Dear Sheriff Hammond:

In July of 2020, Chattanooga-area clergy issued a call for your resignation as a no faith response in your ability and interest to effectively and justly serve as Hamilton County Sheriff. In your public response to that letter you claimed you "didn't recognize any names on the list" and wanted "to meet with the church leaders who drafted the letter."¹ The fact is--you have met with many of us. You even commissioned a Task Force as a result of those (previous) meetings where priorities included *Transparency Following any Alleged Law Enforcement Wrongdoing*.² Yet, your silence in response to multiple requests for transparency and accountability speaks volumes.

City clergy and our communities continue to be alarmed by clear instances of brutal treatment of citizens by HCSO officers. Since you were elected in 2008, more than nineteen violations involving your officers have been reported and documented. While some remain unnamed, eight of your officers have been identified in reports as having committed offenses. Only one of these officers has been fired, while others have either resigned or remain on paid leave.

Your office continues to resist public calls for information regarding HCSO operations. Attempts made by clergy and other concerned citizens to obtain official HCSO policies and procedures have been met with silence and misdirection. These should be easily accessible public documents. It is past time for your office to respond to the public and uphold basic principles of transparency and accountability.

Sheriff Hammond, we call on you to produce the following by March 12, 2021:

 HCSO official policy and procedures guidelines on officer training and patrol services, especially regarding standards for "use of force" and for the medication and feeding of detained individuals.

- Clear answers related to staff development and internal training on official policies, including:
 - The regular schedule of staff development and training sessions
 - Personnel running and facilitating regular training sessions
 - Whether development and training sessions are mandatory for officers and how that is enforced.
 - Frequency and expectations of officers going through development and training sessions.
- HCSO official policies around hiring and firing of officers who use excessive force, including:
 - Officers who have been fired or decertified for misconduct involving excessive or unjustified use of force.
 - Officers who have received sustained complaints of misconduct involving excessive or unjustified force.

As Clergy representing concerned communities across Hamilton County, we expect the requested information to be shared in an official response from your office by the date indicated above. If we are again met with silence, or with further inaccuracies or misinformation, Chattanooga Clergy for Justice is prepared to take further legal steps to ensure transparency and accountability regarding policing and incarceration in Hamilton County.
