

## Incident # 19-00554

On 1/12/2019 around 18:39 hours a deputy called in a hit and run crash with injuries in the area of 10000 Apison Pike. The deputy described the vehicle that fled the scene as a two door pick up truck, possibly a maroon or dark colored Mazda with a handicap license plate.

A few moments later dispatched was able to give me an updated location of the vehicle which was on Tucker Road traveling towards Edgemon Road. Since I was already in the area I began to look for the vehicle. Moments later on Edgemon Road, I spotted a vehicle that matched the description of the hit and run vehicle.

I then activated my emergency and initiated a traffic stop at 9800 Lee Highway.

While walking up to the drivers side door the suspect immediately opened the driver side door and began to yell and act hostile towards me raising his hands while he continued to shout. I then immediately ordered the driver to exit the vehicle in which he did not comply. I then grabbed the suspects arms and pulled him out of the vehicle. While trying apply hand restraints on the suspect, he then began to push back not keeping his arms behind his back. At this point I told him to give me his hands in which he did not comply. At this point the suspect Matthew Gilmore was taken to the ground. Mr. Gilmore continued to resist. Eventually hand restraints were applied.

Mr. Gilmore had a small cut to his forehead so I immediately called for EMS to respond to the scene. Mr. Gilmore was checked and cleared and it was later determined that his vehicle was not involved in the crash that happened today.

I then returned to service and a report is on file.
