Please consider this letter a request for a formal opinion regarding the K-12 funding formula. Below are the specific questions of concern:

- Less than half of all 3rd grade students are proficient or above in reading
- Less than half of all 8^{th} grade students are proficient or above in reading
- Less than 42% of all high school students are proficient or above in English
 III
- In fall 2013, <u>almost 64%</u> of first-time freshmen in TN community colleges took at least one **remedial or developmental course**
- TN ranks in the <u>bottom half of all states</u> on the Nation's Report Card or NAEP
- The average ACT score in Tennessee is 19.4. (The lowest district is a 15.9)
