governor has increased funding for public education by more than \$1.8 billion, the most in our state’s history.

But Lee, midway through his second (and final) term, also has not been shy about his support for private education, evidenced by his push to expand a voucher program, currently priced at \$141 million. The program will give families in Tennessee a \$7,000 voucher they can use to attend a private school.

GOP and Democratic legislators have criticized the voucher expansion.

Still, Lee is confident that giving parents more choice about what school their children will attend will lead to better educational outcomes.

In his State of the State address on Feb. 5, Lee shared what he considers to be wins for public education while giving an outline of his administration’s investment next year, which includes an increase in teacher pay, \$2.5 million to strengthen student reading and phonics skills and \$30 million for summer learning programs.

“As a father who sent his child to public school, with grandkids in public school, and as governor — visiting countless schools across the state — I feel very strongly that public schools are invaluable,” Lee said.

If public schools are so invaluable, then why not pump more money into them? Why not invest more?

Lee maintains his voucher program will not harm public schools and will not bleed money away from them. But educators and teachers are not convinced.

At least 33 school boards — from among the state’s 141 school districts — so far have approved resolutions opposing the voucher program, also known as the Education Freedom Scholarship Act, according to the Tennessee Organization of School Superintendents. Hamilton County has not done so yet.

Opposition to the voucher expansion is not limited to the left. A poll conducted by Co/efficient and Tennessee Education Association on Jan. 4 through Jan. 8 showed only 30% of Republican primary voters support the voucher program.

#### HIGHS AND LOWS

In his State of the State address, Lee noted teachers received the largest annual pay raise in state history. He also promised to make another significant investment in Tennessee Investment Student Achievement (TISA) this year.

TISA is the new K-12 funding formula that was created by

Lee and then-Commissioner of Education Penny Schwinn. It replaced the longtime — and beleaguered — Basic Education Program, BEP, funding formula.

The main difference between the two is the BEP formula is calculated on resources used by schools and districts, then scaled to size based on student enrollment. TISA is calculated on a per-student scale, meaning that it uses student enrollment and their individual learning needs.

This investment by Lee and legislative leadership is sorely needed.

But consider also it’s been two years since the governor decided it was best to partner with conservative Christian institution Hillsdale College to create charter schools.

This Hillsdale College partnership was nothing more than Lee’s attempt to push an American exceptionalism idea onto the state. And thanks to the ill-advised words of Hillsdale’s President Larry Arnn, saying that teachers are being trained “in the dumbest parts of the dumbest colleges,” that partnership fell apart. Lee, who was with Arnn when the comments were made, never corrected him, by the way.

Then in 2019 the state passed legislation allowing vouchers to parent through the Education Saving Accounts program. This program was only for students in Memphis-Shelby County Schools and Metro Nashville Public Schools. Hamilton County Schools were added this year.

Recent Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP), test scores showed that voucher students performed worse than their public school counterparts in the 2022-23 school year. So that “choice” doesn’t appear to be serving students well.

#### THERE’S NO BALANCING ACT

Public education takes a full-on, 100% commitment from the state, counties and families. Providing quality public education is not something that can be accomplished halfway.

No matter how you put it, public education is what Tennessee needs to prioritize. If Lee wants to do something for private schools — under the guise of offering parental choice — then how about tapping the state’s beefy \$2 billion rainy day fund to pay for his voucher expansion?

Lee’s legacy will be defined by trying to walk the not-so-fine line between public school support and privatizing public education. There’s no balancing act when it comes to education. You’re either all in or not.

The more Lee tries to seek a balance, the more disingenuous he’ll look.

### SENATE AND HOUSE ARE TWO POLES OF REPUBLICAN DECAY

Republican congressional leaders are not wowing Washington with their savvy and effectiveness.

A Gallup poll found that “Democrats’ level of support for their own party’s

leaders is substantially higher than Republicans’ is for theirs.” But Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell and House Speaker Mike Johnson are struggling for very different reasons. There’s a lesson here about the GOP’s political bind and democracy itself.

The Constitution’s framers intended for the Senate to be a rarefied body — synchronized with elite sentiment, focused on the country’s long-term interests and insulated from the whims of ordinary people by its members’ six-year terms. The House, elected every two years, would be the more democratic body, acutely responsive to popular passions. Those 18th-century ideals still describe the Senate and House Republican conferences remarkably well, but they also point to the roots of the GOP’s challenges in each narrowly divided chamber.

Start with the House. The GOP in the lower chamber is now so small-d “democratic” that any one member can force a new election for speaker at any time. When Republicans took control of the House by a nine-seat

margin after the 2022 midterms, populist members forced 14 speaker votes before electing Kevin McCarthy on the 15th in exchange for procedural concessions. They removed him in a floor vote roughly nine months later. No one can say the House lacks opportunities for dissent, debate and leadership churn.

McCarthy’s successor, Johnson, was elected after three other nominees failed to get a majority. He also must operate under the shadow of a “motion to vacate.” That creates more pressure to put partisan points on the board.

That brings us to the Senate. If Johnson is a prisoner of the populists, McConnell, who leads a 49-seat Republican minority in the upper chamber, has the opposite problem: He’s perceived as detached from the party base.

At least, that was the knock on the Ukraine-border compromise released last week that he helped engineer. The elected GOP chewed up the deal and spat it out almost immediately on the grounds that the Ukraine aid was too lavish or the border provisions too soft.

House speakerships are vulnerable to collapse amid the slightest political turbulence, but the hierarchical Senate GOP has retained McConnell even as age and health problems have taken a toll on his effectiveness in the last year.

Behind all the invective about the GOP “establishment” is some policy truth. Senior Senate Republicans represent the internationalist pole of

Republican foreign-policy opinion in a party that increasingly favors retrenchment, at least in Europe. That was evident when McConnell said last February that “defeating the Russians in Ukraine is the single most important event going on in the world” — a sentiment that, whatever its validity, did not predict the priorities of the Republican electorate. A Quinnipiac poll of Republicans published in November found, in The Post’s summary, that “60 percent thought the United States was doing too much, and 11 percent thought it is doing too little to help Ukraine.”

The Senate is designed to protect members’ independent judgment from the whims of the electorate. But sometimes the conceptual gap between the two is too large to sustain. On the other side, the House is meant to reflect voter sentiment — but if reflected too directly, that sentiment can lead to chaos and incoherence.

Congressional Republican leaders are navigating both problems. Finding the right balance between deliberative judgment and popular opinion is the central challenge of constitutional democracy. As long as the personalistic Donald Trump show is center stage, the party is unlikely to reach a sustainable equilibrium. But as long as it proceeds in such a shambolic disequilibrium, it will remain vulnerable to opportunistic figures like him.

### WINDS OF CHANGE IN BLACK VOTE

Data shows that winds of political change are blowing among Black voters. In volatile times like now, predictions can be made with only the greatest caution.

However, it seems clear that something is going on, and Black voters are breaking with past voting patterns.

The New York Times reported last November that, per its polling with Siena College, 22% of Black voters in six key battleground states — Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin — indicated they would support Republican Donald Trump.

In 2020, Trump gained ground with Blacks, picking up 12% of the Black vote, up from 8% in 2016. But any

suggestion that any Republican candidate might pick up 20-plus percent of the Black vote is revolutionary.

The last time the Black vote went beyond the teens for a Republican was in 1960, when Richard Nixon got 32% of the Black vote in a close election he lost to John Kennedy.

The next election in 1964 was, for Blacks, about the Civil Rights Movement. The Republican candidate, Barry Goldwater, opposed passage of the Civil Rights Act and got 4% of the Black vote. Republicans have not recovered since.

Nixon returned and won the presidency in 1968 and 1972. However, Blacks supported him at a fraction of what he received in 1960 — Nixon getting 10% of the Black vote in 1968 and 13% in 1972.

In a USA Today/Suffolk University Poll reported in January, only 63% of Black voters indicated support for President Joe Biden, compared to 87% who voted for him in 2020.

The USA Today/Suffolk University poll shows a less compelling picture of Blacks moving toward Trump. That poll shows 12% support for Trump, exactly where he was in 2020.

However, the poll shows Black sentiment moving away from Democrats, with almost 20% of Black voters indicating they would support a third party candidate.

Now we have new data from Gallup reporting: “The Democratic Party’s wide lead over Republicans in Black Americans’ party preferences has shrunk by nearly 20 points over the past three years.”

Among Black Americans surveyed, 66% said they identify as Democrat/lean Democrat and 19% Republican/lean Republican for a differential of 47 points.

A little over three years ago in 2020, in the same survey, 77% of Black Americans identified as Democrat and 11% identified as Republican.

Overall, the 47-point differential in this latest survey is the smallest since Gallup first started doing the survey in 1999, when the differential was 72 points.

With recent elections decided by tiny margins in battleground states, a fundamental change in voting behavior by one key demographic — Blacks — can be a game changer.

The implications over the long haul are profound given demographic changes taking place, with the percentage of the white vote, which accounts for the majority of Republican votes, shrinking in each election. In 2020, whites accounted for 67% of the vote. This compared to 1980 when the white vote stood at 88%.

Per the Census Bureau, the percentage of the U.S. population that is white will be down to 45% by 2060. So, any movement of Blacks, and Hispanics, means a lot.

Why is this apparent movement happening?

Here’s one hypothesis I propose from the New York Times/Siena College Poll.

That poll shows that, relative to whites, Blacks care more about economic issues than social issues. Sixty-five percent of Blacks say economic issues are most important compared to 53% of whites. Twenty-one percent of Blacks say social issues are most important compared to 33% of whites.

Perhaps we are entering new times when fewer Blacks look to government for social justice and more want economic growth and opportunity. This means Republicans.



### AN UNNECESSARY MARRIAGE BILL

A marriage bill with all the romance of a Donald Trump judicial hearing landed on the desk of Tennessee Gov. Bill Lee on Valentine’s Day.

It simply added words to an already existing state statute, saying that individuals “shall not be required to solemnize a marriage” if they object to it based on their “conscience or religious beliefs.”

Well, guess what?

Those individuals — be they clergy members, notary publics, judges or your brother-in-law with an online certification — never had to marry any two people in the first place. No state law stipulates that someone who is asked to perform a marriage ceremony must do so.

But this unnecessary bill passed the House last year and the Senate last week and has all manner up people up in arms.

The first to mistakenly object were those who thought it allowed those public employees who issued marriage licenses to not do so if they objected to the marriage based on their personal beliefs.

“This has nothing to do with getting a license,” state Senate sponsor Mark Pody, R-Lebanon, said in a floor speech last week. “It has nothing to do with the clerk required to give a license. It just says that a person shall not be required to solemnize a marriage ... It just says those words, and that’s all there is to it.”

LGBTQ rights advocates say it is intended to keep same-sex people from getting married, a right they already have based on the 2015 United States Supreme Court decision in Obergefell v. Hodges.

“Let’s be clear — this bill is intended to exclude LGBTQ+ folks from equal protection under the law,” Molly Whitehorn, associate director of regional campaigns for the Human Rights Campaign, told The Hill.

She said the bill also could deny marriage rights to interracial couples or any couples that a public official objects to.

Whitehorn is wrong. The bill can’t deny the right to marriage to any couples — gay, straight, interracial or anyone else — who can legally marry. What it would do — which, again, can be done already — is allow anyone to refuse to perform a marriage ceremony if asked.

The bill’s House sponsor, state Rep. Monty Fritts, R-Kingston, said the real reason for the bill is to stop young people from committing elder abuse by marrying old people to access their bank accounts.

Say what?

We weren’t aware the example of the late Anna Nicole Smith had become an epidemic in Tennessee.

The bill, Fritts said, is meant to “simply and clearly protect the rights of the officiant.”

What happened to “just say no”? Unless force is involved, it’s 100% effective for sex and drugs. It should be even easier when 19-year-old Bambi comes to her local Church of God minister and asks him tie the knot between her and 97-year-old widower Mr. Periwinkle, who owns the town’s prodigious concrete company.

Officiating a wedding ceremony has none of the strings of cases in recent years in which a baker is asked to create a wedding cake for a same-sex couple or a florist requested to create an arrangement for a transitioning individual — situations that their faith doesn’t sanction.

No, clergy have been just saying no for years: The couple isn’t on the same page with their faith. The two seem to have different values. The couple is too young to get married. Their children don’t get along. The two won’t agree to counseling sessions. The church doesn’t allow me to marry them. Eight marriages make me believe the potential husband doesn’t take his vows seriously.

And for years, the next step after hearing “no” has been up to the couple. They can take seriously what the person they asked to officiate told them, and work on their relationship. Or they can find the next minister, public official or next-door-neighbor Ralph with an online certification who is willing to perform a ceremony.

The thought that it would keep same-sex couples, or couples of any linkage, from marrying is ridiculous. If two people want to get married, and can do so legally, they’ll find somebody to make it legal. And they won’t have to look very far.

Though no members of the Hamilton County delegation were co-prime sponsors of the bill in either the House or Senate, every Republican member of the delegation voted for it. The only delegation vote against it came from state Rep. Yusuf Hakeem, D-Chattanooga.

Gov. Bill Lee has 10 days to either approve or veto the bill, or let it become law without his signature. However, he has not said what he plans to do about it.

The bill is wholly unnecessary. We suggest he veto it and tell legislators to send him measures on more serious topics.

### THE PROBLEM IN LEFTIST THINKING

There are many reasons why I oppose leftism, but three come most immediately to mind.

First is the tendency of the left to sacrifice the most important classical liberal value, individual freedom (“liberty”), in its pursuit of equality of condition/outcome, initially in the form of Marx’s classless society, more recently in the form of racial proportional representation through “diversity, equity, and inclusion.”

In that sense, among the wisest observations of the relationship

between such equality and freedom came from Milton Friedman, when he noted that “A society that puts equality before freedom will get neither. A society that puts freedom before equality will get a high degree of both.”

The second is the tendency, in that futile pursuit of absolute equality in all things, for the left to sponsor the creation of a gargantuan state that can’t help but become overly intrusive and oppressive.

The third, which flows from the first two, is that the left’s infatuation with the activist state, with the political and public at the expense of the apolitical and private, prioritizes political logic over economic logic, in the process inducing economic illiteracy in leftist thinking.

This last point — that leftists don’t understand economic logic, more precisely the logic of market-based

(capitalist) economies — has the additional result of provoking hostility toward them.

A recent, but distressingly familiar, example of this illiteracy comes in the form of leftist criticism of businesses for leaving crime-ridden neighborhoods populated by “marginalized” minority groups (usually Black Americans).

More specifically, some of the usual leftist suspects, defined in this case as Democratic members of Massachusetts’ congressional delegation, have weighed in and condemned Walgreens for closing some of its stores in Roxbury, Hyde Park and other Boston areas.

Rep. Ayanna Presley claimed that the closures were “life-threatening acts of racial and economic discrimination” while Sen. Ed Markey demanded that Walgreens “provide resources to limit the harm they’ve created” by prioritizing “profits over the health of Black, Brown, and immigrant communities.”

The problems here should be rather self-evident.

Businesses don’t exist to pursue political objectives or engage in social work; they exist to make a profit by providing people with goods and services. This isn’t a matter of choice since if they were to do otherwise they would operate at a loss, go out of business, and cease to be able to provide those goods and services.

Businesses are also, at least in a free society with a market economy, private property that cannot be conscripted by ideologue politicians to serve their agendas.

By such peculiar leftist logic, corporations are evil, and companies are obligated to continue to operate in places where they are losing money and their employees are endangered because of crime because liberal Democrats think it is racist to not do so.

While it is true that not all Democrats embraced “defund the police,” it is probably also true that everyone who embraced “defund the police” was a Democrat, or someone even further leftward.

An intriguing inverse relationship seems to thus be found between how much leftists want government to do (just about everything) and their governing capacity to do the few basic things that matter most, like keeping the streets safe.

Democrats think combating crime (law and order) is racist. They think that businesses which leave crime-ridden neighborhoods are racist too.

But what if the real problem in all of this isn’t the profit motive, racism or even the criminals? What if the real problem, the root cause, is people who think like Pressley and Markey?



# 2024 January Market Report

In the shifting sands of the U.S. housing market, the latest figures sketch a tale of cautious optimism. The National Association of REALTORS® (NAR) January market report breaks down the contrast between the decline in existing home sales and the significant increase in pending sales and what that might mean for the housing market’s health and future trends.

U.S. existing-home sales slipped 1.0% month-over-month and were down 6.2% year-over-year as of last measure, while pending sales jumped 8.3% from the previous month, marking the largest gain since June 2020, according to the National Association of REALTORS® (NAR). Mortgage rates have dropped significantly from their peak last fall, and homebuyers are beginning to come out of the woodwork, with NAR forecasting a 13% increase in existing-home sales this

year compared to 2023.

New Listings in the Chattanooga region increased 3.9 percent to 1,005. Pending Sales were down 11.0 percent to 805. Inventory levels grew 7.8 percent to 2,020 units.

Prices continued to gain traction. The Median Sales Price increased 10.4 percent to \$320,000. Days on Market was up 11.1 percent to 40 days. Buyers felt empowered as Months Supply of Inventory was up 20.0 percent to 2.4 months.

Despite tepid sales activity, the persistent shortage of housing supply has helped prop up home values nationwide, with the median existing-home price rising 4.4% year-over-year to \$382,600, according to NAR. Total unsold inventory was at 1 million units heading into January, an 11.5% decline from the previous month, for a 3.2 months’ supply at the current sales pace. Nationally, listing activity has started to pick up, and with mortgage rates stabilizing

and housing completions on the rise, inventory is expected to improve in the coming months.

The months ahead hold the key to whether these early indicators of recovery and resilience will develop into a sustained upward trend or if the market will continue to be characterized by its current patchwork of gains and losses. What remains clear is that the market is, for now, a checkerboard of contrasting dynamics, demanding a keen eye from buyers, sellers, and investors alike. That’s Who We R®.

# A rich yet light fish chowder

When the weather is gray and cold, it's time to pull out the big bowls. Winter soups and stews are hefty and can lean rich, meant to encourage slurping with big spoons and passing napkins to catch wayward dribbles. Piping hot, bobbing with chunky vegetables, wilted greens, and the protein of your choice, these bowls will warm you from the inside out.

When bowl-food beckons, consider making a chowder. While chowders easily present in the summer by the seashore, they are equally enticing in front of the fire in the winter. A chowder can range from a creamy, white New England-style chowder to a thinner, tomato-based Manhattan-style chowder. This chowder leans to New England, yet keeps the broth relatively light, encouraging second helpings without remorse. (After all, we are still recovering from the holidays!) In this recipe, the base of the stock is chicken stock — yes, chicken stock! The stock adds welcome umami richness and depth of flavor. A little milk or cream is added to finish, which is a wonderful shortcut to reducing some of the fat normally associated with a rich and creamy chowder. Chunks of buttery salmon lend additional oily richness to the soup. Cauliflower and spinach add chunky, leafy heartiness and balance the soup with earthy freshness.

Other fish can be combined with the salmon in the chowder. Choose thick, firm-fleshed white fish that holds its shape and won't dissolve in the broth while cooking.

## Salmon chowder

- Active time: 30 to 40 minutes
- Total time: 30 to 40 minutes
- Yield: Serves 4 to 6
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 small fennel bulb, halved and thinly sliced
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 4 cups chicken stock (or 2 cups water plus 2 cups chicken stock), plus more as needed
- 2 medium Yukon gold potatoes, about 10 ounces, diced
- 1½ to 2 cups cauliflower florets, in bite-size pieces
- 1 teaspoon sweet paprika
- ½ teaspoon smoked paprika
- ¼ teaspoon cayenne, or to taste
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, plus more for garnish
- 1 cup whole milk or half-and-half
- 1 to 1¼ pounds salmon filet, skin and pin-bones removed, cut in 1-inch chunks
- 1 heaping cup baby spinach
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh dill, plus more for garnish

Heat the oil and melt the butter in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onion and fennel and saute until softened, about 2 minutes. Add the flour and cook, stirring to lightly toast, 1 to 2 minutes. Add 1 cup stock and whisk to blend the flour.

Add the remaining stock, potatoes, cauliflower, paprikas, cayenne, kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper. There should be enough liquid to cover the vegetables. If not,

add enough stock or water to cover. Simmer, partially covered, until the vegetables are tender, 15 to 20 minutes.

Add the salmon and continue to simmer until the fish is cooked, 6 to 8 minutes.

Add the spinach and stir until wilted, about 1 minute. Stir in the dill and taste for

seasoning.

Ladle the soup into bowls. Garnish with fresh dill and additional black pepper. Serve immediately.

# Back to the lab

## 'CSI: Vegas' returns to prove one of their own's innocence

When a famed forensics lab drops everything to prove your innocence, your days being held in custody for murder are numbered, right? That's what lead investigator Josh Folsom (Matt Lauria, "Kingdom") is hoping for in the season premiere of "CSI: Vegas," airing Sunday, Feb. 18, on CBS. After Folsom's mother's killer was found dead in last season's finale episode, the investigator was dragged away, suspected to be responsible for the death.

The whodunnit cliffhanger has kept audiences on their toes for months in the extended break between seasons of "CSI: Vegas," affected by the strikes last year. It doesn't seem like the killer's identity and Folsom's fate will be a mystery for very long, per the premiere episode description from CBS, as the new season opens with "the CSI team [combing] through every crumb of forensic evidence to determine his innocence or guilt."

Paula Newsome ("Barry") leads the team as Maxine Roby, head of the crime lab, supported by Mandeep Dhillon ("Avoidance") as investigator Allie Rajan, Ariana Guerra ("Promised Land") as Det. Serena Chavez, Jay Lee ("Looking for Alaska") as investigator Chris Park, Lex Medlin ("Drop Dead Diva") as investigator Beau Finado, Sara Amini ("Lucky Hank") as chief medical examiner Sonya Nikolayevich, Sarah Gilman ("Those Who Can't") as rookie investigator Penny Gill, and reprising her role as investigator Catherine Willows from the hit establishing series "CSI: Crime Scene Investigation," Marg Helgenberger ("All Rise").

Folsom's fate is in the hands of the CSI team, but it's not just work for some members of the lab. Det. Chavez herself may just be a little too close to Folsom to help build a case for his innocence — the pair have estab-

lished a romantic relationship when they are off the clock. Complicating matters more, Allie, in addition to being a senior investigator in the lab, is Folsom's ex. Bolstering a former boyfriend's innocence is all in a day's work.

It's no secret that salacious, outlandish cases are part of the DNA of any "CSI" series, and "Vegas" is no exception. The procedural has a habit of using comedy to create some levity over gory crime scenes and graphic medical examinations. Suspicious deaths at a clown hotel, a secret sex dungeon and a masquerade party are just a few examples of the cases that have ended up in the lab over the course of the show's first two seasons, not to mention more than one elaborate frame up. Nothing less could be expected from the crimes of Las Vegas.

While she is the only one to appear in more than one season of "CSI: Vegas," Helgenberger isn't the only original series actor to reprise their role for the sequel series. One of the greatest will-they-won't-they sagas in television history was the romance between investigator Sara Sidle (Jorja Fox, "ER") and lab supervisor Gil Grissom (William Petersen, "Manhattan"). The tension between the pair grew over six seasons before their relationship was finally confirmed.

Together still when the lab comes calling in the first season of the new series, Sidle and Grissom helped investigate an attack against former LVPD captain Jim Brass (Paul Guilfoyle, "Julia") alongside fellow original series lab team members David Hodges (Wallace Langham, "Perry Mason") and Greg Sanders (Eric Szmanda, "Ad-verse," 2020).

Ahead of her first appearance last season, Helgenberger spoke with Entertainment Weekly about her return to the franchise, praising the new cast.

"They couldn't have been more welcoming. But it

was interesting because I had played Catherine Willows for so many years, It's like a part of me," said Helgenberger. "In terms of establishing a camaraderie or an instant chemistry, it was pretty natural, I have to say, and I think it's because I played this character for so long."

"CSI: Vegas" moves from Thursday nights to a coveted Sunday prime time spot on CBS, alongside action drama "The Equalizer," returning for its fourth

season, and the brand new series "Tracker," starring Justin Hartley ("This Is Us"). The second season of "CSI: Vegas" upped the episode order from its first season's 10 episodes to a whopping 21 episodes, however this season is back to a tight 10. Many network procedurals have premiered abridged seasons of 10 to 13 episodes given the work stoppage during the writers and screen actors guild strikes.

Aside from the many popular iterations of "CSI,"

CBS is home to an impressive list of long-running series and franchises, chief among them NCIS, which premieres its 21st season in February. The naval crime drama is surpassed only by NBC staples "Law & Order" and "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit" in the race for longest-running prime time scripted live-action series in the U.S. Reality competition series "Survivor" and "Big Brother" both premiered in 2000 and have been going strong for decades. CBS

even manages to keep its sitcom franchises rolling with "The Big Bang Theory" being such a massive hit during its 12-season run that it spawned prequel series "Young Sheldon." The spinoff wraps up with its seventh and final season this year, with yet another spinoff announced as in the works.

Dive back into the crime and the drama with the season premiere of "CSI: Vegas," airing Sunday, Feb. 18 on CBS.

Gordon Cormier, Kiawentiio and Ian Ousley in “Avatar: The Last Airbender”

A wise man named Uncle Iroh once said, “Failure is only the opportunity to try again — only more wisely this time.” While this insightful nugget means a lot to fans of “Avatar: The Last Airbender” because of its origins in the show, it resonates especially loudly with those who saw and disliked thriller director M. Night Shyamalan’s (“The Sixth Sense,” 1999) 2010 adaptation, “The Last Airbender” (and there were many).

Regardless of which side of the fence you land on, there is no denying that fans have been itching for a respectable live-action “Avatar” adaptation since the release of the original animated series in 2005. So, to quote another beloved character, Prince Zuko, “Move over, filth”: the stellar new action-adventure series, also titled “Avatar: The Last Airbender,” premieres Thursday, Feb. 22, on Netflix.

Created in its new format by “Nikita” and “Sleepy Hollow” writer-producer Albert Kim, “Avatar: The Last Airbender,” also known to some audiences as “Avatar: The Legend of Aang” and hereby known simply as “Avatar,” is an eight-episode, live-action retelling of the popular American animated series that voice starred Zach Tyler Eisen (“The Backyardigans”), Jack De Sena (“The Dragon Prince”), Dante Bas-

co (“Hook,” 1991) and Mae Whitman (“Good Girls”).

While shifting from animation to live-action, several series details were bound to change, chief among them being the cast. While none of the characters (but one) are portrayed by their original voice stars in Kim’s rendition, series photography and trailer footage show that the cast still very accurately represents the tale’s overall aesthetic.

Starring in the titular role of “Avatar” is young Vancouverite Gordon Cormier, who, despite his youth at just 14, is already known for his work in several well-known TV shows, such as “The Stand,” “Two Sentence Horror Stories” and “Lost in Space.” Similarly, the roles of siblings Sokka and Katara are played by Ian Ousley and Kiawentiio, respectively.

Ousley is known for his recurring roles in both “Physical” on Apple TV+ and the controversial Netflix drama “13 Reasons Why,” while Cormier’s fellow Canadian, Kiawentiio, of the Akwesasne Mohawk Nation, has become somewhat of a household name due to her heartfelt roles in “Anne with an E” and the Indigenous Canadian political drama “Beans” (2020), in which she shone in the title role.

Rounding out the main cast are Paul Sun-Hyung Lee (“Kim’s Convenience”) as Uncle Iroh, Daniel Dae Kim (“Lost”) as Fire Lord Ozai, Ken Leung (“Indus-

try”) as Cmdr. Zhao, Dallas Liu (“Shang-Chi and the Legend of the Ten Rings,” 2021) as Prince Zuko, Elizabeth Yu (“Somewhere in Queens,” 2022) as Azula and Tamlyn Tomita (“The Day After Tomorrow,” 2004) as Yukari.

With regard to the series’ main storyline, the plot remains the same: “Water. Earth. Fire. Air. The four nations once lived in harmony, with the Avatar, master of all four elements, keeping peace between them. But everything changed when the Fire Nation attacked and wiped out the Air Nomads, the first step taken by the firebenders toward conquering the world. With the current incarnation of the Avatar yet to emerge, the world has lost hope” (per Netflix).

“But like a light in the darkness,” the synopsis continues, “hope springs forth when Aang (Cormier), a young Air Nomad — and the last of his kind — reawakens to take his rightful place as the next Avatar. Alongside his newfound friends Sokka (Ousley) and Katara (Kiawentiio), siblings and members of the Southern Water Tribe, Aang embarks on a fantastical, action-packed quest to save the world and fight back against the fearsome onslaught of Fire Lord Ozai (Dae Kim). But with a driven Crown Prince Zuko (Liu) determined to capture them, it won’t be an easy task.”



# Q&A

## Hollywood

**Q: Weren't they going to adapt the book "Gods Behaving Badly" into a movie? I read that somewhere but never heard any more about it.**

A: According to every critic who saw the finished product (and they're pretty much the only ones who did), the less you hear about the "Gods Behaving Badly" film, the better.

The hit 2007 book by British author Marie Phillips, about Greek gods coming to modern-day Earth and living in a rundown apartment block, was indeed turned into a film in 2013. But it was never released.

It got quite a bit of pre-release buzz, thanks to a star-studded cast including Sharon Stone ("Basic Instinct," 1992) as Aphrodite, John Turturro ("Barton Fink," 1991) as Hades and the great Christopher Walken ("The Deer Hunter," 1978) as Zeus.

It screened at the Rome Film Festival in 2013, and that one screening is all it got. Because it was, by all accounts, terrible.

"Zero texture and negative charm," Variety magazine said.

"This outdated unfunny satire feels like an extended 'SNL' sketch from the early '90s, and one that probably would have been tossed into the waste basket," the Hollywood Reporter said.

Judging by those reviews, if you're a fan of the book, you're better off just remembering that and forgetting about the adaptation.

Or, you could check out Phillips's followup book, "The Table of Less Valued Knights," which gave a similar comedic-alternate-history treatment to the Arthurian legend. And then just hope no one tries to film that one as well.

**Q: I loved Dr. Cuddy on "House," but I haven't seen that actor anywhere in a while. What is she up to?**

A: Lisa Edelstein has in fact been incredibly busy since leaving her long-running role in "House" in 2011 (she reportedly left the show a year before its end because of a contract dispute).

For example, she basically walked straight off the "House" set and onto "The Good Wife," doing a three-episode arc in the popular legal drama in 2011.

After that, she did a few other brief runs on shows such as "Castle" and "House of Lies," before taking on a pair of full-time gigs.

First, she took a voice acting gig on the Nickelodeon kids' series "The Legend of Korra," playing a water-bending master (something that would take too long to explain) named Kya.

After that, she took on her biggest post-"House" role, starring in the Bravo hit "Girlfriends' Guide to Divorce." It was the cable channel's first original scripted series and ran for four hit seasons, from 2014 to 2018.

Then came "The Kominsky Method," the Netflix series about an acting coach, played by Michael Douglas ("Wall Street," 1987). Edelstein starred in all three seasons as Phoebe, a drug-addicted daughter trying to reconcile with her father.

All of her roles, with the exception of "The Legend of Korra," it seems, have been in dramedies. Indeed, Edelstein copped to that in an interview with Flood magazine.

"I love dramedies mostly because they don't force me to choose between drama and comedy. I get to do it all and sometimes sing!" Though, she admitted the singing thing doesn't come up much.



# Game time

## Jaleel White to host syndicated game show

**Game time:** In the minds of some TV viewers, Jaleel White will always be associated with his Steve Urkel character from the '90s sitcom "Family Matters," but that's hardly his only TV credit: some of his most recent projects include Netflix's "Hustle" (2022), CBS's "Me, Myself and I" and Apple TV+'s "The Afterparty."

While White has several more projects in development, expect him to be popping up on a lot of CBS stations this fall, when he begins his tenure as host of a new syndicated game show.

White has been tapped to host "The Flip Side," which will pit two teams of players against each other while testing them on how they think different people feel about the same issue. Teams will get to choose from multiple-choice answers, and the one with the stronger sense of intuition or ability to tune in to/guess others' emotional wavelengths wins.

"Game shows have been a bright spot in syndication — and network prime time — the last few years," Wendy McMahon, president and CEO of CBS News and Stations and CBS Media Ventures, said in a statement. "Their loyal viewers tune in more times per week than any other genre. We are excited to bring a fun concept, combined with the exceptional comedic skills of host Jaleel White, to the marketplace with 'The Flip Side.' It's a perfect addition to any station's lineup with the flexibility to play in multiple time periods or a game show block."

This isn't White's first foray into the game show genre. He previously hosted the Syfy game show "Total Blackout" and appeared in both "Family Feud" and "Dancing with the Stars."

White alluded to these previous experiences in his statement about the new

project: "I have had fun being a celebrity contestant on numerous game shows, but I've always really wanted to be the host, giving people money and making their day! When I first heard this concept, I immediately wanted to be the ringleader of this entertaining, funny game show where the only requirement is being in tune with human nature."

**Schmigadown:** Sad news for fans of "Schmigadown!": Apple TV+ has can-

celled the musical comedy after just two seasons.

From executive producer Lorne Michaels ("Saturday Night Live") and Universal Television, "Schmigadown!" featured an all-star cast headed by Cecily Strong ("Saturday Night Live") and Keegan-Michael Key ("Friends From College"), as well as Ariana DeBose ("Wish," 2023), Jaime Camil ("Jane the Virgin"), Kristin Chenoweth ("Holidate," 2020), Alan Cumming ("The Traitors") and many more.

The musical series centered on New York doctors Melissa (Strong) and Josh (Key), whose relationship had hit a rough patch when they set out on a backpacking trip. They soon find themselves lost in the town of Schmigadown, where life is just one big 1940s-50s musical, complete with people and tunes inspired by period musicals such as "Oklahoma!" and "The Music Man." Sweetly, they can only escape after finding true love, either with

each other or someone else. Spoilers: they did find true love, and in Season 2, the duo found themselves in Schmicago, where life literally moves to the beat of '60s and '70s musicals.

Series creator Cinco Paul ("The Lorax," 2012) took to social media to announce the cancellation and share his thoughts, writing: "I am sad to share that Apple will not be moving forward with Season 3 of 'Schmigadown!' The season is written (including 25 new songs)

but we unfortunately won't be making it. Such is life. I want to thank everyone involved with the show, our incredible cast and crew and writers, our wonderful supporters at Broadway Video, Universal and Apple, for everything they did to make it happen. It's a miracle we even got two seasons, honestly, and I'm so grateful we did."

Critics and audiences alike have given "Schmigadown!" high scores on Rotten Tomatoes, though it's hard to gauge its performance since Apple doesn't release viewership data. The streamer has canceled several other scripted series recently, including "The Afterparty." However, with "Schmigadown!," Apple had to pay Universal TV a licensing fee to stream it, and that likely factored into executives' decision to axe it.

**Comedy casting:** Actress Erin Foster of "Barely Famous" fame — the in-demand actress/producer is also the daughter of music producer David Foster ("The Bodyguard," 1992) — is busy growing her family and her TV resume, with an untitled Netflix comedy series coming soon.

Kristen Bell ("The Good Place") and Adam Brody ("The O.C.") have already been announced as series regulars, with Bell starring as "outspoken, agnostic" Joanne and Brody as unconventional rabbi Noah.

The Foster-created series, which will focus on the pair's unlikely relationship, recently added a few more actors to its growing cast.

Justine Lupe, who played Willa in HBO's "Succession," has boarded the project and will star as Morgan, Joanne's quick-witted sister/podcast partner. Timothy Simons (a.k.a. Jonah from "Veep") will play Noah's older "golden child" brother, Sasha.

Netflix has ordered 10 episodes of the half-hour comedy.
