9/28/2012 Oil and Gas Board Meeting Update (P. Schmierbach)

 Numerous complaints were filed during the review process from the Environmental groups in attendance

o Expect continued controversy from "The Clean Water Network" and "The Citizens

for Wilderness Planning"

 The environmental groups will expect public meetings for any planned oil/gas projects on public lands

Be prepared for the worse from the environmental community – but their actions will not sway the Governor's office resolve/support

Public officials must be prepared to defend position and guard every word

Paul advised group against calling the UT RFP "a research project" since it really entails an oil and gas lease

o The new name for the Oil and Gas Board will now become the Water Quality/Oil and Gas Board

 The group decided it would be prudent to have another meeting with the UTIA leadership prior to engaging the environmental community and the press

## Points of discussion for 10/26/2012 Meeting

- Review Updated Communication Plan/Timeline
  - o What about holding a pro-active "Informational Session" with the Knoxville Editorial Board and/or a field trip with reporters to well sites?
  - Need to consider a way to release the information to the Environmental Groups and the Press "almost" simultaneously
  - o What about providing an informational packet to the Environmental Groups at the time of the face-to-face meetings?
  - o How many meetings should we have with the Environmental Groups?
    - First meeting with The Nature Conservancy
    - Follow-up meeting with other invited groups (open sessions)
- Should we consider restructuring the RFP such that:
  - o An oil and gas company would have the opportunity to lease the North or South tract independently of the entire landbase
  - UTIA leases only a small portion of the property with the intent of opening up additional areas upon satisfactory completion research/demonstration projects
